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Health in Palo: Overview

Dear Community Members & Stakeholders of Palo,

We are pleased to share the Iowa Community Health Snapshot series, a set of reports designed in partnership with Iowa State University's Community Economic Development to assess the overall landscape of health and well-being across Iowa. The following pages include the health snapshot for your community. The snapshot can be used to see how Palo ranks across various health measures compared to the rest of the state and similarly-sized communities. This comparison allows us to identify Palo's strengths and opportunities for growth by leveraging the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention PLACES dataset.

The report includes 37 health measures organized topically by general health status, risky behavior, health outcomes, prevention, and disability. We provide a general overview of each health topic, followed by a description of each health measure. Health measure descriptions include crude and age-adjusted rates and a ranking that tells you how your community ranks compared to all lowa communities and communities of similar size to Palo. Crude rates tell you the raw, un-adjusted percent of the population experiencing the health measure. Age-adjusted rates account for the age distribution present in your community and presents what the rate would be if your communities and age-adjusted rates can give a fairer comparison between communities and age-adjusted rates can give a fairer comparison between communities.

How to Use this Report

The purpose of the Iowa Community Health Snapshot Series is to provide an overview of health in Palo that can be used to help inform health-related interventions and programming. This report contains five sections, including the overall health status of Palo, a review of risky behaviors in the community, and information on various health outcomes, prevention measures, and disability needs. Each section includes an overview of the health domain, a breakdown of its underlying health measures, and data to see how Palo compares to the rest of the state and similarly-sized communities.

With a population of 1,162, Palo's similarly sized communities are defined as small communities. In Iowa, small communities have an average population of 1,553, and there are 138 communities that are considered small communities. To see all of the communities in this population group, please see Appendix 3 of this report.

Using Ames, IA as an Example

The graphic below is an example of the details included for each health measure. The table in the upper right shows your community's crude and age-adjusted rate estimates alongside their averages across all lowa communities and similarly-sized communities. The images below show the distribution of the health measure across communities. The vertical lines correspond with the values in the table to show the estimate for the specific community compared to communities across the state. The solid black line in each plot represents the community rate, with the dashed lines indicating the average rate for all lowa communities and the dotted lines showing the average rate for similarly-sized communities.



The example graphic above displays the poor mental health rate in Ames, Iowa. The left plot shows the crude rate of poor mental health in the community. Crude rates are the raw, un-adjusted percent of the population experiencing the health measure. Notice how the solid black line is closer to the right of the plot than the dashed and dotted lines; this indicates that Ames has a higher crude rate of poor mental health than most communities in the state. However, the age-adjusted rate plot on the right shows the solid line closer to the peak of the distribution and averages for the state and similarly-sized communities, indicating that when accounting for Ames's unique age distribution, Ames's poor mental health rate is not a significant outlier, and is estimated to be lower than the statewide average. Accounting for crude and age-adjusted rates is critical to help inform health interventions as age-adjusted rates can help contextualize the health measure within the population.

Health Status


This section reflects measures for overall health, including general, physical, and mental health. These measures are a valuable way to see a simple summary of the health of a country's population. The questions to calculate these measures ask respondents to evaluate their health status. General health is evaluated on a 5-point scale where respondents can report their health status as one of "excellent," "very good," "good," "fair," or "poor," from which the respondents who answer "fair" or "poor" are included in the measure. Physical and mental health are evaluated as the rate of respondents who say they have had 14 or more days in the last 30 days in which their physical or mental health was not good. Poor General Health

Palo has a crude rate of 9.0% for fair or poor self-rated health status among adults aged >= 18 years, which ranks 14th out of 958 lowa communities (5th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 9.3%, which ranks 19th out of 905 lowa communities (5th out of 138 small communities).



Poor Physical Health

Palo has a crude rate of 7.7% for physical health not good for >=14 days among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 18th out of 958 lowa communities (5th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 7.8%, which ranks 30th out of 905 lowa communities (6th out of 138 small communities).



Poor Mental Health

Palo has a crude rate of 14.1% for mental health not good for >=14 days among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 390th out of 958 lowa communities (68th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 13.6%, which ranks 28th out of 905 lowa communities (7th out of 138 small communities).

