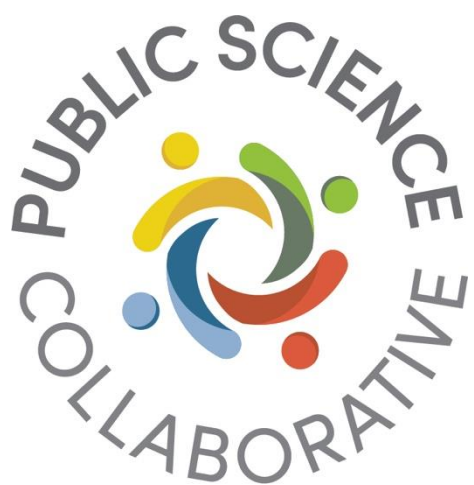

Health in Dallas Center: Overview

Dear Community Members & Stakeholders of Dallas Center,

We are pleased to share the Iowa Community Health Snapshot series, a set of reports designed in partnership with Iowa State University's Community Economic Development to assess the overall landscape of health and well-being across Iowa. The following pages include the health snapshot for your community. The snapshot can be used to see how Dallas Center ranks across various health measures compared to the rest of the state and similarly-sized communities. This comparison allows us to identify Dallas Center's strengths and opportunities for growth by leveraging the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention PLACES dataset.

The report includes 37 health measures organized topically by general health status, risky behavior, health outcomes, prevention, and disability. We provide a general overview of each health topic, followed by a description of each health measure. Health measure descriptions include crude and age-adjusted rates and a ranking that tells you how your community ranks compared to all Iowa communities and communities of similar size to Dallas Center. Crude rates tell you the raw, un-adjusted percent of the population experiencing the health measure. Age-adjusted rates account for the age distribution present in your community and presents what the rate would be if your community had a standard age distribution. Crude rates can provide a general comparison between communities and age-adjusted rates can give a fairer comparison between communities with different age structures.

Take a look at the top strengths of your community! Below are unadjusted and age-adjusted health measures that represent your community's strengths. We recommend using continued investment in these areas to maintain them as strengths, as well as building on them to improve in other health domains.

How to Use this Report

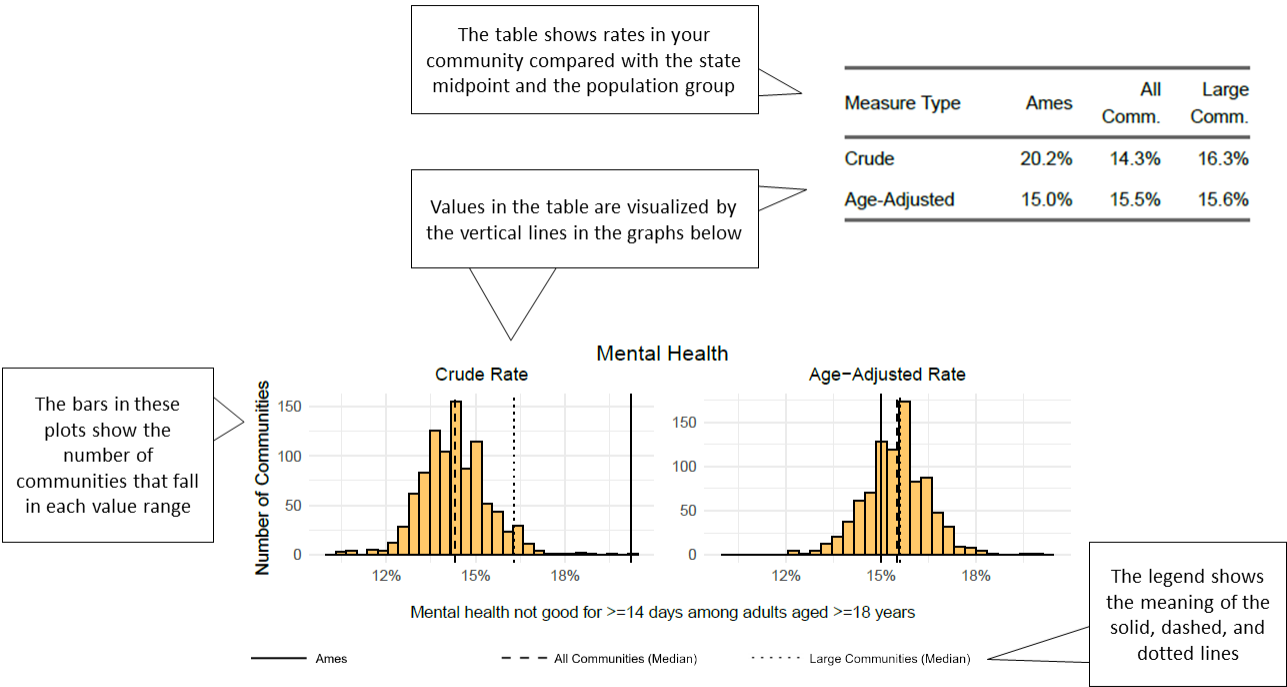
The purpose of the Iowa Community Health Snapshot Series is to provide an overview of health in Dallas Center that can be used to help inform health-related interventions and programming. This report contains five sections, including the overall health status of Dallas Center, a review of risky behaviors in the community, and information on various health outcomes, prevention measures, and disability needs. Each section includes an overview of the health domain, a breakdown of its underlying health measures, and data to see how Dallas Center compares to the rest of the state and similarly-sized communities.

With a population of 1,770, Dallas Center’s similarly sized communities are defined as small communities. In Iowa, small communities have an average population of 1,553, and there are 138 communities that are considered small communities. To see all of the communities in this population group, please see Appendix 3 of this report.

Using Ames, IA as an Example

The graphic below is an example of the details included for each health measure. The table in the upper right shows your community’s crude and age-adjusted rate estimates alongside their averages across all Iowa communities and similarly-sized communities. The images below show the distribution of the health measure across communities. The vertical lines correspond with the values in the table to show the estimate for the specific community compared to communities across the state. The solid black line in each plot represents the community rate, with the dashed lines indicating the average rate for all Iowa communities and the dotted lines showing the average rate for similarly-sized communities.



The example graphic above displays the poor mental health rate in Ames, Iowa. The left plot shows the crude rate of poor mental health in the community. Crude rates are the raw, un-adjusted percent of the population experiencing the health measure. Notice how the solid black line is closer to the right of the plot than the dashed and dotted lines; this indicates that Ames has a higher crude rate of poor mental health than most communities in the state. However, the age-adjusted rate plot on the right shows the solid line closer to the peak of the distribution and averages for the state and similarly-sized communities, indicating that when accounting for Ames’s unique age distribution, Ames’s poor mental health rate is not a significant outlier, and is estimated to be lower than the statewide average. Accounting for crude and age-adjusted rates is critical to help inform health interventions as age-adjusted rates can help contextualize the health measure within the population.

Health Status

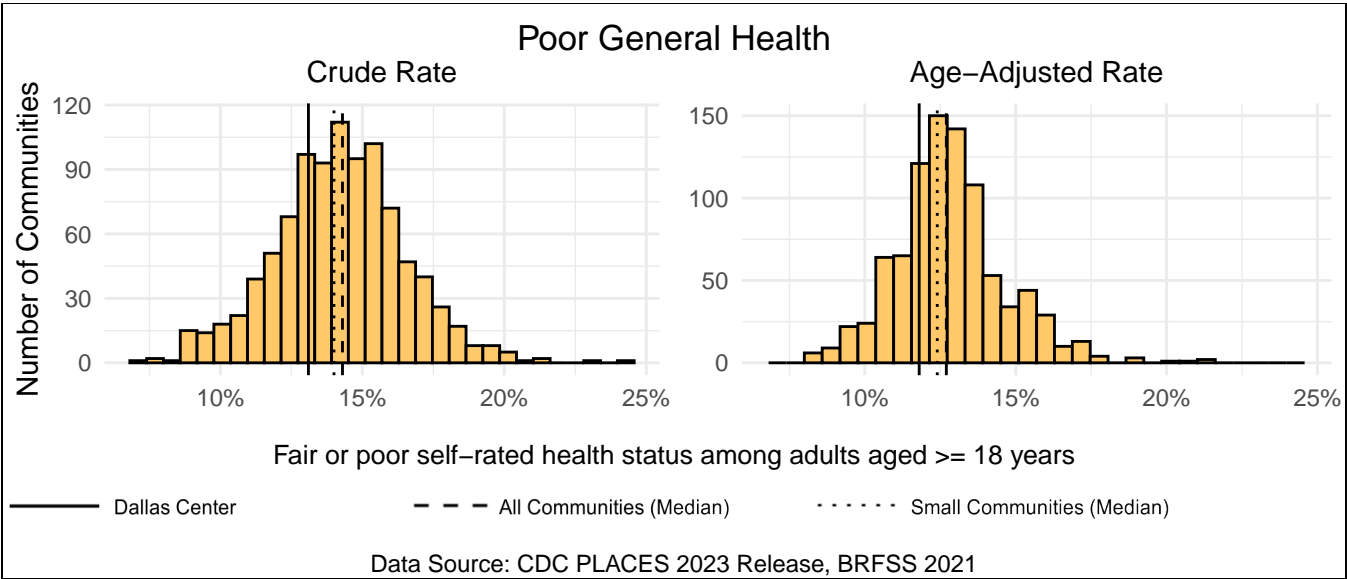
This section reflects measures for overall health, including general, physical, and mental health. These measures are a valuable way to see a simple summary of the health of a country’s population. The questions to calculate these measures ask respondents to evaluate their health status. General health is evaluated on a 5-point scale where respondents can report their health status as one of “excellent,” “very good,” “good,” “fair,” or “poor,” from which the respondents who answer “fair” or “poor” are included in the measure. Physical and mental health are evaluated as the rate of respondents who say they have had 14 or more days in the last 30 days in which their physical or mental health was not good. Poor General Health

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 13.1% for fair or poor self-rated health status among adults aged >= 18 years, which ranks 272nd out of 958 Iowa communities (42nd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 11.8%, which ranks 238th out of 905 Iowa communities (45th out of 138 small communities).

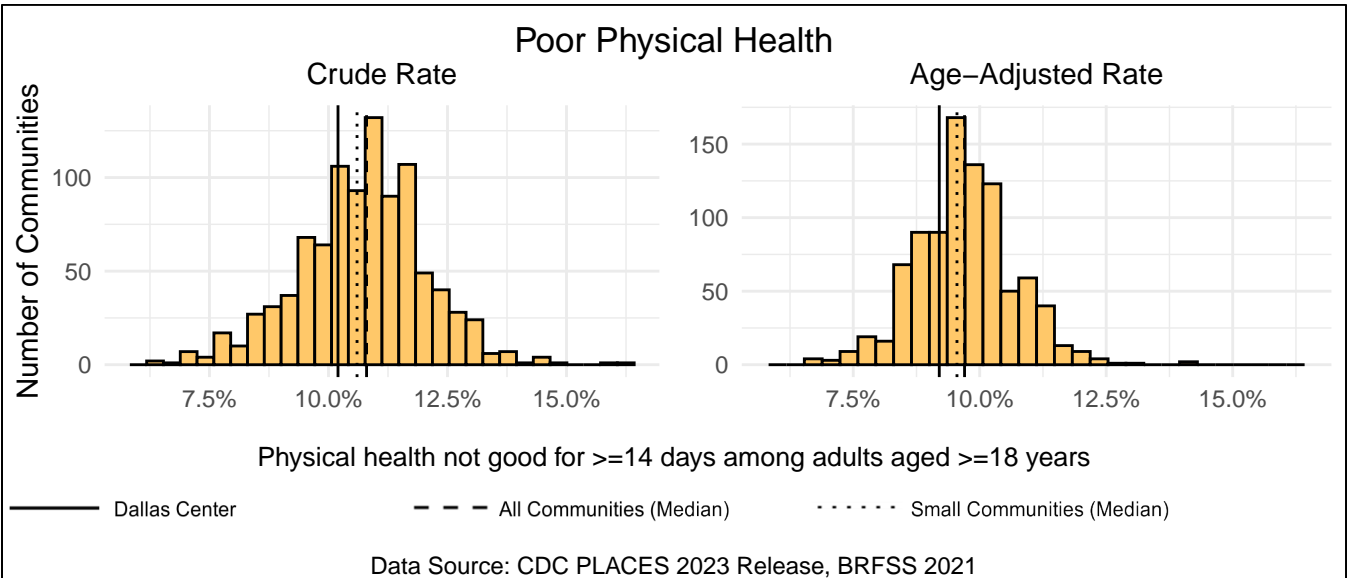

Poor Physical Health

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 10.2% for physical health not good for ≥ 14 days among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 293rd out of 958 Iowa communities (48th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 9.2%, which ranks 238th out of 905 Iowa communities (43rd out of 138 small communities).

