# Health in Treynor: Overview

Dear Community Members & Stakeholders of Treynor,

We are pleased to share the Iowa Community Health Snapshot series, a set of reports designed in partnership with Iowa State University's Community Economic Development to assess the overall landscape of health and well-being across Iowa. The following pages include the health snapshot for your community. The snapshot can be used to see how Treynor ranks across various health measures compared to the rest of the state and similarly-sized communities. This comparison allows us to identify Treynor's strengths and opportunities for growth by leveraging the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention PLACES dataset.

The report includes 37 health measures organized topically by general health status, risky behavior, health outcomes, prevention, and disability. We provide a general overview of each health topic, followed by a description of each health measure. Health measure descriptions include crude and age-adjusted rates and a ranking that tells you how your community ranks compared to all Iowa communities and communities of similar size to Treynor. Crude rates tell you the raw, un-adjusted percent of the population experiencing the health measure. Age-adjusted rates account for the age distribution present in your community and presents what the rate would be if your community had a standard age distribution. Crude rates can provide a general comparison between communities and age-adjusted rates can give a fairer comparison between communities with different age structures.

Take a look at the top strengths of your community! Below are unadjusted and age-adjusted health measures that represent your community's strengths. We recommend using continued investment in these areas to maintain them as strengths, as well as building on them to improve in other health domains.

## How to Use this Report

The purpose of the Iowa Community Health Snapshot Series is to provide an overview of health in Treynor that can be used to help inform health-related interventions and programming. This report contains five sections, including the overall health status of Treynor, a review of risky behaviors in the community, and information on various health outcomes, prevention measures, and disability needs. Each section includes an overview of the health domain, a breakdown of its underlying health measures, and data to see how Treynor compares to the rest of the state and similarly-sized communities.

With a population of 1,071, Treynor’s similarly sized communities are defined as small communities. In Iowa, small communities have an average population of 1,553, and there are 138 communities that are considered small communities. To see all of the communities in this population group, please see Appendix 3 of this report.

Using Ames, IA as an Example

The graphic below is an example of the details included for each health measure. The table in the upper right shows your community’s crude and age-adjusted rate estimates alongside their averages across all Iowa communities and similarly-sized communities. The images below show the distribution of the health measure across communities. The vertical lines correspond with the values in the table to show the estimate for the specific community compared to communities across the state. The solid black line in each plot represents the community rate, with the dashed lines indicating the average rate for all Iowa communities and the dotted lines showing the average rate for similarly-sized communities.



# Health Status

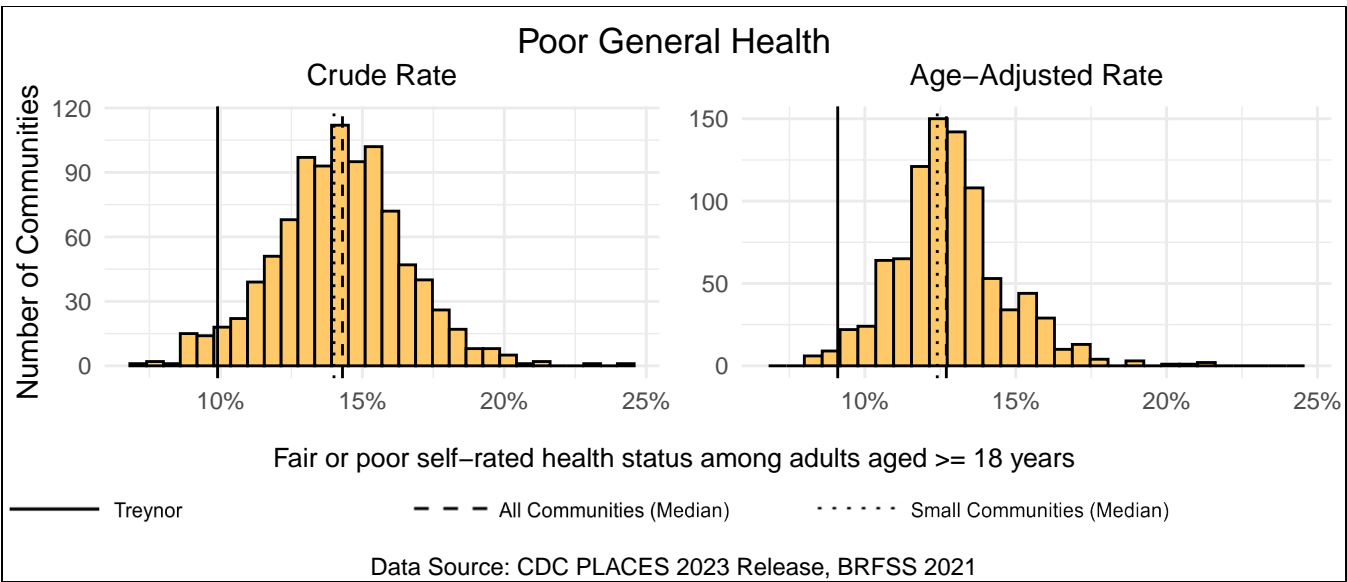
This section reflects measures for overall health, including general, physical, and mental health. These measures are a valuable way to see a simple summary of the health of a country’s population. The questions to calculate these measures ask respondents to evaluate their health status. General health is evaluated on a 5-point scale where respondents can report their health status as one of “excellent,” “very good,” “good,” “fair,” or “poor,” from which the respondents who answer “fair” or “poor” are included in the measure. Physical and mental health are evaluated as the rate of respondents who say they have had 14 or more days in the last 30 days in which their physical or mental health was not good. ## Poor General Health

