

Health in Parkersburg: Overview

Dear Community Members & Stakeholders of Parkersburg,

We are pleased to share the Iowa Community Health Snapshot series, a set of reports designed in partnership with Iowa State University's Community Economic Development to assess the overall landscape of health and well-being across Iowa. The following pages include the health snapshot for your community. The snapshot can be used to see how Parkersburg ranks across various health measures compared to the rest of the state and similarly-sized communities. This comparison allows us to identify Parkersburg's strengths and opportunities for growth by leveraging the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention PLACES dataset.

The report includes 37 health measures organized topically by general health status, risky behavior, health outcomes, prevention, and disability. We provide a general overview of each health topic, followed by a description of each health measure. Health measure descriptions include crude and age-adjusted rates and a ranking that tells you how your community ranks compared to all lowa communities and communities of similar size to Parkersburg. Crude rates tell you the raw, un-adjusted percent of the population experiencing the health measure. Age-adjusted rates account for the age distribution present in your community and presents what the rate would be if your community had a standard age distribution. Crude rates can provide a general comparison between communities and age-adjusted rates can give a fairer comparison between communities with different age structures.

Take a look at the top strengths of your community! Below are unadjusted and age-adjusted health measures that represent your community's strengths. We recommend using continued investment in these areas to maintain them as strengths, as well as building on them to improve in other health domains.

How to Use this Report


The purpose of the Iowa Community Health Snapshot Series is to provide an overview of health in Parkersburg that can be used to help inform health-related interventions and programming. This report contains five sections, including the overall health status of Parkersburg, a review of risky behaviors in the community, and information on various health outcomes, prevention measures, and disability needs. Each section includes an overview of the health domain, a breakdown of its underlying health measures, and data to see how Parkersburg compares to the rest of the state and similarly-sized communities.

With a population of 1,738, Parkersburg's similarly sized communities are defined as small communities. In lowa, small communities have an average population of 1,553, and there are 138 communities that are considered small communities. To see all of the communities in this population group, please see Appendix 3 of this report.

Using Ames, IA as an Example

The graphic below is an example of the details included for each health measure. The table in the upper right shows your community's crude and age-adjusted rate estimates alongside their averages across all lowa communities and similarly-sized communities. The images below show the distribution of the health measure across communities. The vertical lines correspond with the values in the table to show the estimate for the specific community compared to communities across the state. The solid black line in each plot represents the community rate, with the dashed lines indicating the average rate for all lowa communities and the dotted lines showing the average rate for similarly-sized communities.



The example graphic above displays the poor mental health rate in Ames, lowa. The left plot shows the crude rate of poor mental health in the community. Crude rates are the raw, un-adjusted percent of the population experiencing the health measure. Notice how the solid black line is closer to the right of the plot than the dashed and dotted lines; this indicates that Ames has a higher crude rate of poor mental health than most communities in the state. However, the age-adjusted rate plot on the right shows the solid line closer to the peak of the distribution and averages for the state and similarly-sized communities, indicating that when accounting for Ames's unique age distribution, Ames's poor mental health rate is not a significant outlier, and is estimated to be lower than the statewide average. Accounting for crude and age-adjusted rates is critical to help inform health interventions as age-adjusted rates can help contextualize the health measure within the population.

Health Status


This section reflects measures for overall health, including general, physical, and mental health. These measures are a valuable way to see a simple summary of the health of a country's population. The questions to calculate these measures ask respondents to evaluate their health status. General health is evaluated on a 5-point scale where respondents can report their health status as one of "excellent," "very good," "good," "fair," or "poor," from which the respondents who answer "fair" or "poor" are included in the measure. Physical and mental health are evaluated as the rate of respondents who say they have had 14 or more days in the last 30 days in which their physical or mental health was not good. Poor General Health

Parkersburg has a crude rate of 13.5% for fair or poor self-rated health status among adults aged >= 18 years, which ranks 346th out of 958 lowa communities (59th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 12.2%, which ranks 312th out of 905 lowa communities (61st out of 138 small communities).



Poor Physical Health

Parkersburg has a crude rate of 10.4% for physical health not good for >=14 days among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 354th out of 958 lowa communities (61st out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 9.5%, which ranks 342nd out of 905 lowa communities (64th out of 138 small communities).



Poor Mental Health

Parkersburg has a crude rate of 14.2% for mental health not good for >=14 days among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 432nd out of 958 lowa communities (78th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 15.5%, which ranks 405th out of 905 lowa communities (65th out of 138 small communities).

Health Risk Behaviors


Health risk measures are measures of individual behaviors that can lead to poor health outcomes. These include binge drinking, current smoking, physical inactivity, and getting less than seven hours of nightly sleep. Risk behaviors are the most critical intervention points as they can help save lives and drastically improve health outcomes later in life. Each measure is calculated as the rate of respondents participating in a high level of risk behavior. The exact cutoff points for the behavior depend on the health area. Binge Drinking

Parkersburg has a crude rate of 18.9% for binge drinking among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 370th out of 958 lowa communities (66th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 21.4%, which ranks 249th out of 905 lowa communities (38th out of 138 small communities).



Current Smoking

Parkersburg has a crude rate of 16.2% for current smoking among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 337th out of 958 lowa communities (73rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 16.8%, which ranks 296th out of 905 lowa communities (59th out of 138 small communities).



Physical Inactivity

Parkersburg has a crude rate of 25.8% for no leisure-time physical activity among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 429th out of 958 lowa communities (70th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 24.0%, which ranks 398th out of 905 lowa communities (73rd out of 138 small communities).



Sleep <7 hours

Parkersburg has a crude rate of 29.7% for sleeping less than 7 hours among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 331st out of 958 lowa communities (60th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 30.5%, which ranks 291st out of 905 lowa communities (47th out of 138 small communities).