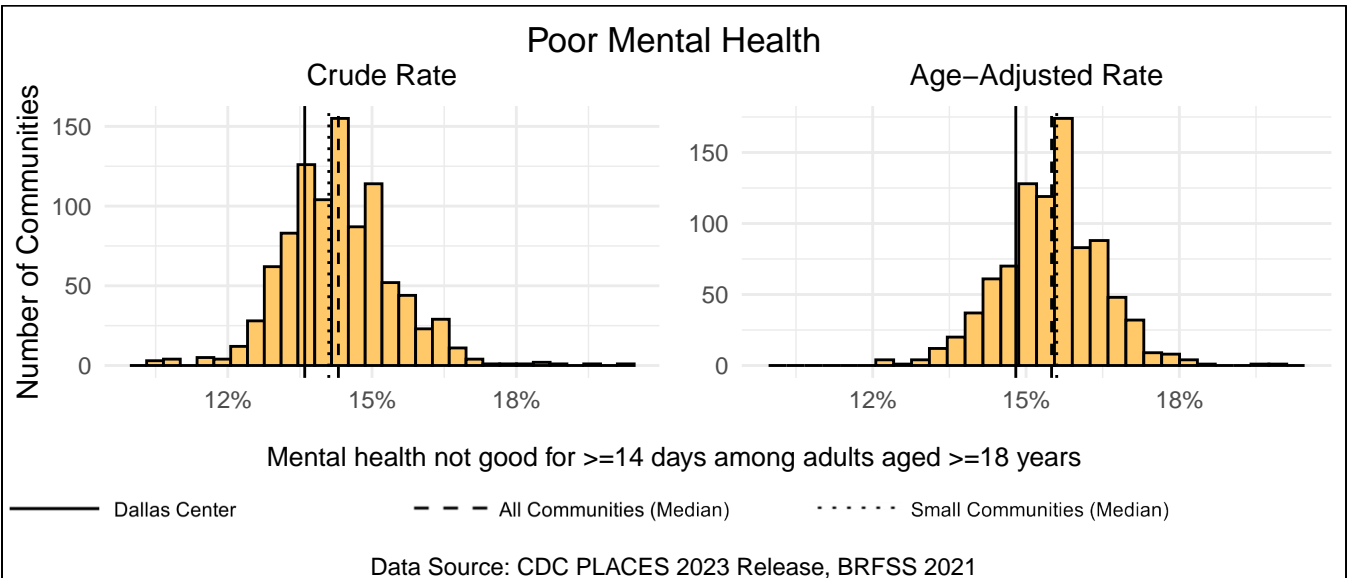

Poor Mental Health

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 13.6% for mental health not good for ≥ 14 days among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 231st out of 958 Iowa communities (40th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 14.8%, which ranks 189th out of 905 Iowa communities (34th out of 138 small communities).

Health Risk Behaviors

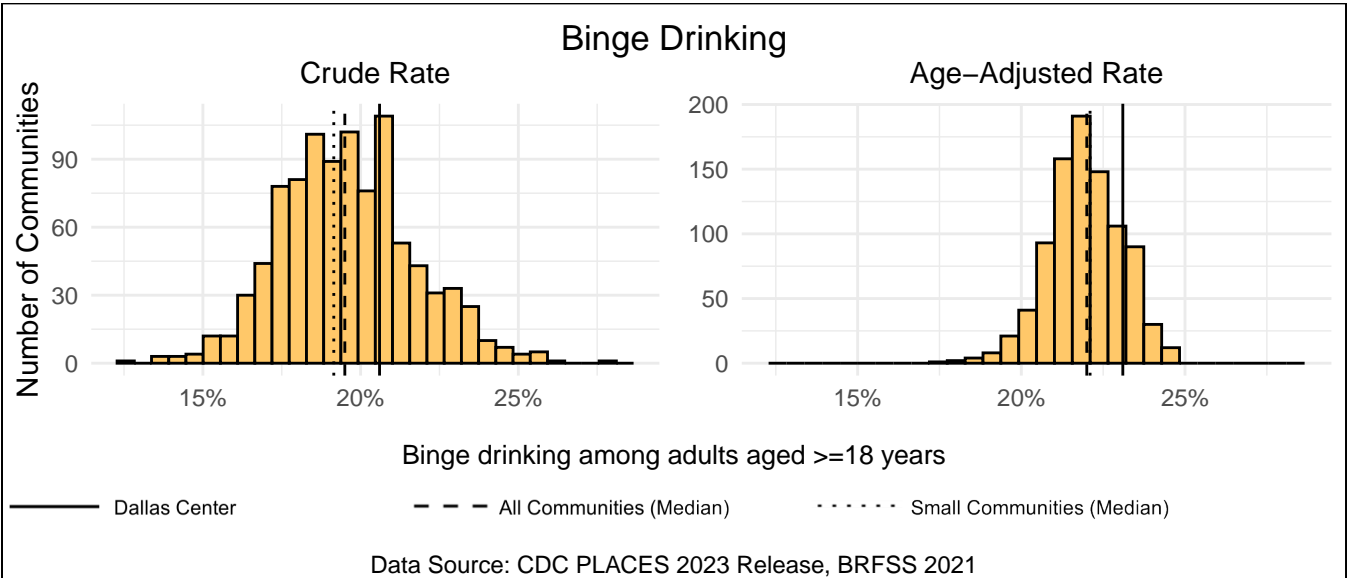
Health risk measures are measures of individual behaviors that can lead to poor health outcomes. These include binge drinking, current smoking, physical inactivity, and getting less than seven hours of nightly sleep. Risk behaviors are the most critical intervention points as they can help save lives and drastically improve health outcomes later in life. Each measure is calculated as the rate of respondents participating in a high level of risk behavior. The exact cutoff points for the behavior depend on the health area. Binge Drinking

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 20.6% for binge drinking among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 663rd out of 958 Iowa communities (102nd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 23.1%, which ranks 753rd out of 905 Iowa communities (117th out of 138 small communities).

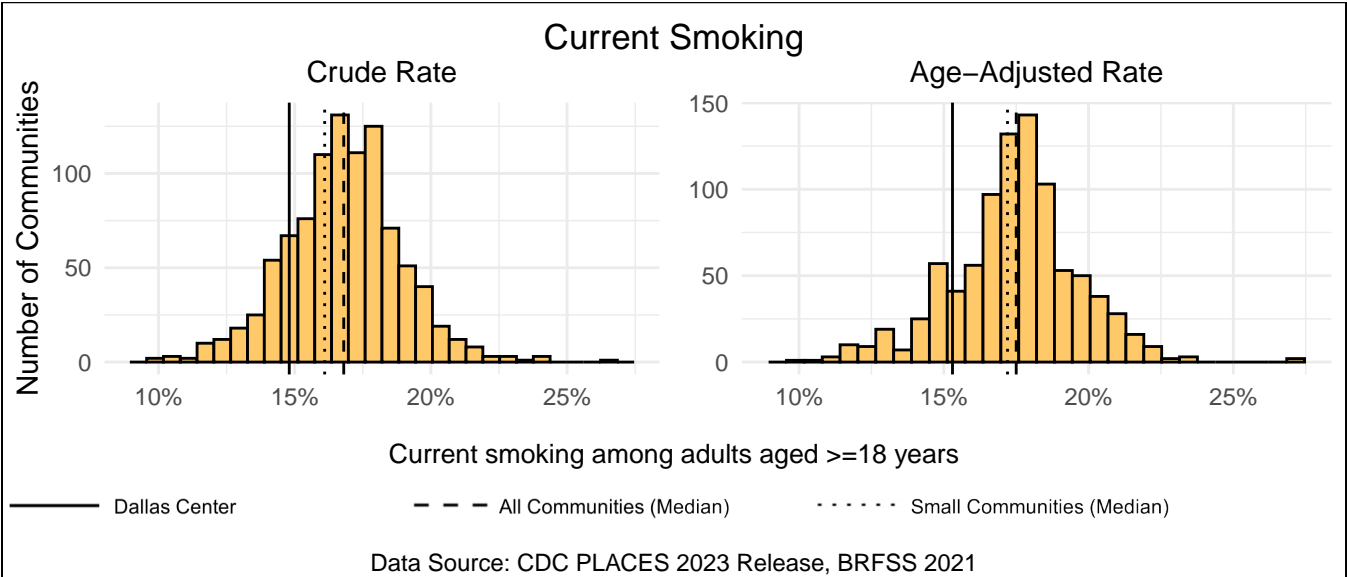

Current Smoking

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 14.8% for current smoking among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 153rd out of 958 Iowa communities (29th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 15.3%, which ranks 143rd out of 905 Iowa communities (28th out of 138 small communities).

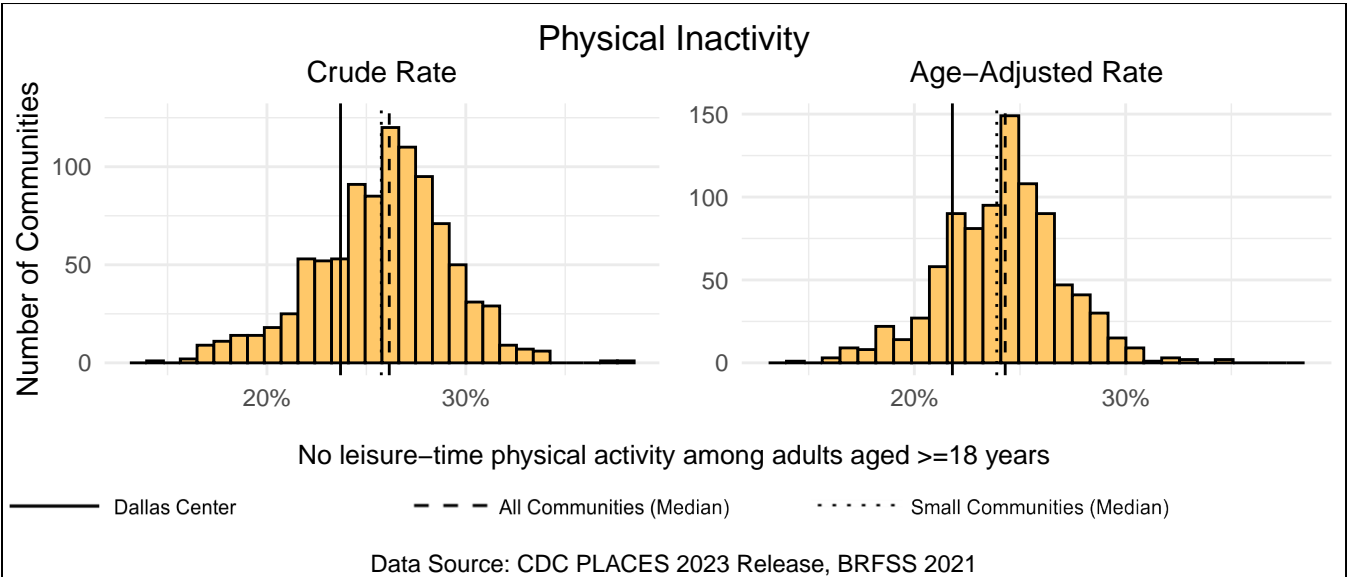

Physical Inactivity

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 23.7% for no leisure-time physical activity among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 226th out of 958 Iowa communities (40th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 21.8%, which ranks 158th out of 905 Iowa communities (32nd out of 138 small communities).

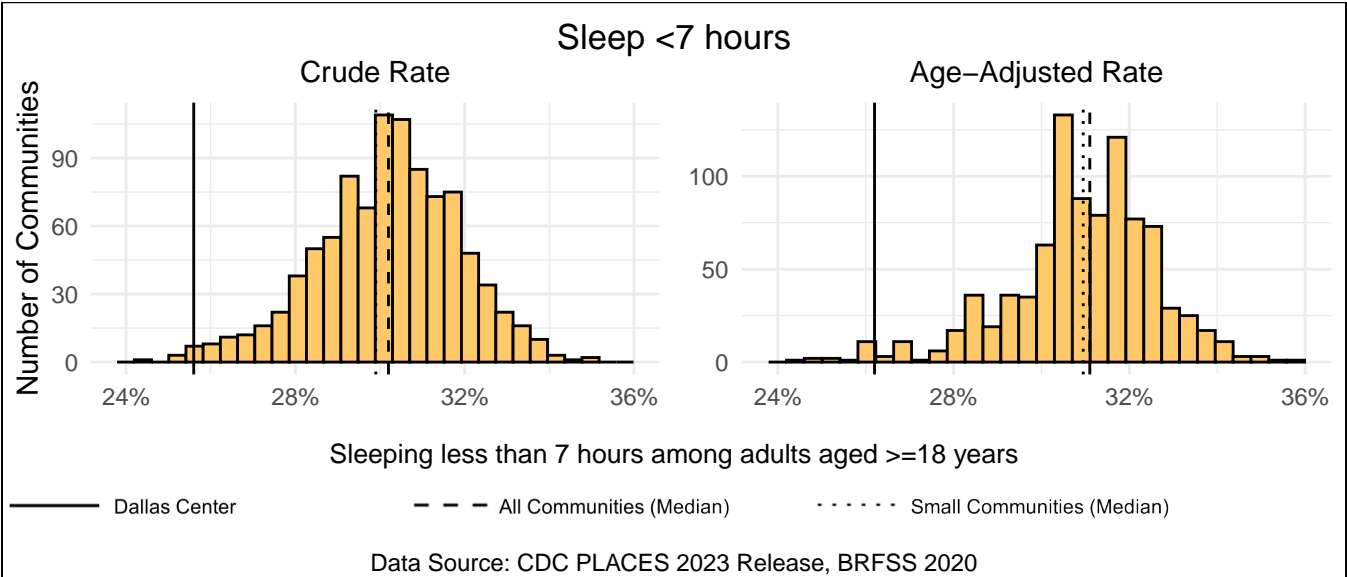

Sleep <7 hours

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 25.6% for sleeping less than 7 hours among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 6th out of 958 Iowa communities (2nd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 26.2%, which ranks 13th out of 905 Iowa communities (4th out of 138 small communities).

