

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Health in Lake Park: Overview

Dear Community Members & Stakeholders of Lake Park,

We are pleased to share the Iowa Community Health Snapshot series, a set of reports designed in partnership with Iowa State University's Community Economic Development to assess the overall landscape of health and well-being across Iowa. The following pages include the health snapshot for your community. The snapshot can be used to see how Lake Park ranks across various health measures compared to the rest of the state and similarly-sized communities. This comparison allows us to identify Lake Park's strengths and opportunities for growth by leveraging the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention PLACES dataset.

The report includes 37 health measures organized topically by general health status, risky behavior, health outcomes, prevention, and disability. We provide a general overview of each health topic, followed by a description of each health measure. Health measure descriptions include crude and age-adjusted rates and a ranking that tells you how your community ranks compared to all lowa communities and communities of similar size to Lake Park. Crude rates tell you the raw, un-adjusted percent of the population experiencing the health measure. Age-adjusted rates account for the age distribution present in your community and presents what the rate would be if your community had a standard age distribution. Crude rates can provide a general comparison between communities and age-adjusted rates can give a fairer comparison between communities.

Take a look at the top strengths of your community! Below are unadjusted and age-adjusted health measures that represent your community's strengths. We recommend using continued investment in these areas to maintain them as strengths, as well as building on them to improve in other health domains.

How to Use this Report


The purpose of the lowa Community Health Snapshot Series is to provide an overview of health in Lake Park that can be used to help inform health-related interventions and programming. This report contains five sections, including the overall health status of Lake Park, a review of risky behaviors in the community, and information on various health outcomes, prevention measures, and disability needs. Each section includes an overview of the health domain, a breakdown of its underlying health measures, and data to see how Lake Park compares to the rest of the state and similarly-sized communities.

With a population of 1,223, Lake Park's similarly sized communities are defined as small communities. In Iowa, small communities have an average population of 1,553, and there are 138 communities that are considered small communities. To see all of the communities in this population group, please see Appendix 3 of this report.

Using Ames, IA as an Example

The graphic below is an example of the details included for each health measure. The table in the upper right shows your community's crude and age-adjusted rate estimates alongside their averages across all lowa communities and similarly-sized communities. The images below show the distribution of the health measure across communities. The vertical lines correspond with the values in the table to show the estimate for the specific community compared to communities across the state. The solid black line in each plot represents the community rate, with the dashed lines indicating the average rate for all lowa communities and the dotted lines showing the average rate for similarly-sized communities.



The example graphic above displays the poor mental health rate in Ames, Iowa. The left plot shows the crude rate of poor mental health in the community. Crude rates are the raw, un-adjusted percent of the population experiencing the health measure. Notice how the solid black line is closer to the right of the plot than the dashed and dotted lines; this indicates that Ames has a higher crude rate of poor mental health than most communities in the state. However, the age-adjusted rate plot on the right shows the solid line closer to the peak of the distribution and averages for the state and similarly-sized communities, indicating that when accounting for Ames's unique age distribution, Ames's poor mental health rate is not a significant outlier, and is estimated to be lower than the statewide average. Accounting for crude and age-adjusted rates is critical to help inform health interventions as age-adjusted rates can help contextualize the health measure within the population.

Health Status


This section reflects measures for overall health, including general, physical, and mental health. These measures are a valuable way to see a simple summary of the health of a country's population. The questions to calculate these measures ask respondents to evaluate their health status. General health is evaluated on a 5-point scale where respondents can report their health status as one of "excellent," "very good," "good," "fair," or "poor," from which the respondents who answer "fair" or "poor" are included in the measure. Physical and mental health are evaluated as the rate of respondents who say they have had 14 or more days in the last 30 days in which their physical or mental health was not good. Poor General Health

Lake Park has a crude rate of 13.4% for fair or poor selfrated health status among adults aged >= 18 years, which ranks 329th out of 958 lowa communities (53rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 11.2%, which ranks 150th out of 905 lowa communities (32nd out of 138 small communities).



Poor Physical Health

Lake Park has a crude rate of 10.4% for physical health not good for >=14 days among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 354th out of 958 lowa communities (61st out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 8.9%, which ranks 160th out of 905 lowa communities (33rd out of 138 small communities).



Poor Mental Health

Lake Park has a crude rate of 12.7% for mental health not good for >=14 days among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 48th out of 958 lowa communities (5th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 14.8%, which ranks 189th out of 905 lowa communities (34th out of 138 small communities).

Health Risk Behaviors


Health risk measures are measures of individual behaviors that can lead to poor health outcomes. These include binge drinking, current smoking, physical inactivity, and getting less than seven hours of nightly sleep. Risk behaviors are the most critical intervention points as they can help save lives and drastically improve health outcomes later in life. Each measure is calculated as the rate of respondents participating in a high level of risk behavior. The exact cutoff points for the behavior depend on the health area. Binge Drinking

Lake Park has a crude rate of 18.9% for binge drinking among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 370th out of 958 lowa communities (66th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 23.5%, which ranks 828th out of 905 lowa communities (128th out of 138 small communities).



Current Smoking

Lake Park has a crude rate of 14.9% for current smoking among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 160th out of 958 lowa communities (33rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 16.1%, which ranks 204th out of 905 lowa communities (38th out of 138 small communities).



Physical Inactivity

Lake Park has a crude rate of 25.4% for no leisure-time physical activity among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 396th out of 958 lowa communities (64th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 22.5%, which ranks 233rd out of 905 lowa communities (48th out of 138 small communities).