Health Outcomes



Health outcome measures include but are not limited to arthritis, high blood pressure, cancer, depression, and obesity. Arthritis

Parkersburg has a crude rate of 27.9% for arthritis among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 479th out of 958 lowa communities (61st out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 23.1%, which ranks 426th out of 905 lowa communities (60th out of 138 small communities).



High Blood Pressure

Parkersburg has a crude rate of 31.9% for high blood pressure among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 455th out of 958 lowa communities (62nd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 27.0%, which ranks 368th out of 905 lowa communities (66th out of 138 small communities).



Cancer (except skin)

Parkersburg has a crude rate of 8.3% for cancer (excluding skin cancer) among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 544th out of 958 lowa communities (62nd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 6.5%, which ranks 418th out of 905 lowa communities (41st out of 138 small communities).



Current Asthma

Parkersburg has a crude rate of 9.3% for current asthma among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 405th out of 958 lowa communities (63rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 9.5%, which ranks 415th out of 905 lowa communities (54th out of 138 small communities).



Parkersburg has a crude rate of 6.4% for coronary heart disease among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 438th out of 958 lowa communities (60th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 4.8%, which ranks 257th out of 905 lowa communities (53rd out of 138 small communities).



The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 6.1%, which ranks 346th out of 905 lowa communities (66th out of 138 small communities).





Parkersburg has a crude rate of 9.9% for diagnosed diabetes among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 416th out of 958 lowa communities (63rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 8.1%, which ranks 401st out of 905 lowa communities (69th out of 138 small communities).



Parkersburg has a crude rate of 36.4% for high cholesterol among adults aged >=18 years who have been screened in the past 5 years, which ranks 498th out of 958 lowa communities (68th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 30.0%, which ranks 537th out of 905 lowa communities (85th out of 138 small communities).



Parkersburg has a crude rate of 3.2% for chronic kidney disease among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 446th out of 958 lowa communities (54th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 2.5%, which ranks 142nd out of 905 lowa communities (28th out of 138 small communities).



Parkersburg has a crude rate of 38.9% for obesity among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 675th out of 958 lowa communities (111th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 39.1%, which ranks 667th out of 905 lowa communities (106th out of 138 small communities).



Parkersburg has a crude rate of 3.2% for stroke among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 397th out of 958 lowa communities (51st out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 2.5%, which ranks 230th out of 905 lowa communities (43rd out of 138 small communities).



The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 12.1%, which ranks 314th out of 905 lowa communities (60th out of 138 small communities).

Prevention



Lack of Health Insurance

Parkersburg has a crude rate of 6.8% for current lack of health insurance among adults aged 18–64 years, which ranks 255th out of 958 lowa communities (44th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 7.1%, which ranks 234th out of 905 lowa communities (49th out of 138 small communities).



Taking BP Medication

Parkersburg has a crude rate of 79.7% for taking medicine for high blood pressure control among adults aged >=18 years with high blood pressure, which ranks 483rd out of 958 lowa communities (79th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 58.6%, which ranks 579th out of 905 lowa communities (89th out of 138 small communities).



Parkersburg has a crude rate of 83.7% for cervical cancer screening among adult women aged 21–65 years, which ranks 378th out of 958 lowa communities (63rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 83.5%, which ranks 354th out of 905 lowa communities (70th out of 138 small communities).



The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 72.5%, which ranks 468th out of 905 lowa communities (76th out of 138 small communities).



Parkersburg has a crude rate of 82.8% for cholesterol screening among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 433rd out of 958 lowa communities (72nd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 79.5%, which ranks 341st out of 905 lowa communities (63rd out of 138 small communities).



Parkersburg has a crude rate of 71.2% for colorectal cancer screening among adults aged 50–75 years, which ranks 530th out of 958 lowa communities (87th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 70.2%, which ranks 578th out of 905 lowa communities (102nd out of 138 small communities).



Core preventive services for older men

Parkersburg has a crude rate of 43.4% for older adult men aged >=65 years who are up to date on a core set of clinical preventive services: flu shot past year, ppv shot ever, colorectal cancer screening, which ranks 490th out of 958 lowa communities (74th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 44.0%, which ranks 395th out of 905 lowa communities (75th out of 138 small communities).



Core preventive services for older women

Parkersburg has a crude rate of 41.4% for older adult women aged >=65 years who are up to date on a core set of clinical preventive services: flu shot past year, ppv shot ever, colorectal cancer screening, and mammogram past 2 years, which ranks 288th out of 958 lowa communities (38th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 43.6%, which ranks 164th out of 905 lowa communities (37th out of 138 small communities).



Parkersburg has a crude rate of 70.1% for visits to dentist or dental clinic among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 206th out of 958 lowa communities (39th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 69.7%, which ranks 197th out of 905 lowa communities (35th out of 138 small communities).



Parkersburg has a crude rate of 74.8% for mammography use among women aged 50–74 years, which ranks 716th out of 958 lowa communities (102nd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 72.7%, which ranks 655th out of 905 lowa communities (100th out of 138 small communities).

Disability



Parkersburg has a crude rate of 7.4% for hearing disability among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 470th out of 958 lowa communities (59th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 5.8%, which ranks 287th out of 905 lowa communities (63rd out of 138 small communities).



The age-adjusted rate for Parkersburg is 3.4%, which ranks 295th out of 905 lowa communities (55th out of 138 small communities).





The PLACES dataset uses small area estimation methods to provide estimates of health measures for counties, places, census tracts, and zip code tabulation areas. The estimates are created with a multilevel statistical modeling framework that utilizes CDC's Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), Census population counts, and American Community Survey demographic and socioeconomic data.