Health Outcomes

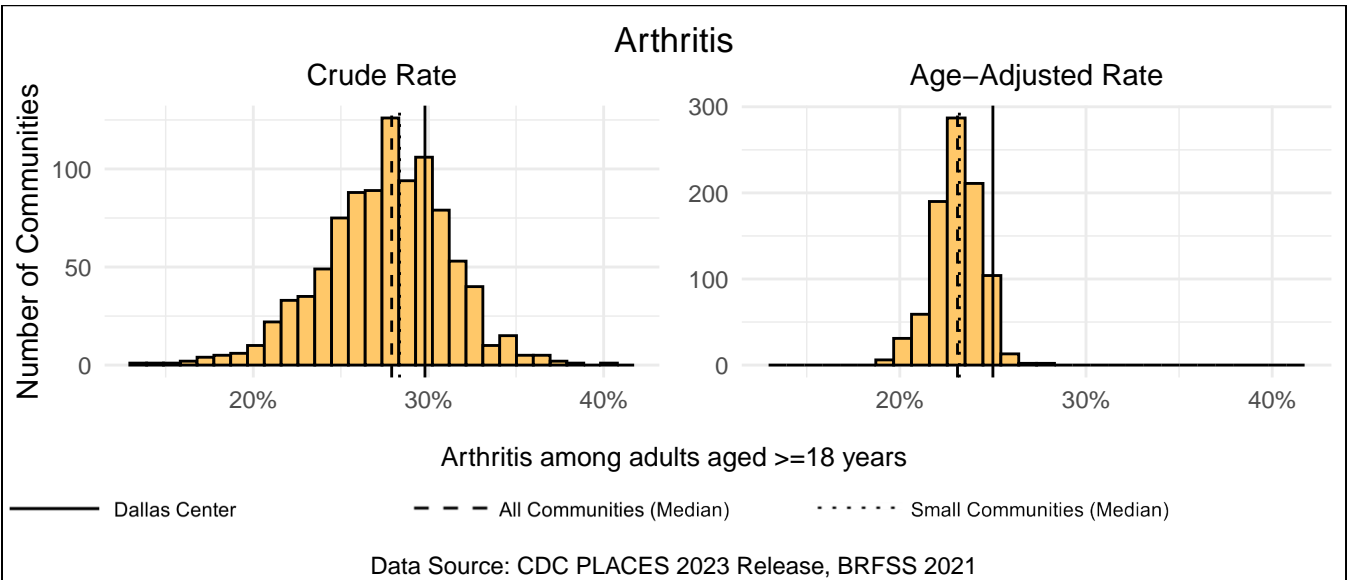
This section includes measures about specific health outcomes such as chronic illness, mental health conditions, and risk factors for future disease. Health outcome measures include but are not limited to arthritis, high blood pressure, cancer, depression, and obesity. Arthritis

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 29.8% for arthritis among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 695th out of 958 Iowa communities (92nd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 25.0%, which ranks 855th out of 905 Iowa communities (133rd out of 138 small communities).

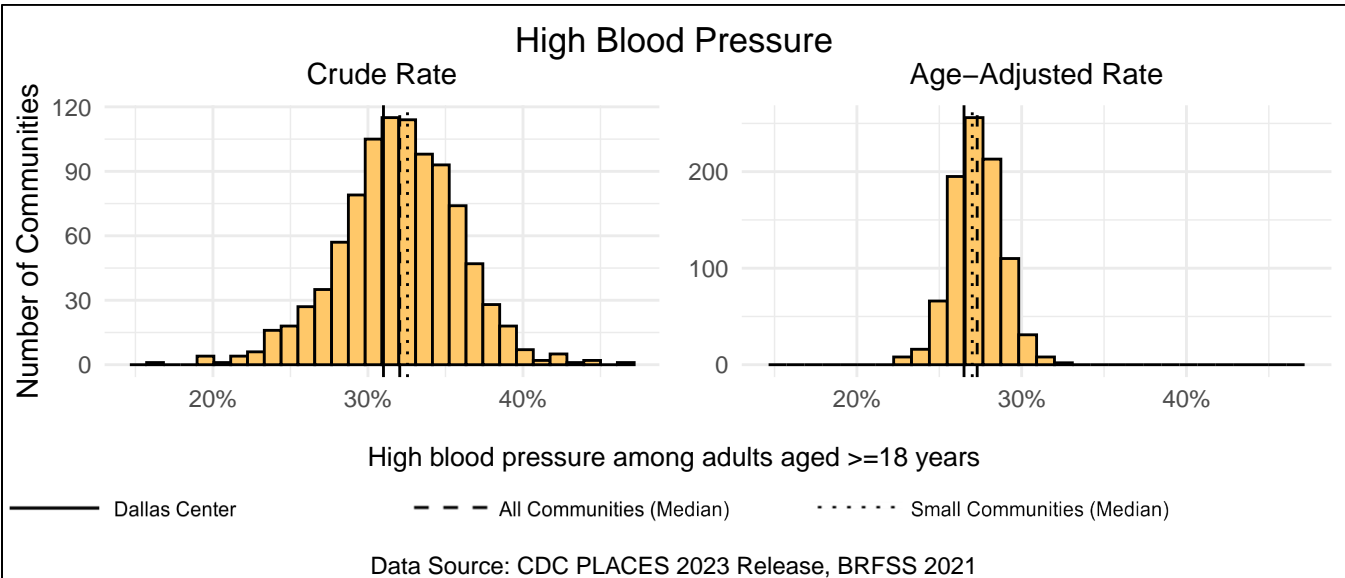

High Blood Pressure

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 31.0% for high blood pressure among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 354th out of 958 Iowa communities (47th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 26.5%, which ranks 262nd out of 905 Iowa communities (42nd out of 138 small communities).

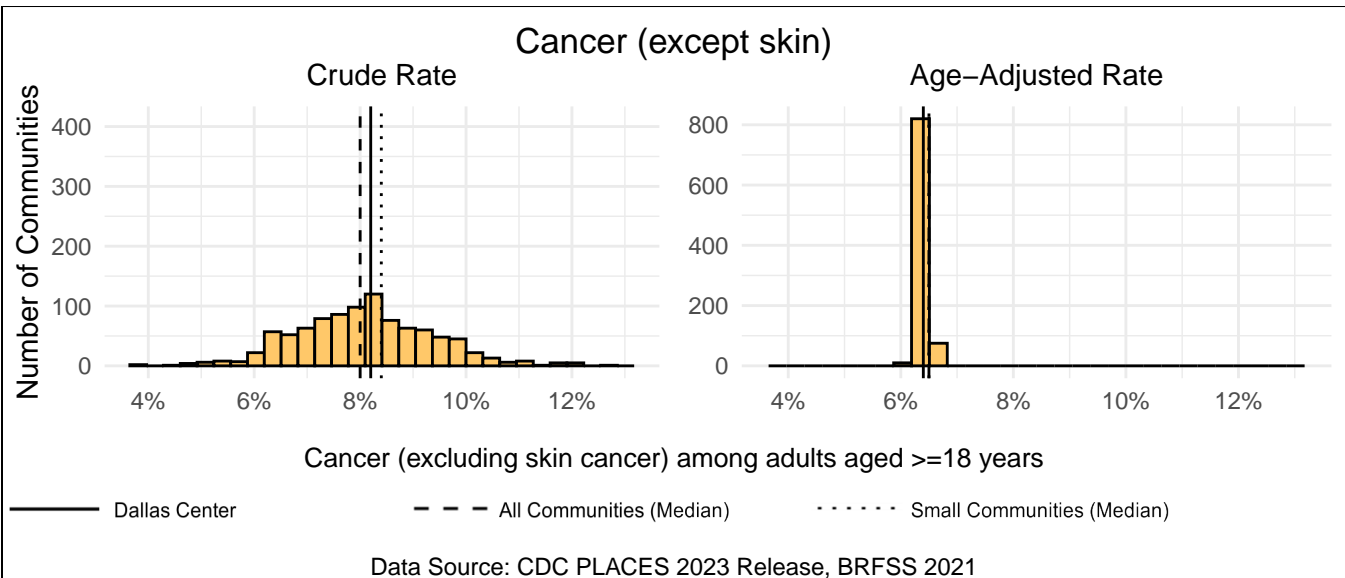

Cancer (except skin)

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 8.2% for cancer (excluding skin cancer) among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 505th out of 958 Iowa communities (58th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 6.4%, which ranks 74th out of 905 Iowa communities (4th out of 138 small communities).

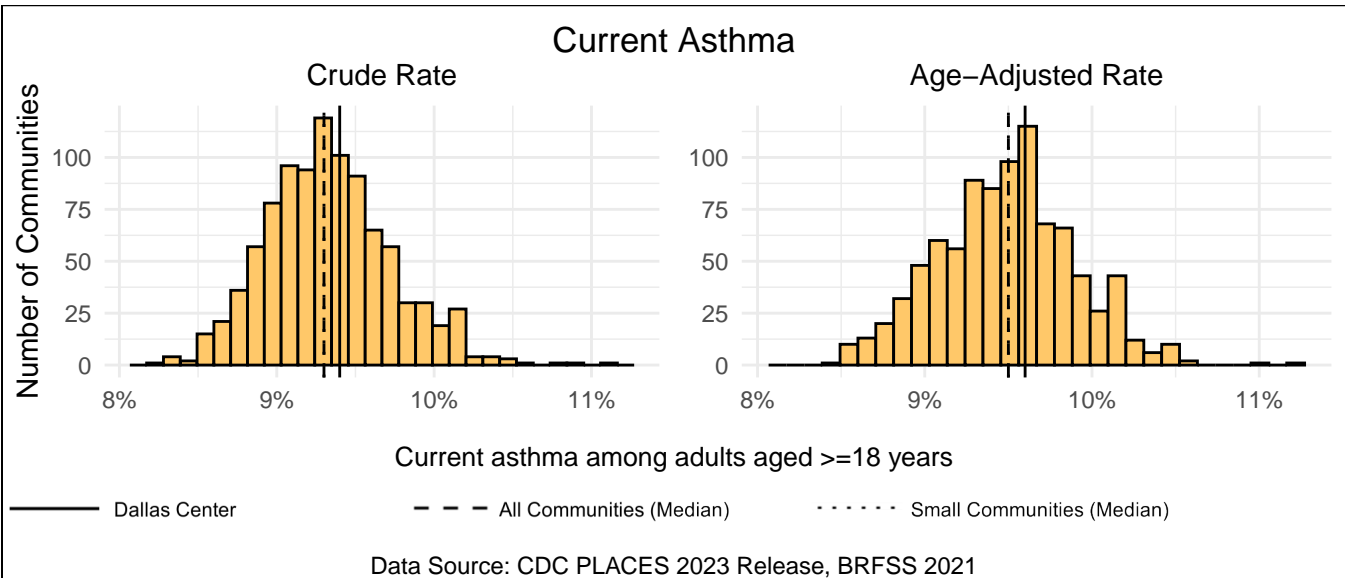

Current Asthma

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 9.4% for current asthma among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 524th out of 958 Iowa communities (85th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 9.6%, which ranks 513th out of 905 Iowa communities (73rd out of 138 small communities).

