Health in Lake City: Overview

Dear Community Members & Stakeholders of Lake City,

We are pleased to share the Iowa Community Health Snapshot series, a set of reports designed in partnership with Iowa State University's Community Economic Development to assess the overall landscape of health and well-being across Iowa. The following pages include the health snapshot for your community. The snapshot can be used to see how Lake City ranks across various health measures compared to the rest of the state and similarly-sized communities. This comparison allows us to identify Lake City's strengths and opportunities for growth by leveraging the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention PLACES dataset.

The report includes 37 health measures organized topically by general health status, risky behavior, health outcomes, prevention, and disability. We provide a general overview of each health topic, followed by a description of each health measure. Health measure descriptions include crude and age-adjusted rates and a ranking that tells you how your community ranks compared to all lowa communities and communities of similar size to Lake City. Crude rates tell you the raw, un-adjusted percent of the population experiencing the health measure. Age-adjusted rates account for the age distribution present in your community and presents what the rate would be if your community had a standard age distribution. Crude rates can provide a general comparison between communities and age-adjusted rates can give a fairer comparison between communities with different age structures.

Strengths

Take a look at the top strengths of your community! Below are unadjusted and age-adjusted health measures that represent your community's strengths. We recommend using continued investment in these areas to maintain them as strengths, as well as building on them to improve in other health domains.

How to Use this Report

The purpose of the Iowa Community Health Snapshot Series is to provide an overview of health in Lake City that can be used to help inform health-related interventions and programming. This report contains five sections, including the overall health status of Lake City, a review of risky behaviors in the community, and information on various health outcomes, prevention measures, and disability needs. Each section includes an overview of the health domain, a breakdown of its underlying health measures, and data to see how Lake City compares to the rest of the state and similarly-sized communities.

With a population of 1,745, Lake City's similarly sized communities are defined as small communities. In lowa, small communities have an average population of 1,553, and there are 138 communities that are considered small communities. To see all of the communities in this population group, please see Appendix 3 of this report.

Using Ames, IA as an Example

The graphic below is an example of the details included for each health measure. The table in the upper right shows your community's crude and age-adjusted rate estimates alongside their averages across all lowa communities and similarly-sized communities. The images below show the distribution of the health measure across communities. The vertical lines correspond with the values in the table to show the estimate for the specific community compared to communities across the state. The solid black line in each plot represents the community rate, with the dashed lines indicating the average rate for all lowa communities and the dotted lines showing the average rate for similarly-sized communities.



The example graphic above displays the poor mental health rate in Ames, lowa. The left plot shows the crude rate of poor mental health in the community. Crude rates are the raw, un-adjusted percent of the population experiencing the health measure. Notice how the solid black line is closer to the right of the plot than the dashed and dotted lines; this indicates that Ames has a higher crude rate of poor mental health than most communities in the state. However, the age-adjusted rate plot on the right shows the solid line closer to the peak of the distribution and averages for the state and similarly-sized communities, indicating that when accounting for Ames's unique age distribution, Ames's poor mental health rate is not a significant outlier, and is estimated to be lower than the statewide average. Accounting for crude and age-adjusted rates is critical to help inform health interventions as age-adjusted rates can help contextualize the health measure within the population.

Health Status


This section reflects measures for overall health, including general, physical, and mental health. These measures are a valuable way to see a simple summary of the health of a country's population. The questions to calculate these measures ask respondents to evaluate their health status. General health is evaluated on a 5-point scale where respondents can report their health status as one of "excellent," "very good," "good," "fair," or "poor," from which the respondents who answer "fair" or "poor" are included in the measure. Physical and mental health are evaluated as the rate of respondents who say they have had 14 or more days in the last 30 days in which their physical or mental health was not good. Poor General Health

Lake City has a crude rate of 16.5% for fair or poor self-rated health status among adults aged >= 18 years, which ranks 820th out of 958 lowa communities (124th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 13.8%, which ranks 685th out of 905 lowa communities (116th out of 138 small communities).