Sleep <7 hours

Lake Park has a crude rate of 27.5% for sleeping less than 7 hours among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 59th out of 958 lowa communities (12th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 29.1%, which ranks 111th out of 905 lowa communities (20th out of 138 small communities).

Health Outcomes



Health outcome measures include but are not limited to arthritis, high blood pressure, cancer, depression, and obesity. Arthritis

Lake Park has a crude rate of 30.5% for arthritis among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 769th out of 958 lowa communities (104th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 22.6%, which ranks 287th out of 905 lowa communities (42nd out of 138 small communities).



High Blood Pressure

Lake Park has a crude rate of 34.7% for high blood pressure among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 726th out of 958 lowa communities (103rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 26.4%, which ranks 244th out of 905 lowa communities (38th out of 138 small communities).



Cancer (except skin)

Lake Park has a crude rate of 9.8% for cancer (excluding skin cancer) among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 859th out of 958 lowa communities (116th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 6.6%, which ranks 831st out of 905 lowa communities (126th out of 138 small communities).



Current Asthma

Lake Park has a crude rate of 8.9% for current asthma among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 80th out of 958 lowa communities (11th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 9.3%, which ranks 241st out of 905 lowa communities (34th out of 138 small communities).



Lake Park has a crude rate of 7.3% for coronary heart disease among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 696th out of 958 lowa communities (91st out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 4.7%, which ranks 187th out of 905 lowa communities (36th out of 138 small communities).



Lake Park has a crude rate of 7.4% for chronic obstructive pulmonary disease among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 448th out of 958 lowa communities (66th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 5.6%, which ranks 162nd out of 905 lowa communities (33rd out of 138 small communities).





Lake Park has a crude rate of 10.2% for diagnosed diabetes among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 495th out of 958 lowa communities (78th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 7.4%, which ranks 128th out of 905 lowa communities (23rd out of 138 small communities).



Lake Park has a crude rate of 38.1% for high cholesterol among adults aged >=18 years who have been screened in the past 5 years, which ranks 737th out of 958 lowa communities (110th out of 138 small communities). The ageadjusted rate for Lake Park is 29.1%, which ranks 195th out of 905 lowa communities (35th out of 138 small communities).



Lake Park has a crude rate of 3.6% for chronic kidney disease among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 732nd out of 958 lowa communities (91st out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 2.5%, which ranks 142nd out of 905 lowa communities (28th out of 138 small communities).







Prevention



Lack of Health Insurance

Lake Park has a crude rate of 6.2% for current lack of health insurance among adults aged 18–64 years, which ranks 120th out of 958 lowa communities (19th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 6.7%, which ranks 132nd out of 905 lowa communities (26th out of 138 small communities).



Taking BP Medication

Lake Park has a crude rate of 82.5% for taking medicine for high blood pressure control among adults aged >=18 years with high blood pressure, which ranks 126th out of 958 lowa communities (23rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 58.7%, which ranks 537th out of 905 lowa communities (81st out of 138 small communities).



The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 84.6%, which ranks 142nd out of 905 Iowa communities (32nd out of 138 small communities).



Lake Park has a crude rate of 76.5% for visits to doctor for routine checkup within the past year among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 222nd out of 958 lowa communities (42nd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 71.7%, which ranks 720th out of 905 lowa communities (119th out of 138 small communities).



Lake Park has a crude rate of 85.2% for cholesterol screening among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 79th out of 958 lowa communities (5th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 79.7%, which ranks 296th out of 905 lowa communities (57th out of 138 small communities).



Colorectal Cancer Screening

Lake Park has a crude rate of 74.8% for colorectal cancer screening among adults aged 50–75 years, which ranks 97th out of 958 lowa communities (17th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 72.4%, which ranks 223rd out of 905 lowa communities (43rd out of 138 small communities).



Core preventive services for older men

Lake Park has a crude rate of 51.0% for older adult men aged >=65 years who are up to date on a core set of clinical preventive services: flu shot past year, ppv shot ever, colorectal cancer screening, which ranks 58th out of 958 lowa communities (5th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 50.9%, which ranks 49th out of 905 lowa communities (5th out of 138 small communities).



Core preventive services for older women

Lake Park has a crude rate of 40.3% for older adult women aged >=65 years who are up to date on a core set of clinical preventive services: flu shot past year, ppv shot ever, colorectal cancer screening, and mammogram past 2 years, which ranks 370th out of 958 lowa communities (52nd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 41.2%, which ranks 345th out of 905 lowa communities (60th out of 138 small communities).



Lake Park has a crude rate of 70.5% for visits to dentist or dental clinic among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 177th out of 958 lowa communities (33rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 69.8%, which ranks 190th out of 905 lowa communities (33rd out of 138 small communities).



Lake Park has a crude rate of 73.5% for mammography use among women aged 50–74 years, which ranks 873rd out of 958 lowa communities (124th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 73.1%, which ranks 594th out of 905 lowa communities (89th out of 138 small communities).

Disability



Lake Park has a crude rate of 8.3% for hearing disability among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 702nd out of 958 lowa communities (88th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Lake Park is 5.6%, which ranks 163rd out of 905 lowa communities (29th out of 138 small communities).











The estimates are created with a multilevel statistical modeling framework that utilizes CDC's Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), Census population counts, and American Community Survey demographic and socioeconomic data.