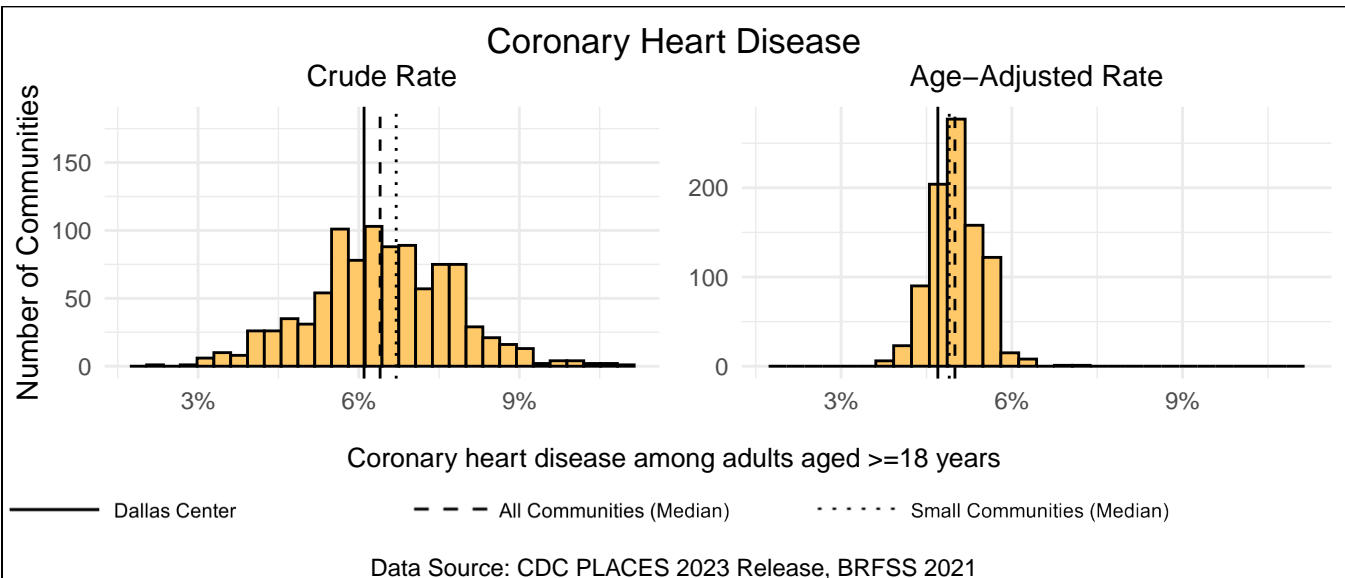

Coronary Heart Disease

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 6.1% for coronary heart disease among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 353rd out of 958 Iowa communities (49th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 4.7%, which ranks 187th out of 905 Iowa communities (36th out of 138 small communities).

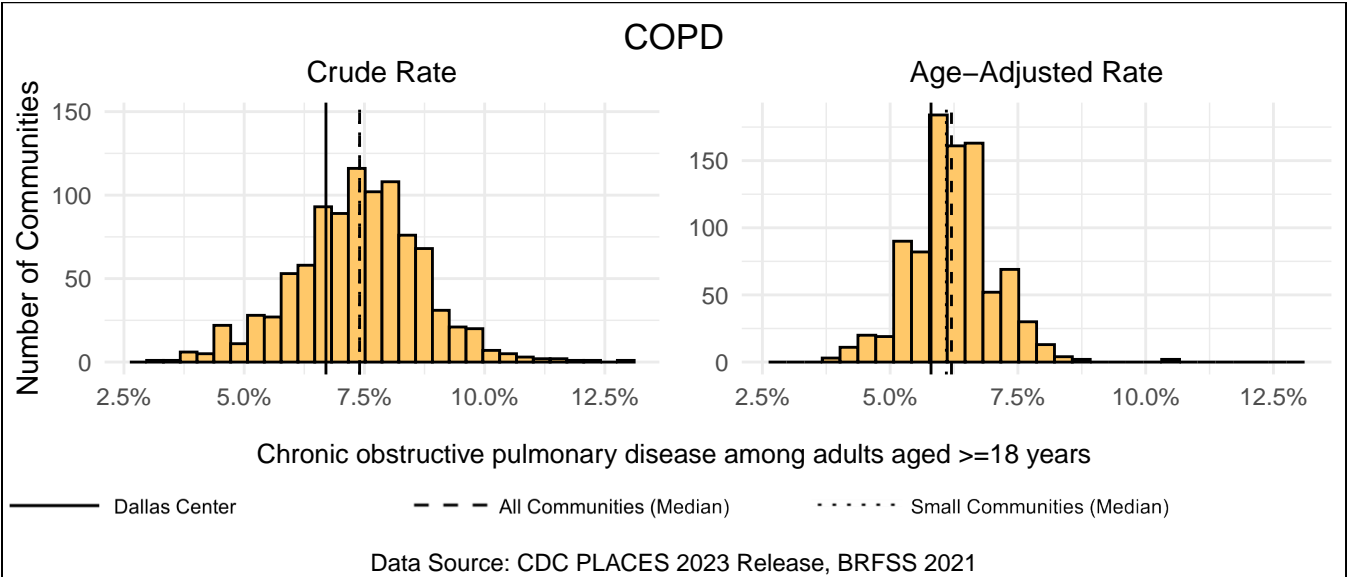

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 6.7% for chronic obstructive pulmonary disease among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 250th out of 958 Iowa communities (43rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 5.8%, which ranks 226th out of 905 Iowa communities (40th out of 138 small communities).

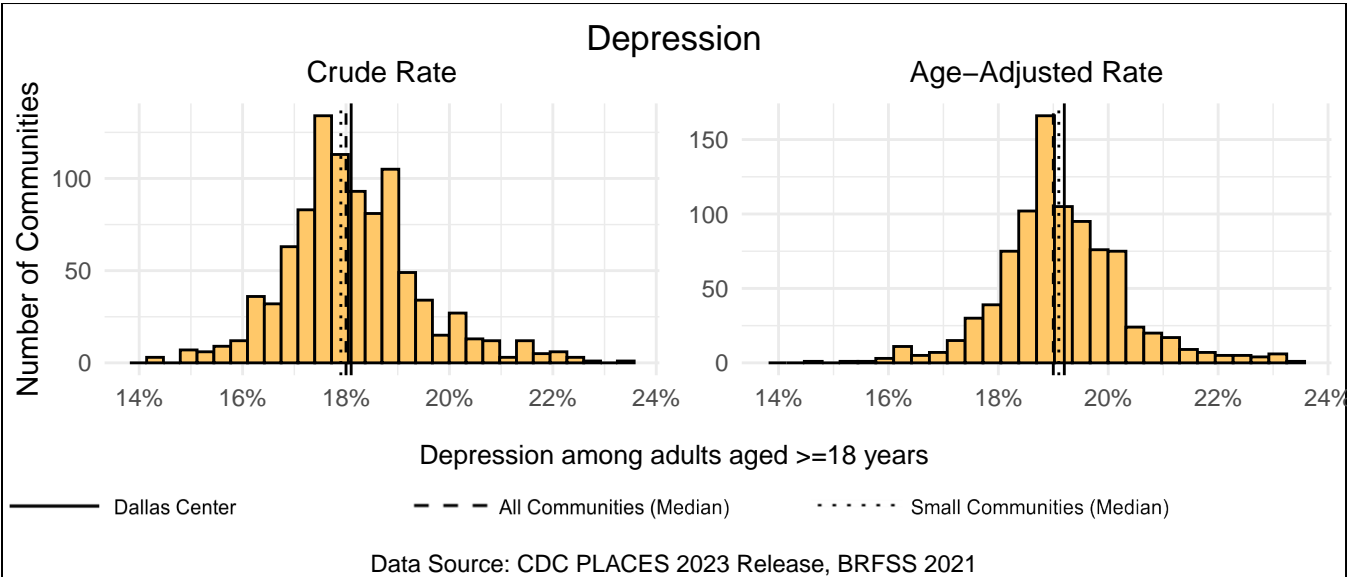

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 18.1% for depression among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 499th out of 958 Iowa communities (83rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 19.2%, which ranks 489th out of 905 Iowa communities (74th out of 138 small communities).

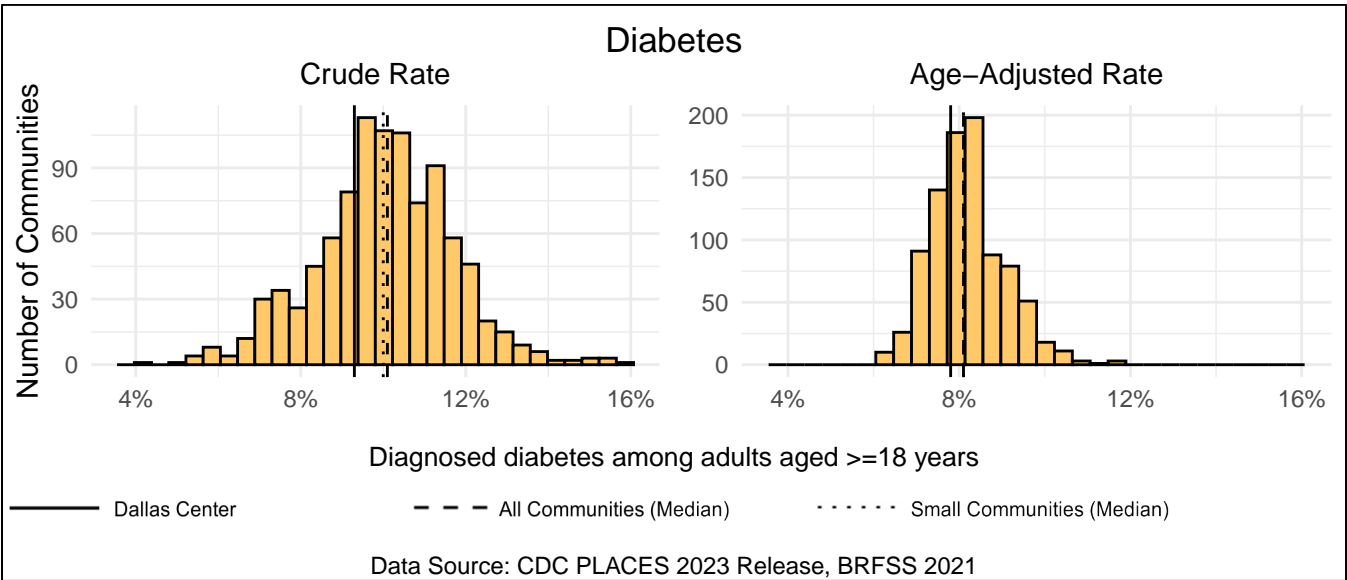

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 9.3% for diagnosed diabetes among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 275th out of 958 Iowa communities (46th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 7.8%, which ranks 268th out of 905 Iowa communities (50th out of 138 small communities).

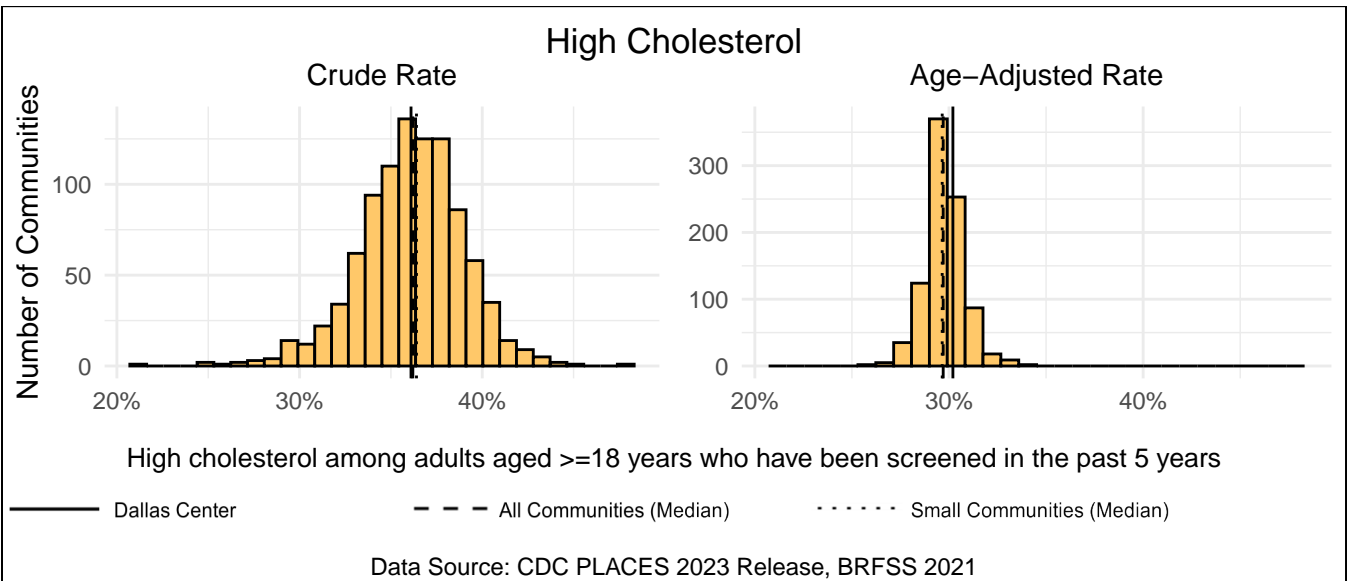

High Cholesterol

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 36.1% for high cholesterol among adults aged ≥ 18 years who have been screened in the past 5 years, which ranks 449th out of 958 Iowa communities (59th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 30.2%, which ranks 599th out of 905 Iowa communities (96th out of 138 small communities).