Treynor has a crude rate of 9.9% for fair or poor self-rated health status among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 37th out of 958 Iowa communities (9th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 9.1%, which ranks 15th out of 905 Iowa communities (4th out of 138 small communities).

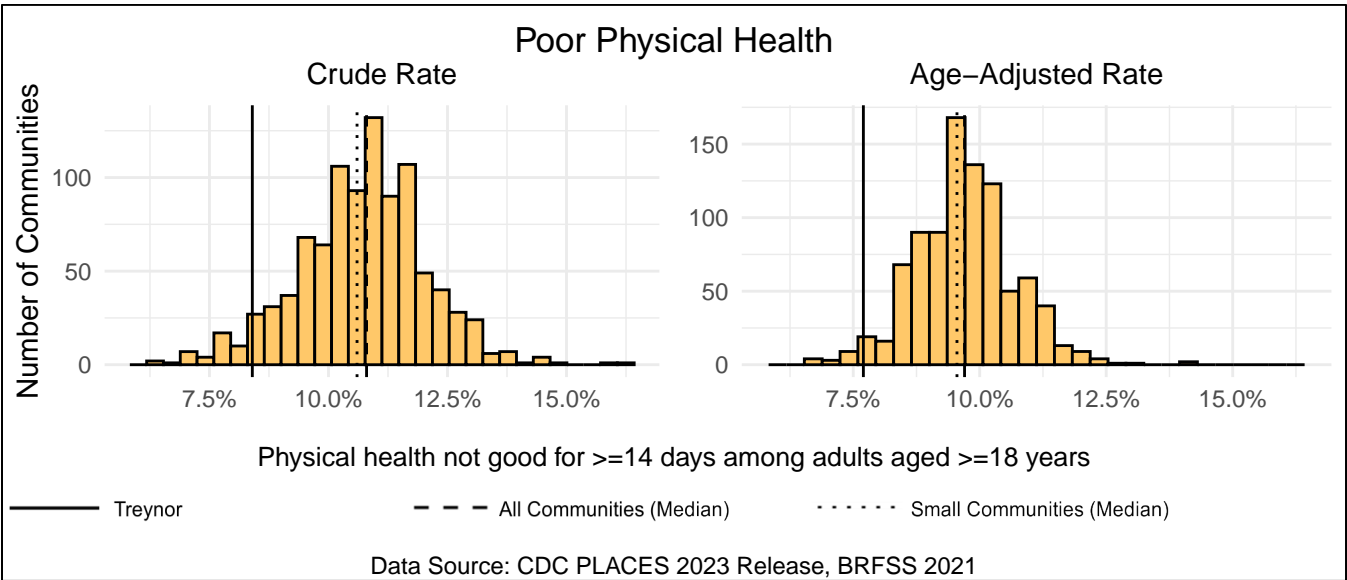




# Poor Physical Health

Treynor has a crude rate of 8.4% for physical health not good for >=14 days among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 47th out of 958 Iowa communities (11th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 7.7%, which ranks 22nd out of 905 Iowa communities (4th out of 138 small communities).