Health Risk Behaviors


Health risk measures are measures of individual behaviors that can lead to poor health outcomes. These include binge drinking, current smoking, physical inactivity, and getting less than seven hours of nightly sleep. Risk behaviors are the most critical intervention points as they can help save lives and drastically improve health outcomes later in life. Each measure is calculated as the rate of respondents participating in a high level of risk behavior. The exact cutoff points for the behavior depend on the health area. Binge Drinking

Palo has a crude rate of 25.9% for binge drinking among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 954th out of 958 lowa communities (137th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 24.4%, which ranks 895th out of 905 lowa communities (136th out of 138 small communities).



Current Smoking

Palo has a crude rate of 14.8% for current smoking among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 153rd out of 958 lowa communities (29th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 13.4%, which ranks 45th out of 905 lowa communities (10th out of 138 small communities).



Palo has a crude rate of 17.7% for no leisure-time physical activity among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 14th out of 958 lowa communities (4th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 18.1%, which ranks 21st out of 905 lowa communities (7th out of 138 small communities).



Sleep <7 hours

Palo has a crude rate of 30.4% for sleeping less than 7 hours among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 498th out of 958 lowa communities (87th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 29.2%, which ranks 124th out of 905 lowa communities (23rd out of 138 small communities).

Health Outcomes



Health outcome measures include but are not limited to arthritis, high blood pressure, cancer, depression, and obesity. Arthritis

Palo has a crude rate of 18.2% for arthritis among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 12th out of 958 lowa communities (4th out of 138 small communities). The ageadjusted rate for Palo is 19.9%, which ranks 11th out of 905 lowa communities (2nd out of 138 small communities).



High Blood Pressure

Palo has a crude rate of 24.9% for high blood pressure among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 38th out of 958 lowa communities (10th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 26.9%, which ranks 342nd out of 905 lowa communities (62nd out of 138 small communities).



Palo has a crude rate of 5.4% for cancer (excluding skin cancer) among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 17th out of 958 lowa communities (5th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 6.4%, which ranks 74th out of 905 lowa communities (4th out of 138 small communities).











Palo has a crude rate of 6.1% for diagnosed diabetes among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 15th out of 958 lowa communities (5th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 6.7%, which ranks 18th out of 905 lowa communities (5th out of 138 small communities).



The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 29.0%, which ranks 167th out of 905 lowa communities (31st out of 138 small communities).











Palo has a crude rate of 5.6% for current lack of health insurance among adults aged 18–64 years, which ranks 40th out of 958 lowa communities (8th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 5.5%, which ranks 21st out of 905 lowa communities (6th out of 138 small communities).



Palo has a crude rate of 70.9% for taking medicine for high blood pressure control among adults aged >=18 years with high blood pressure, which ranks 940th out of 958 Iowa communities (134th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 58.0%, which ranks 758th out of 905 Iowa communities (111th out of 138 small communities).





The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 74.6%, which ranks 42nd out of 905 lowa communities (8th out of 138 small communities).





Palo has a crude rate of 76.9% for colorectal cancer screening among adults aged 50–75 years, which ranks 17th out of 958 lowa communities (3rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 77.2%, which ranks 4th out of 905 lowa communities (2nd out of 138 small communities).



Core preventive services for older men

Palo has a crude rate of 43.6% for older adult men aged >=65 years who are up to date on a core set of clinical preventive services: flu shot past year, ppv shot ever, colorectal cancer screening, which ranks 460th out of 958 lowa communities (71st out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 44.8%, which ranks 332nd out of 905 lowa communities (62nd out of 138 small communities).



Core preventive services for older women

Palo has a crude rate of 47.1% for older adult women aged >=65 years who are up to date on a core set of clinical preventive services: flu shot past year, ppv shot ever, colorectal cancer screening, and mammogram past 2 years, which ranks 46th out of 958 lowa communities (6th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 46.1%, which ranks 68th out of 905 lowa communities (10th out of 138 small communities).



The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 74.1%, which ranks 36th out of 905 lowa communities (8th out of 138 small communities).





Palo has a crude rate of 4.3% for hearing disability among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 13th out of 958 lowa communities (4th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Palo is 5.2%, which ranks 41st out of 905 lowa communities (7th out of 138 small communities).