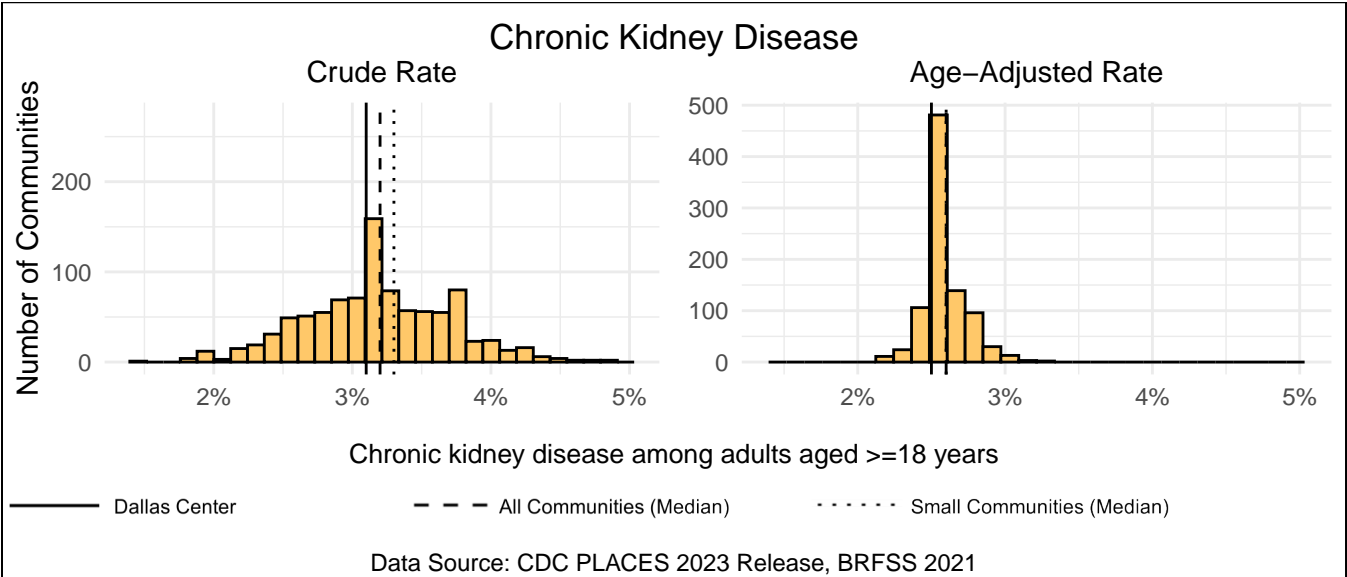

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 3.1% for chronic kidney disease among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 381st out of 958 Iowa communities (48th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 2.5%, which ranks 142nd out of 905 Iowa communities (28th out of 138 small communities).

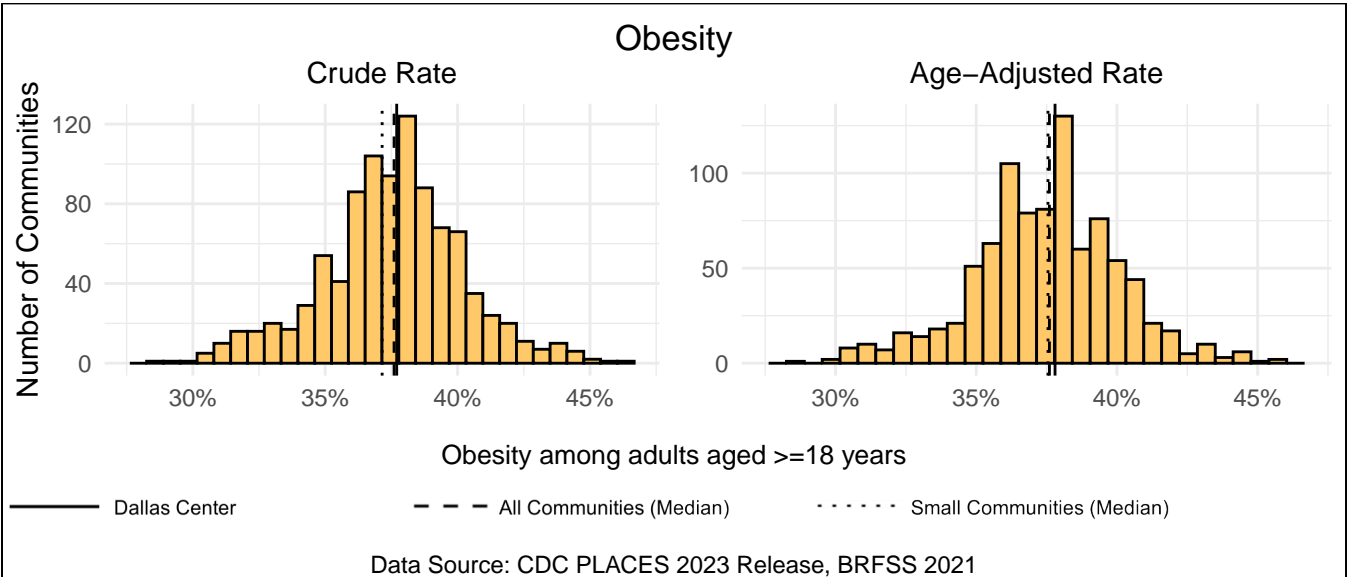

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 37.7% for obesity among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 486th out of 958 Iowa communities (88th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 37.8%, which ranks 477th out of 905 Iowa communities (73rd out of 138 small communities).

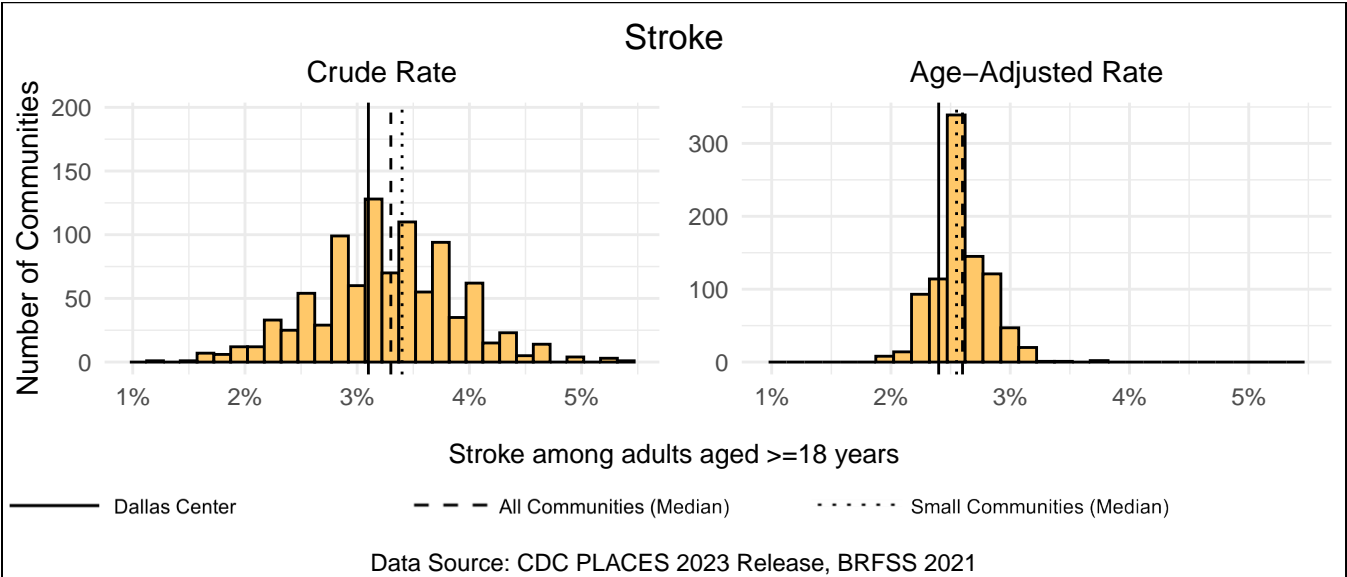

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 3.1% for stroke among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 340th out of 958 Iowa communities (48th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 2.4%, which ranks 116th out of 905 Iowa communities (20th out of 138 small communities).

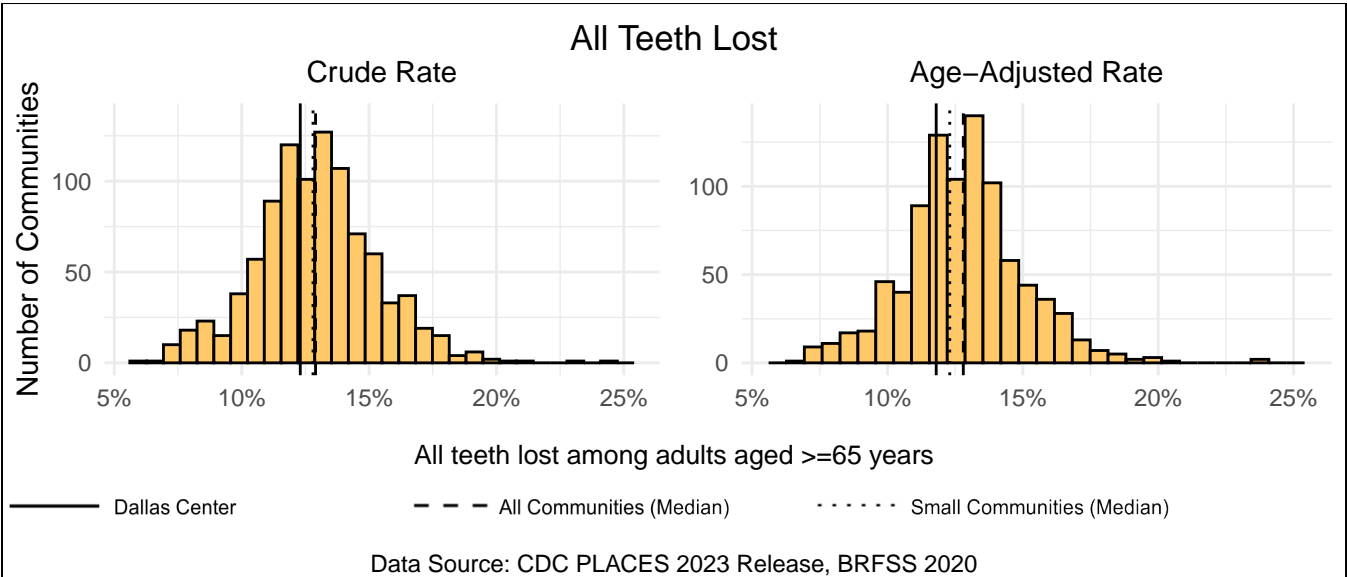

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 12.3% for all teeth lost among adults aged >=65 years, which ranks 373rd out of 958 Iowa communities (53rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 11.8%, which ranks 261st out of 905 Iowa communities (48th out of 138 small communities).

Prevention

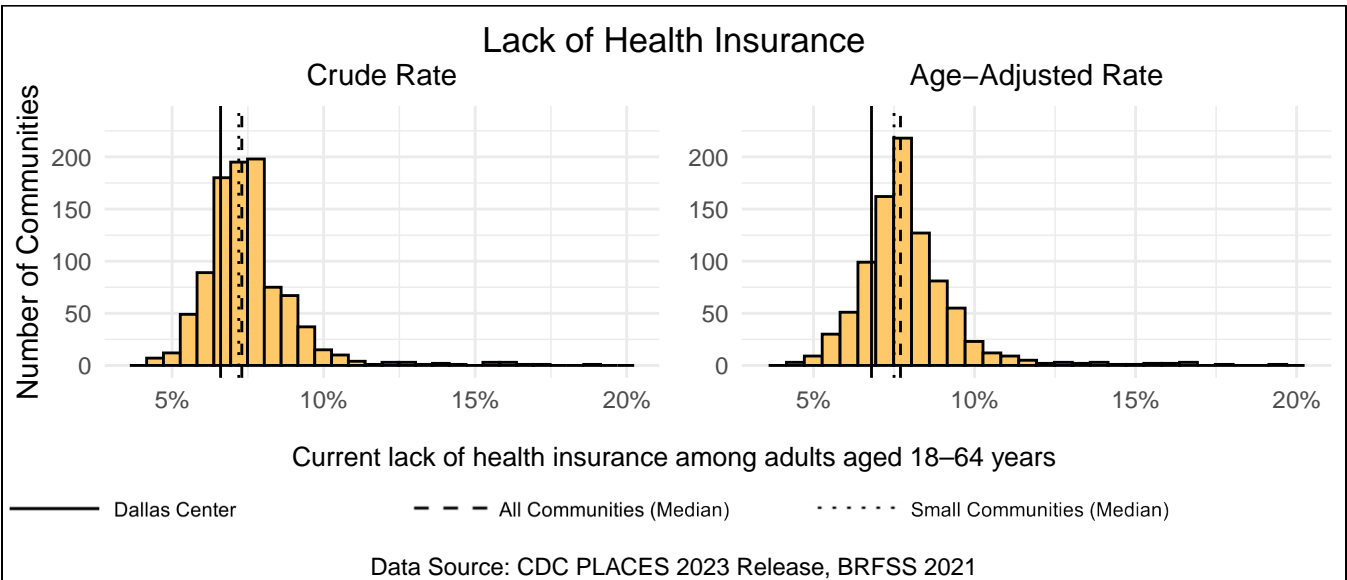

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 6.6% for current lack of health insurance among adults aged 18–64 years, which ranks 196th out of 958 Iowa communities (32nd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 6.8%, which ranks 143rd out of 905 Iowa communities (30th out of 138 small communities).

