

## Health in Norwalk: Overview

Dear Community Members & Stakeholders of Norwalk,

We are pleased to share the Iowa Community Health Snapshot series, a set of reports designed in partner-ship with Iowa State University's Community Economic Development to assess the overall landscape of health and well-being across Iowa. The following pages include the health snapshot for your community. The snapshot can be used to see how Norwalk ranks across various health measures compared to the rest of the state and similarly-sized communities. This comparison allows us to identify Norwalk's strengths and opportunities for growth by leveraging the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention PLACES dataset.

The report includes 37 health measures organized topically by general health status, risky behavior, health outcomes, prevention, and disability. We provide a general overview of each health topic, followed by a description of each health measure. Health measure descriptions include crude and age-adjusted rates and a ranking that tells you how your community ranks compared to all lowa communities and communities of similar size to Norwalk. Crude rates tell you the raw, un-adjusted percent of the population experiencing the health measure. Age-adjusted rates account for the age distribution present in your community and presents what the rate would be if your community had a standard age distribution. Crude rates can provide a general comparison between communities and age-adjusted rates can give a fairer comparison between communities with different age structures.

# **How to Use this Report**


The purpose of the Iowa Community Health Snapshot Series is to provide an overview of health in Norwalk that can be used to help inform health-related interventions and programming. This report contains five sections, including the overall health status of Norwalk, a review of risky behaviors in the community, and information on various health outcomes, prevention measures, and disability needs. Each section includes an overview of the health domain, a breakdown of its underlying health measures, and data to see how Norwalk compares to the rest of the state and similarly-sized communities.

With a population of 13,057, Norwalk's similarly sized communities are defined as mid-large communities. In lowa, mid-large communities have an average population of 20,750, and there are 31 communities that are considered mid-large communities. To see all of the communities in this population group, please see Appendix 3 of this report.

#### Using Ames, IA as an Example

The graphic below is an example of the details included for each health measure. The table in the upper right shows your community's crude and age-adjusted rate estimates alongside their averages across all lowa communities and similarly-sized communities. The images below show the distribution of the health measure across communities. The vertical lines correspond with the values in the table to show the estimate for the specific community compared to communities across the state. The solid black line in each plot represents the community rate, with the dashed lines indicating the average rate for all lowa communities and the dotted lines showing the average rate for similarly-sized communities.



The example graphic above displays the poor mental health rate in Ames, lowa. The left plot shows the crude rate of poor mental health in the community. Crude rates are the raw, un-adjusted percent of the population experiencing the health measure. Notice how the solid black line is closer to the right of the plot than the dashed and dotted lines; this indicates that Ames has a higher crude rate of poor mental health than most communities in the state. However, the age-adjusted rate plot on the right shows the solid line closer to the peak of the distribution and averages for the state and similarly-sized communities, indicating that when accounting for Ames's unique age distribution, Ames's poor mental health rate is not a significant outlier, and is estimated to be lower than the statewide average. Accounting for crude and age-adjusted rates is critical to help inform health interventions as age-adjusted rates can help contextualize the health measure within the population.

## **Health Status**


This section reflects measures for overall health, including general, physical, and mental health. These measures are a valuable way to see a simple summary of the health of a country's population. The questions to calculate these measures ask respondents to evaluate their health status. General health is evaluated on a 5-point scale where respondents can report their health status as one of "excellent," "very good," "good," "fair," or "poor," from which the respondents who answer "fair" or "poor" are included in the measure. Physical and mental health are evaluated as the rate of respondents who say they have had 14 or more days in the last 30 days in which their physical or mental health was not good. #### **Poor General Health**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 9.6% for fair or poor self-rated health status among adults aged >= 18 years, which ranks 28th out of 958 lowa communities (5th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 9.6%, which ranks 31st out of 905 lowa communities (6th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **Poor Physical Health**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 8.1% for physical health not good for >=14 days among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 36th out of 958 lowa communities (7th out of 31 midlarge communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 8.1%, which ranks 41st out of 905 lowa communities (8th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **Poor Mental Health**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 14.1% for mental health not good for >=14 days among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 390th out of 958 lowa communities (7th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 13.9%, which ranks 42nd out of 905 lowa communities (7th out of 31 mid-large communities).

# **Health Risk Behaviors**


Health risk measures are measures of individual behaviors that can lead to poor health outcomes. These include binge drinking, current smoking, physical inactivity, and getting less than seven hours of nightly sleep. Risk behaviors are the most critical intervention points as they can help save lives and drastically improve health outcomes later in life. Each measure is calculated as the rate of respondents participating in a high level of risk behavior. The exact cutoff points for the behavior depend on the health area. #### **Binge Drinking**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 23.1% for binge drinking among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 902nd out of 958 lowa communities (27th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 22.5%, which ranks 609th out of 905 lowa communities (27th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **Current Smoking**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 13.9% for current smoking among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 73rd out of 958 lowa communities (10th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 13.2%, which ranks 41st out of 905 lowa communities (7th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **Physical Inactivity**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 19.6% for no leisure-time physical activity among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 48th out of 958 lowa communities (6th out of 31 midlarge communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 19.7%, which ranks 53rd out of 905 lowa communities (8th out of 31 mid-large communities).



# Sleep <7 hours

Norwalk has a crude rate of 28.2% for sleeping less than 7 hours among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 109th out of 958 lowa communities (9th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 27.6%, which ranks 35th out of 905 lowa communities (6th out of 31 mid-large communities).