Poor Physical Health

Lake City has a crude rate of 12.2% for physical health not good for >=14 days among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 846th out of 958 lowa communities (125th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 10.4%, which ranks 707th out of 905 lowa communities (115th out of 138 small communities).



Poor Mental Health

Lake City has a crude rate of 13.7% for mental health not good for >=14 days among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 260th out of 958 lowa communities (44th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 16.0%, which ranks 631st out of 905 lowa communities (97th out of 138 small communities).

Health Risk Behaviors


Health risk measures are measures of individual behaviors that can lead to poor health outcomes. These include binge drinking, current smoking, physical inactivity, and getting less than seven hours of nightly sleep. Risk behaviors are the most critical intervention points as they can help save lives and drastically improve health outcomes later in life. Each measure is calculated as the rate of respondents participating in a high level of risk behavior. The exact cutoff points for the behavior depend on the health area. Binge Drinking

Lake City has a crude rate of 16.5% for binge drinking among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 53rd out of 958 lowa communities (6th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 21.2%, which ranks 202nd out of 905 lowa communities (28th out of 138 small communities).



Current Smoking

Lake City has a crude rate of 16.5% for current smoking among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 406th out of 958 lowa communities (84th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 18.6%, which ranks 649th out of 905 lowa communities (109th out of 138 small communities).



Physical Inactivity

Lake City has a crude rate of 29.5% for no leisure-time physical activity among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 840th out of 958 lowa communities (121st out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 26.0%, which ranks 692nd out of 905 lowa communities (114th out of 138 small communities).



Sleep <7 hours

Lake City has a crude rate of 28.9% for sleeping less than 7 hours among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 196th out of 958 lowa communities (39th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 30.8%, which ranks 378th out of 905 lowa communities (61st out of 138 small communities).



Arthritis

Lake City has a crude rate of 32.8% for arthritis among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 906th out of 958 lowa communities (131st out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 24.2%, which ranks 736th out of 905 lowa communities (117th out of 138 small communities).



High Blood Pressure

Lake City has a crude rate of 38.3% for high blood pressure among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 920th out of 958 lowa communities (134th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 29.2%, which ranks 798th out of 905 lowa communities (127th out of 138 small communities).



Lake City has a crude rate of 10.0% for cancer (excluding skin cancer) among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 887th out of 958 lowa communities (125th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 6.5%, which ranks 418th out of 905 lowa communities (41st out of 138 small communities).



Lake City has a crude rate of 9.4% for current asthma among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 524th out of 958 lowa communities (85th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 9.8%, which ranks 696th out of 905 lowa communities (107th out of 138 small communities).



Lake City has a crude rate of 8.4% for coronary heart disease among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 894th out of 958 lowa communities (130th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 5.2%, which ranks 601st out of 905 lowa communities (110th out of 138 small communities).



Lake City has a crude rate of 9.0% for chronic obstructive pulmonary disease among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 865th out of 958 lowa communities (128th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 6.8%, which ranks 699th out of 905 lowa communities (115th out of 138 small communities).





The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 8.8%, which ranks 705th out of 905 lowa communities (117th out of 138 small communities).



Lake City has a crude rate of 39.1% for high cholesterol among adults aged >=18 years who have been screened in the past 5 years, which ranks 827th out of 958 lowa communities (127th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 29.8%, which ranks 467th out of 905 lowa communities (78th out of 138 small communities).



Lake City has a crude rate of 4.0% for chronic kidney disease among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 890th out of 958 lowa communities (128th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 2.7%, which ranks 623rd out of 905 lowa communities (106th out of 138 small communities).



Lake City has a crude rate of 39.4% for obesity among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 747th out of 958 lowa communities (123rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake City is 40.5%, which ranks 802nd out of 905 lowa communities (126th out of 138 small communities).



This report uses a novel dataset from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) called PLACES: Local Data for Better Health. The PLACES dataset uses small area estimation methods to provide estimates of health measures for counties, places, census tracts, and zip code tabulation areas. The estimates are created with a multilevel statistical modeling framework that utilizes CDC's Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), Census population counts, and American Community Survey demographic and socioeconomic data.