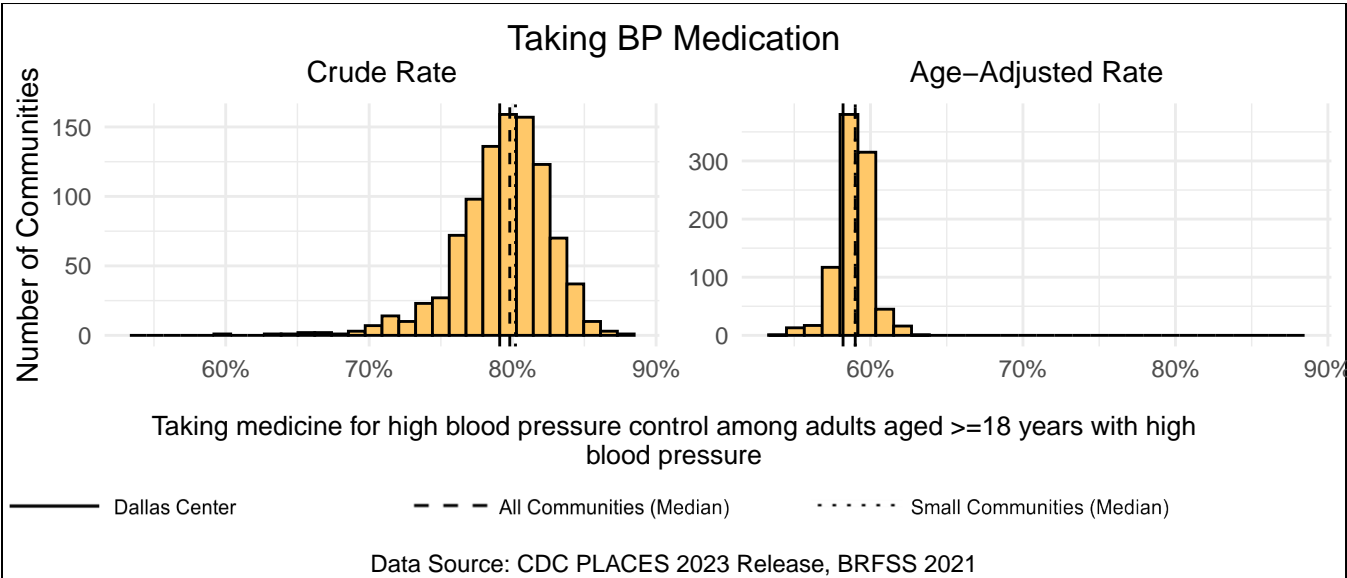

Taking BP Medication

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 79.1% for taking medicine for high blood pressure control among adults aged ≥ 18 years with high blood pressure, which ranks 548th out of 958 Iowa communities (87th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 58.2%, which ranks 709th out of 905 Iowa communities (104th out of 138 small communities).

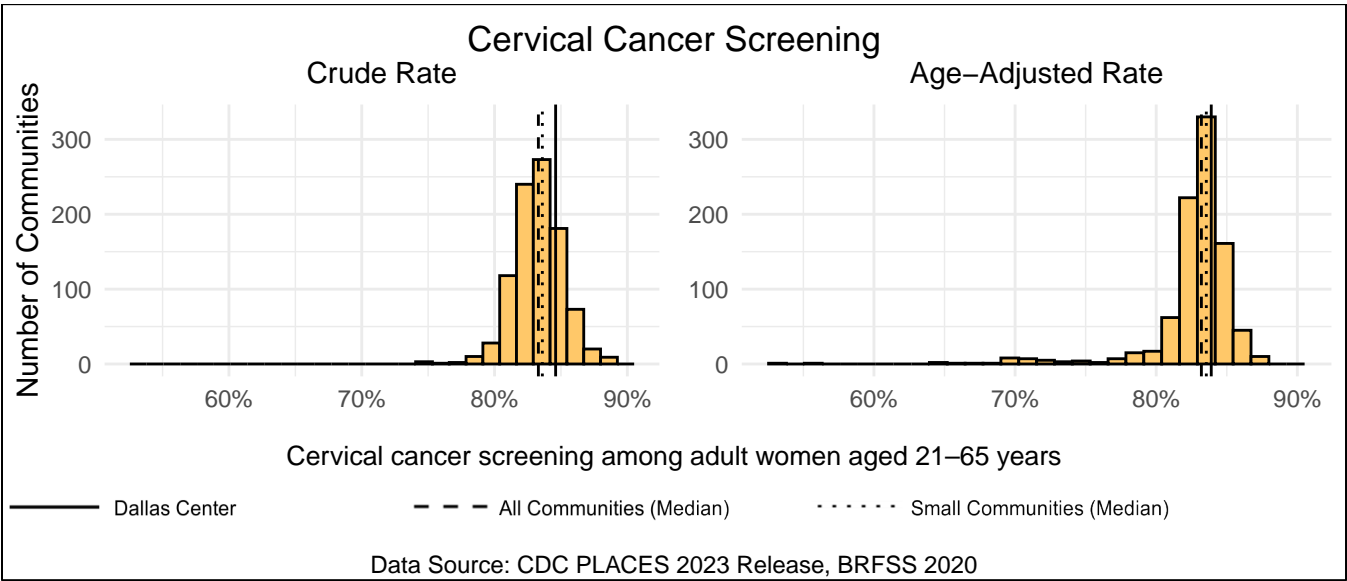

Cervical Cancer Screening

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 84.6% for cervical cancer screening among adult women aged 21–65 years, which ranks 196th out of 958 Iowa communities (34th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 83.9%, which ranks 250th out of 905 Iowa communities (49th out of 138 small communities).

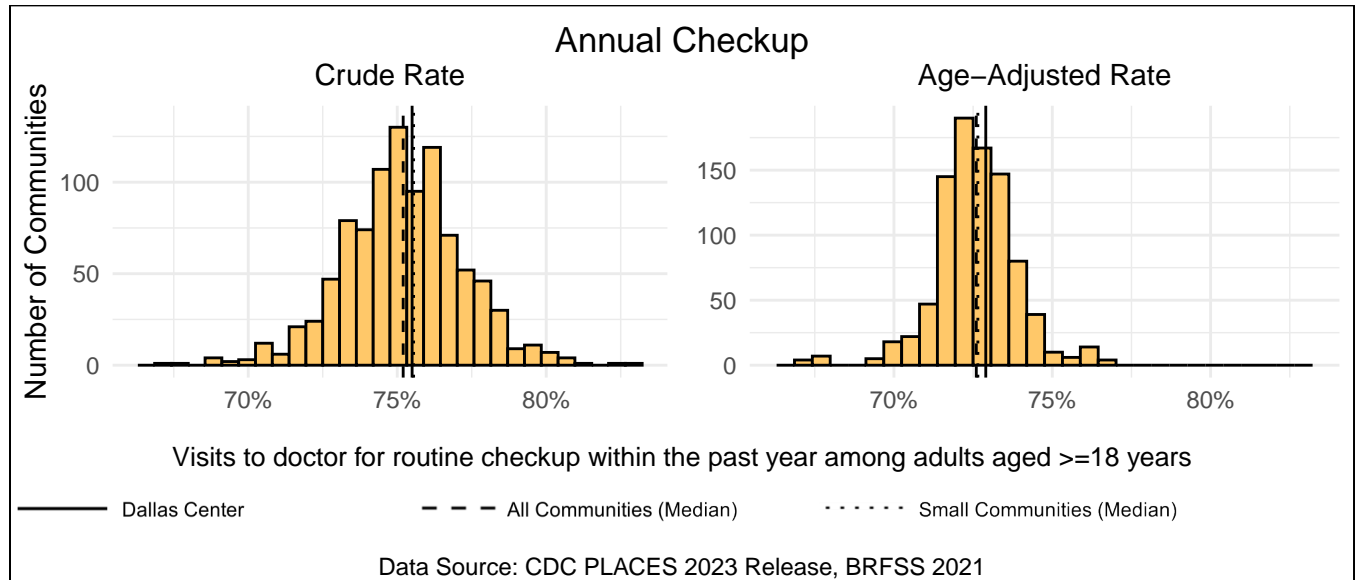

Annual Checkup

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 75.5% for visits to doctor for routine checkup within the past year among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 408th out of 958 Iowa communities (70th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 72.9%, which ranks 333rd out of 905 Iowa communities (52nd out of 138 small communities).

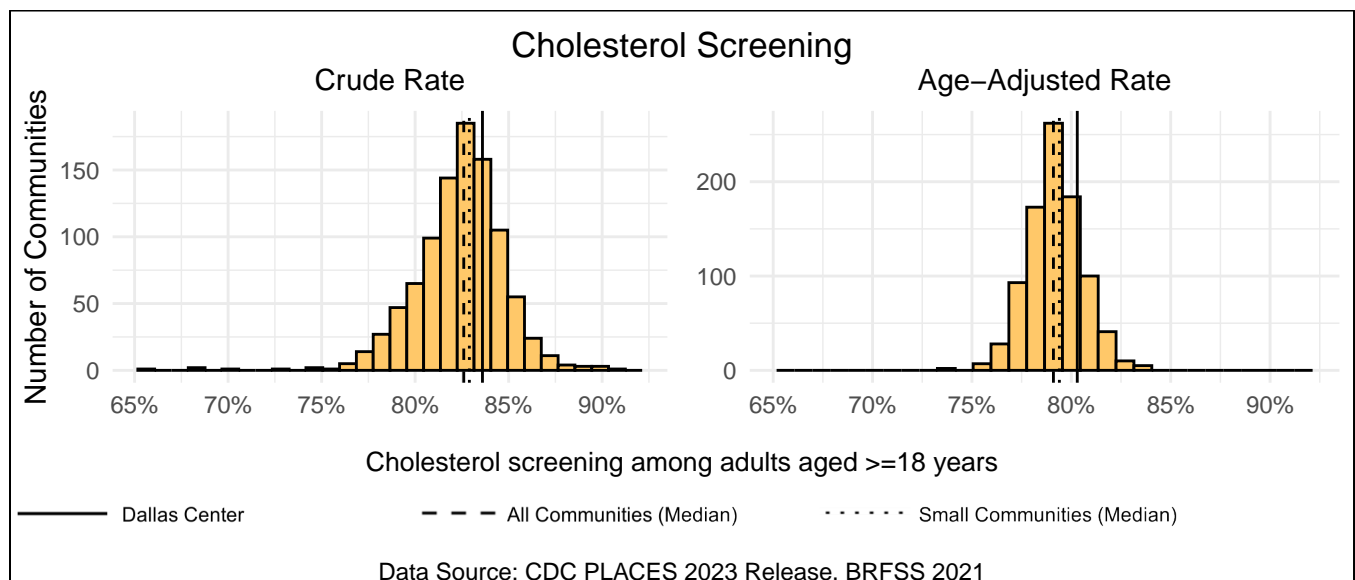

Cholesterol Screening

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 83.6% for cholesterol screening among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 282nd out of 958 Iowa communities (47th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 80.3%, which ranks 179th out of 905 Iowa communities (34th out of 138 small communities).