# **Health Outcomes**


This section includes measures about specific health outcomes such as chronic illness, mental health conditions, and risk factors for future disease. Health outcome measures include but are not limited to arthritis, high blood pressure, cancer, depression, and obesity. #### **Arthritis**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 20.8% for arthritis among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 34th out of 958 lowa communities (6th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 21.3%, which ranks 71st out of 905 lowa communities (7th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **High Blood Pressure**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 24.1% for high blood pressure among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 27th out of 958 lowa communities (6th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 24.8%, which ranks 31st out of 905 lowa communities (3rd out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### Cancer (except skin)

Norwalk has a crude rate of 6.1% for cancer (excluding skin cancer) among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 45th out of 958 lowa communities (8th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 6.6%, which ranks 831st out of 905 lowa communities (28th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **Current Asthma**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 9.1% for current asthma among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 215th out of 958 lowa communities (7th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 9.0%, which ranks 77th out of 905 lowa communities (6th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **Coronary Heart Disease**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 3.8% for coronary heart disease among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 19th out of 958 lowa communities (5th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 4.2%, which ranks 20th out of 905 lowa communities (5th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### COPD

Norwalk has a crude rate of 4.7% for chronic obstructive pulmonary disease among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 29th out of 958 lowa communities (7th out of 31 midlarge communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 4.8%, which ranks 35th out of 905 lowa communities (7th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **Depression**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 17.8% for depression among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 386th out of 958 lowa communities (4th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 17.6%, which ranks 58th out of 905 lowa communities (3rd out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **Diabetes**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 6.6% for diagnosed diabetes among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 24th out of 958 lowa communities (5th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 6.8%, which ranks 25th out of 905 lowa communities (5th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **High Cholesterol**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 30.9% for high cholesterol among adults aged >=18 years who have been screened in the past 5 years, which ranks 40th out of 958 lowa communities (6th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 29.3%, which ranks 276th out of 905 lowa communities (9th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **Chronic Kidney Disease**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 2.2% for chronic kidney disease among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 21st out of 958 lowa communities (5th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 2.3%, which ranks 12th out of 905 lowa communities (3rd out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### Obesity

Norwalk has a crude rate of 37.4% for obesity among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 430th out of 958 lowa communities (22nd out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 36.5%, which ranks 302nd out of 905 lowa communities (17th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **Stroke**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 2.0% for stroke among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 21st out of 958 lowa communities (5th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 2.2%, which ranks 23rd out of 905 lowa communities (6th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **All Teeth Lost**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 8.9% for all teeth lost among adults aged >=65 years, which ranks 49th out of 958 lowa communities (6th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 9.0%, which ranks 39th out of 905 lowa communities (6th out of 31 mid-large communities).

# **Prevention**



#### **Lack of Health Insurance**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 5.8% for current lack of health insurance among adults aged 18–64 years, which ranks 59th out of 958 lowa communities (4th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 5.8%, which ranks 41st out of 905 lowa communities (6th out of 31 mid-large communities).



## **Taking BP Medication**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 73.7% for taking medicine for high blood pressure control among adults aged >=18 years with high blood pressure, which ranks 907th out of 958 lowa communities (21st out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 58.3%, which ranks 685th out of 905 lowa communities (21st out of 31 mid-large communities).



# **Cervical Cancer Screening**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 85.9% for cervical cancer screening among adult women aged 21–65 years, which ranks 70th out of 958 lowa communities (6th out of 31 midlarge communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 85.5%, which ranks 46th out of 905 lowa communities (6th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **Annual Checkup**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 73.2% for visits to doctor for routine checkup within the past year among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 812th out of 958 lowa communities (25th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 73.7%, which ranks 127th out of 905 lowa communities (8th out of 31 mid-large communities).



## **Cholesterol Screening**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 82.5% for cholesterol screening among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 501st out of 958 lowa communities (9th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 82.2%, which ranks 16th out of 905 lowa communities (4th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **Colorectal Cancer Screening**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 73.5% for colorectal cancer screening among adults aged 50–75 years, which ranks 217th out of 958 lowa communities (11th out of 31 midlarge communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 74.5%, which ranks 79th out of 905 lowa communities (11th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### Core preventive services for older men

Norwalk has a crude rate of 50.1% for older adult men aged >=65 years who are up to date on a core set of clinical preventive services: flu shot past year, ppv shot ever, colorectal cancer screening, which ranks 73rd out of 958 lowa communities (7th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 51.3%, which ranks 46th out of 905 lowa communities (7th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### Core preventive services for older women

Norwalk has a crude rate of 41.7% for older adult women aged >=65 years who are up to date on a core set of clinical preventive services: flu shot past year, ppv shot ever, colorectal cancer screening, and mammogram past 2 years, which ranks 271st out of 958 lowa communities (14th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 43.3%, which ranks 185th out of 905 lowa communities (16th out of 31 mid-large communities).



#### **Dental Visit**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 71.1% for visits to dentist or dental clinic among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 149th out of 958 lowa communities (11th out of 31 midlarge communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 71.5%, which ranks 107th out of 905 lowa communities (11th out of 31 mid-large communities).



# **Mammography**

Norwalk has a crude rate of 78.8% for mammography use among women aged 50–74 years, which ranks 128th out of 958 lowa communities (13th out of 31 mid-large communities). The age-adjusted rate for Norwalk is 76.8%, which ranks 103rd out of 905 lowa communities (11th out of 31 mid-large communities).

# **Disability**















# **Appendix 1: CDC PLACES Data**

This report uses a novel dataset from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) called PLACES: Local Data for Better Health. The PLACES dataset uses small area estimation methods to provide estimates of health measures for counties, places, census tracts, and zip code tabulation areas. The estimates are created with a multilevel statistical modeling framework that utilizes CDC's Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), Census population counts, and American Community Survey demographic and socioeconomic data.