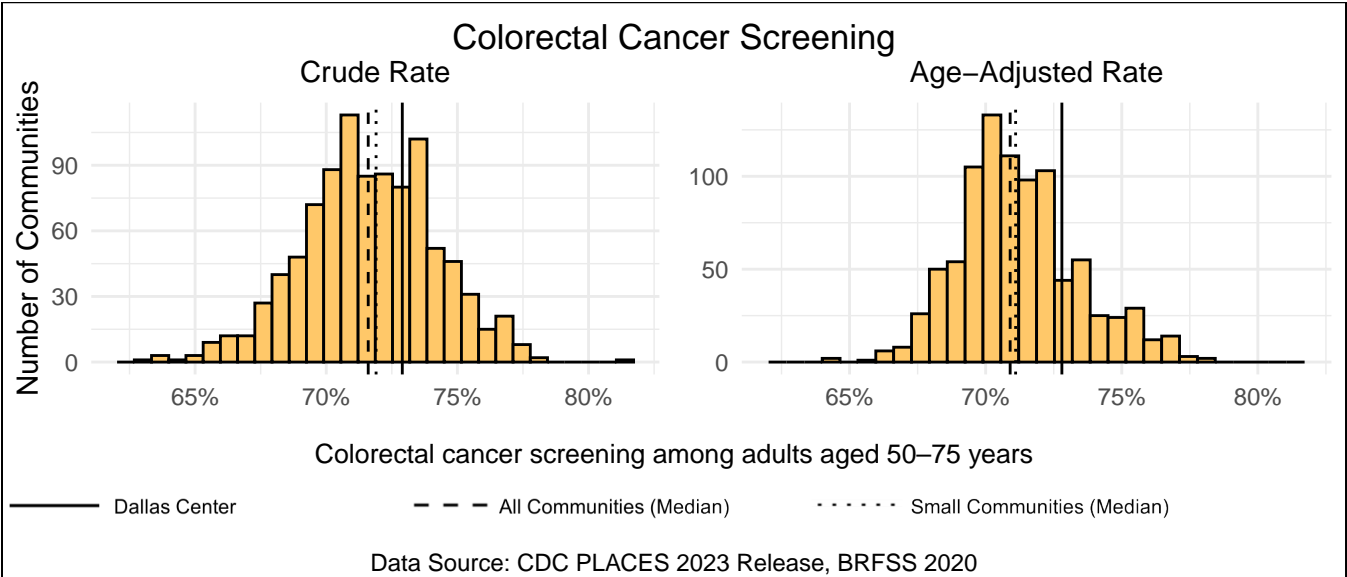

Colorectal Cancer Screening

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 72.9% for colorectal cancer screening among adults aged 50–75 years, which ranks 301st out of 958 Iowa communities (45th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 72.8%, which ranks 182nd out of 905 Iowa communities (35th out of 138 small communities).

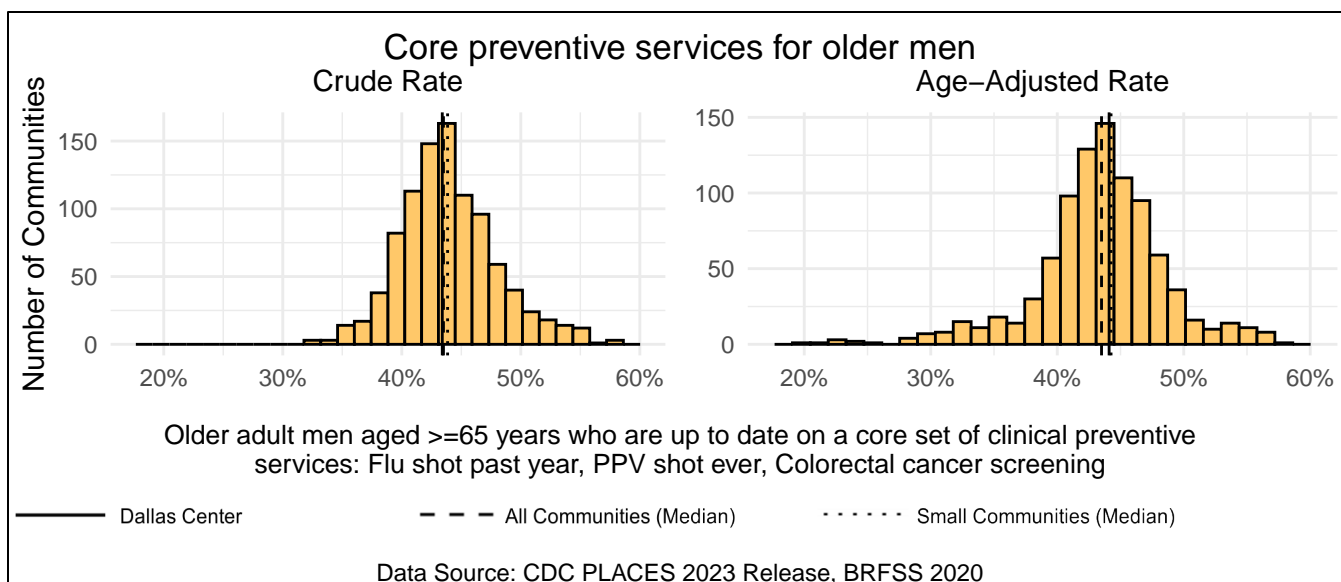

Core preventive services for older men

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 43.4% for older adult men aged ≥ 65 years who are up to date on a core set of clinical preventive services: flu shot past year, ppv shot ever, colorectal cancer screening, which ranks 490th out of 958 Iowa communities (74th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 44.1%, which ranks 380th out of 905 Iowa communities (73rd out of 138 small communities).

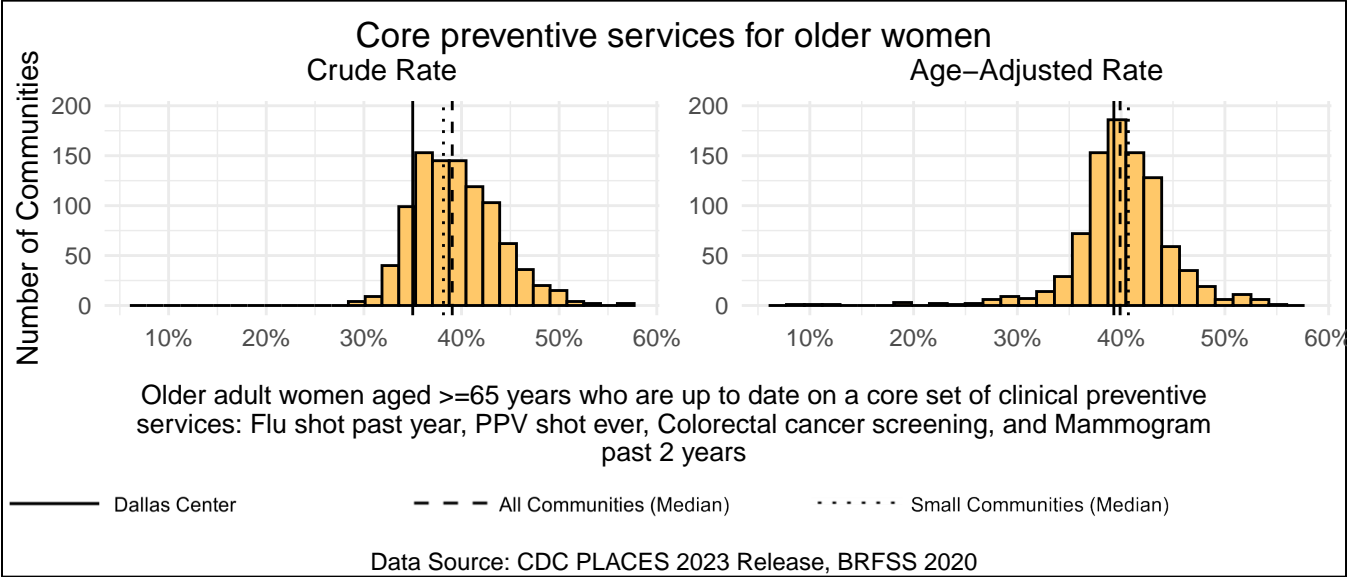

Core preventive services for older women

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 35.0% for older adult women aged ≥ 65 years who are up to date on a core set of clinical preventive services: flu shot past year, ppv shot ever, colorectal cancer screening, and mammogram past 2 years, which ranks 824th out of 958 Iowa communities (115th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 39.3%, which ranks 534th out of 905 Iowa communities (92nd out of 138 small communities).

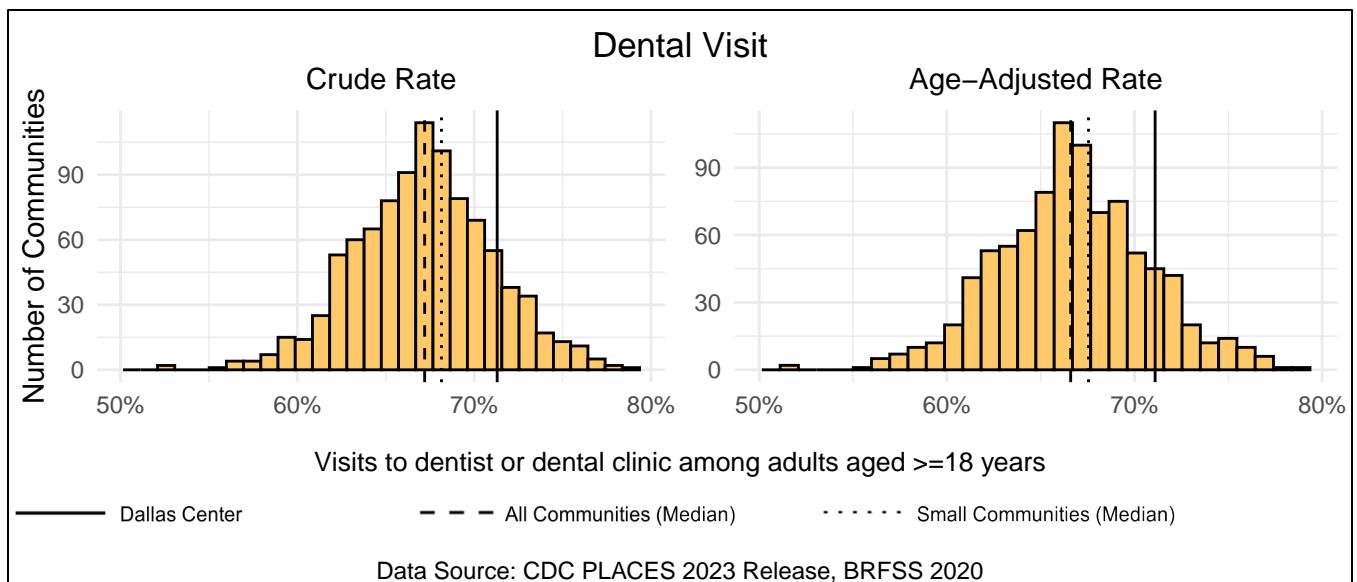

Dental Visit

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 71.3% for visits to dentist or dental clinic among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 130th out of 958 Iowa communities (26th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 71.1%, which ranks 130th out of 905 Iowa communities (26th out of 138 small communities).

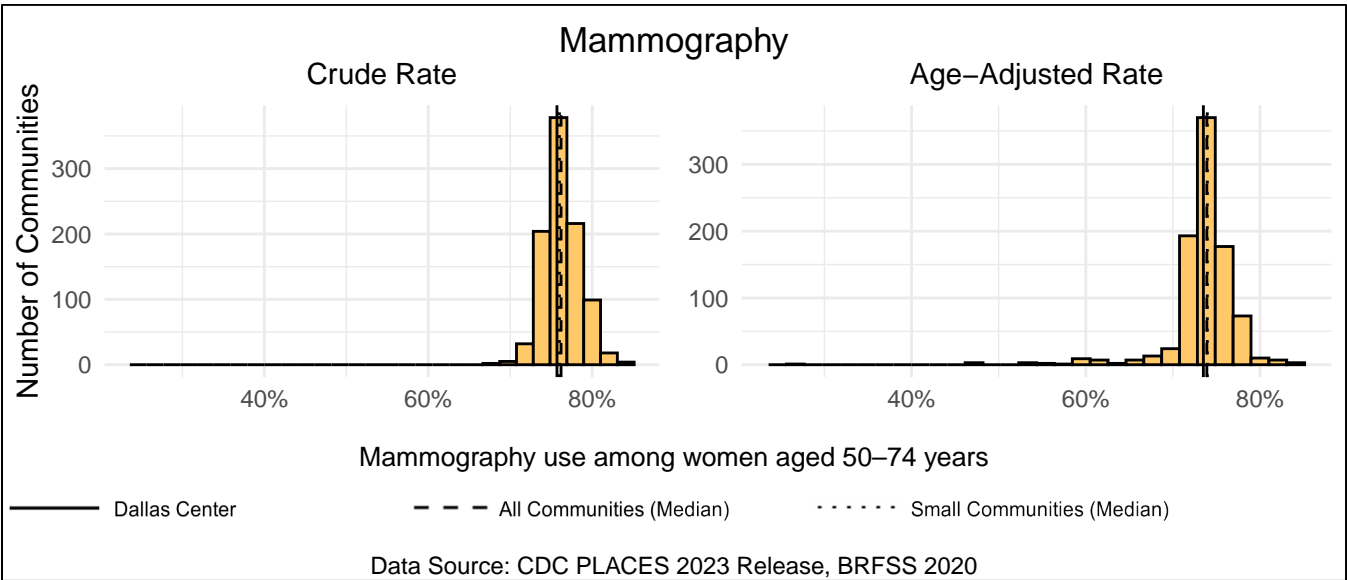

Mammography

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 75.7% for mammography use among women aged 50–74 years, which ranks 573rd out of 958 Iowa communities (77th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 73.5%, which ranks 519th out of 905 Iowa communities (83rd out of 138 small communities).

Disability

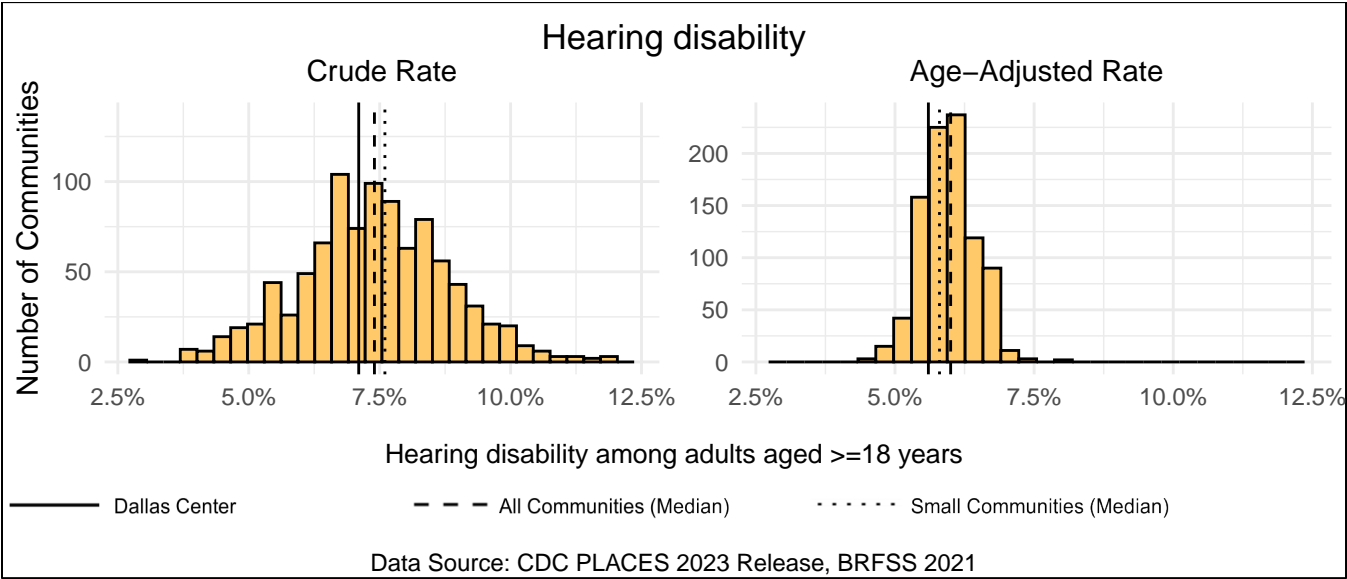

Dallas Center has a crude rate of 7.1% for hearing disability among adults aged ≥ 18 years, which ranks 383rd out of 958 Iowa communities (49th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Dallas Center is 5.6%, which ranks 163rd out of 905 Iowa communities (29th out of 138 small communities).

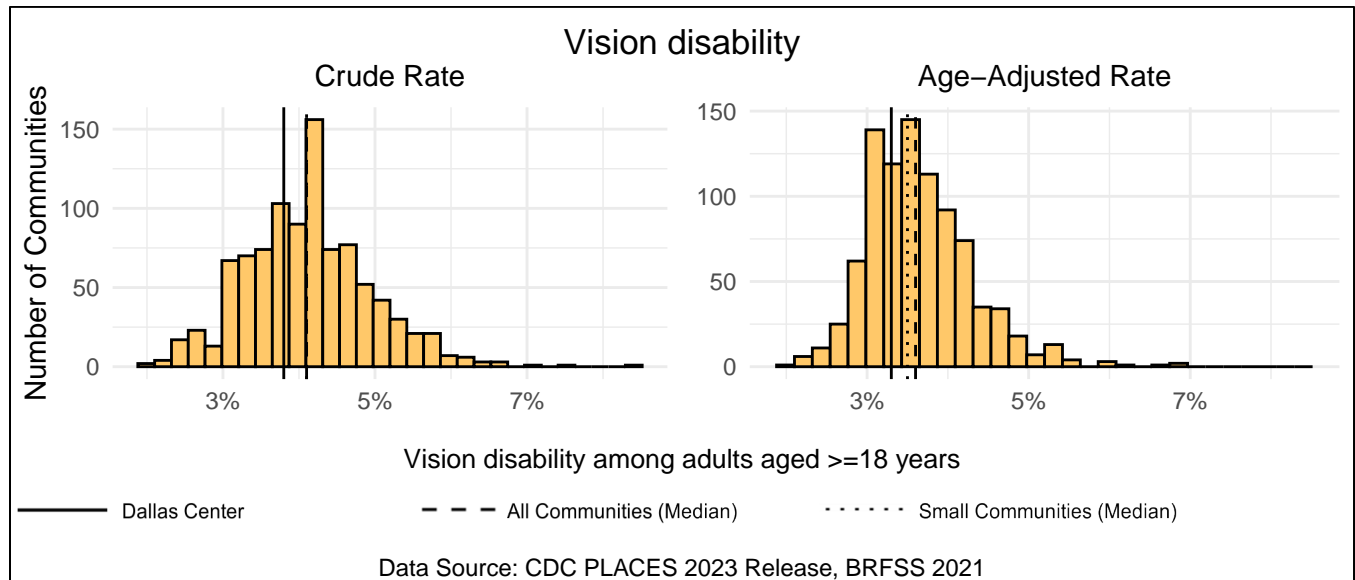

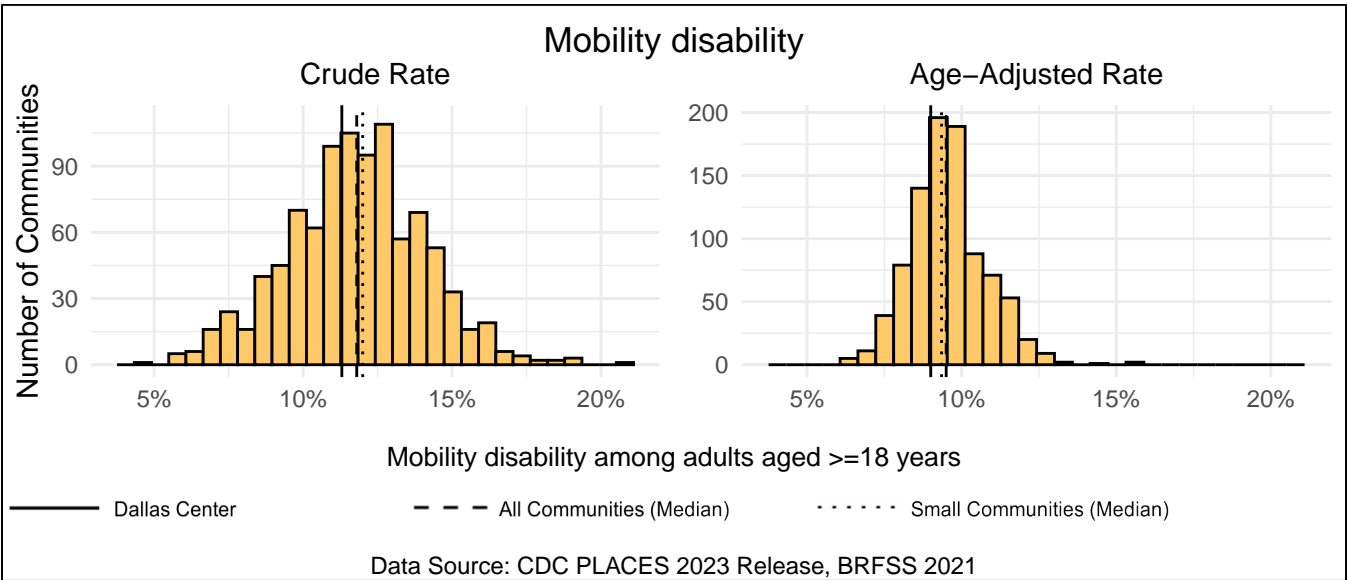

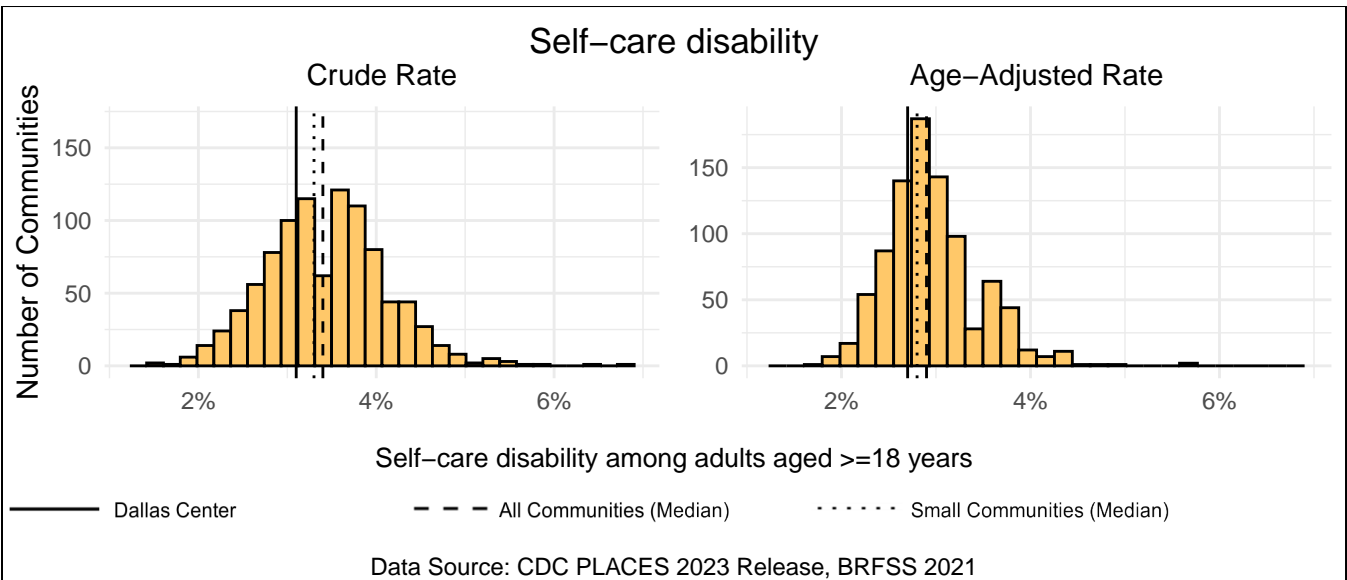

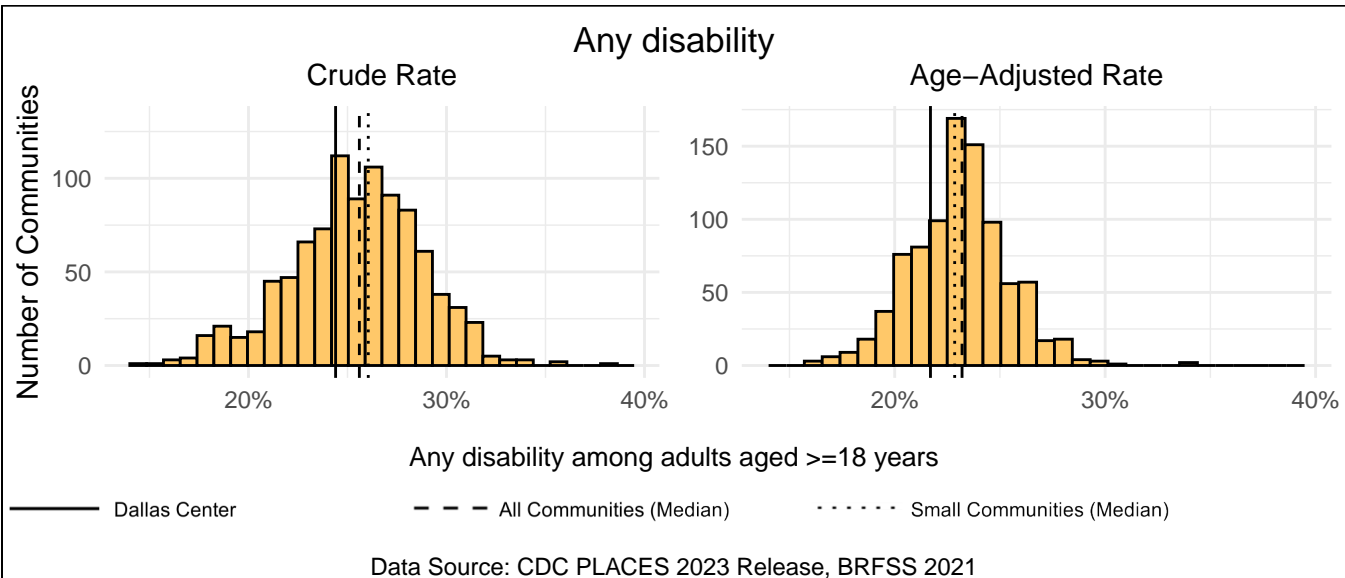

The PLACES dataset uses small area estimation methods to provide estimates of health measures for counties, places, census tracts, and zip code tabulation areas. The estimates are created with a multilevel statistical modeling framework that utilizes CDC's Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), Census population counts, and American Community Survey demographic and socioeconomic data.