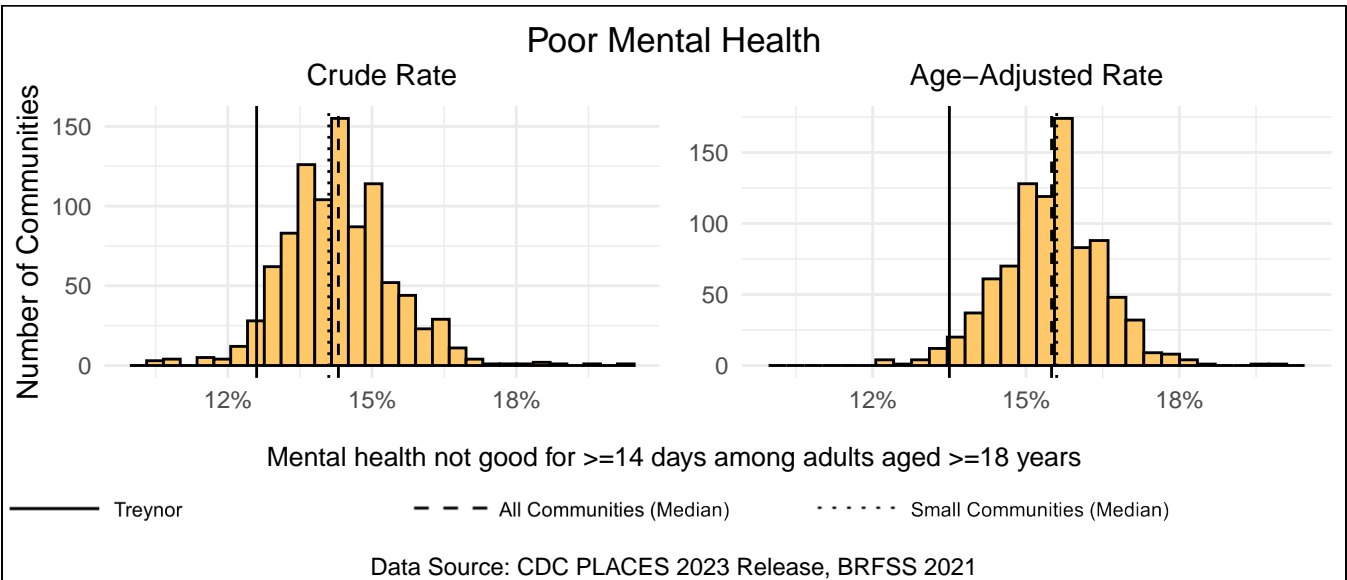

# Poor Mental Health

Treynor has a crude rate of 12.6% for mental health not good for >=14 days among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 39th out of 958 Iowa communities (3rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 13.5%, which ranks 22nd out of 905 Iowa communities (5th out of 138 small communities).

# Health Risk Behaviors

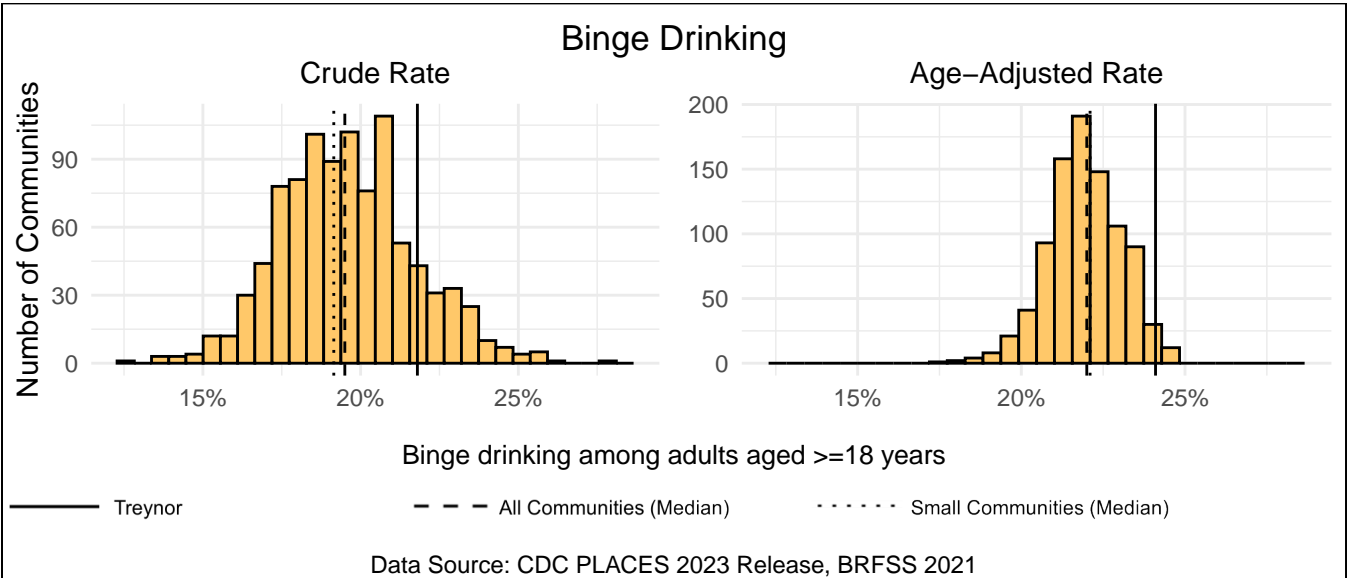
Health risk measures are measures of individual behaviors that can lead to poor health outcomes. These include binge drinking, current smoking, physical inactivity, and getting less than seven hours of nightly sleep. Risk behaviors are the most critical intervention points as they can help save lives and drastically improve health outcomes later in life. Each measure is calculated as the rate of respondents participating in a high level of risk behavior. The exact cutoff points for the behavior depend on the health area. ## Binge Drinking

Treynor has a crude rate of 21.8% for binge drinking among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 814th out of 958 Iowa communities (119th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 24.1%, which ranks 888th out of 905 Iowa communities (133rd out of 138 small communities).

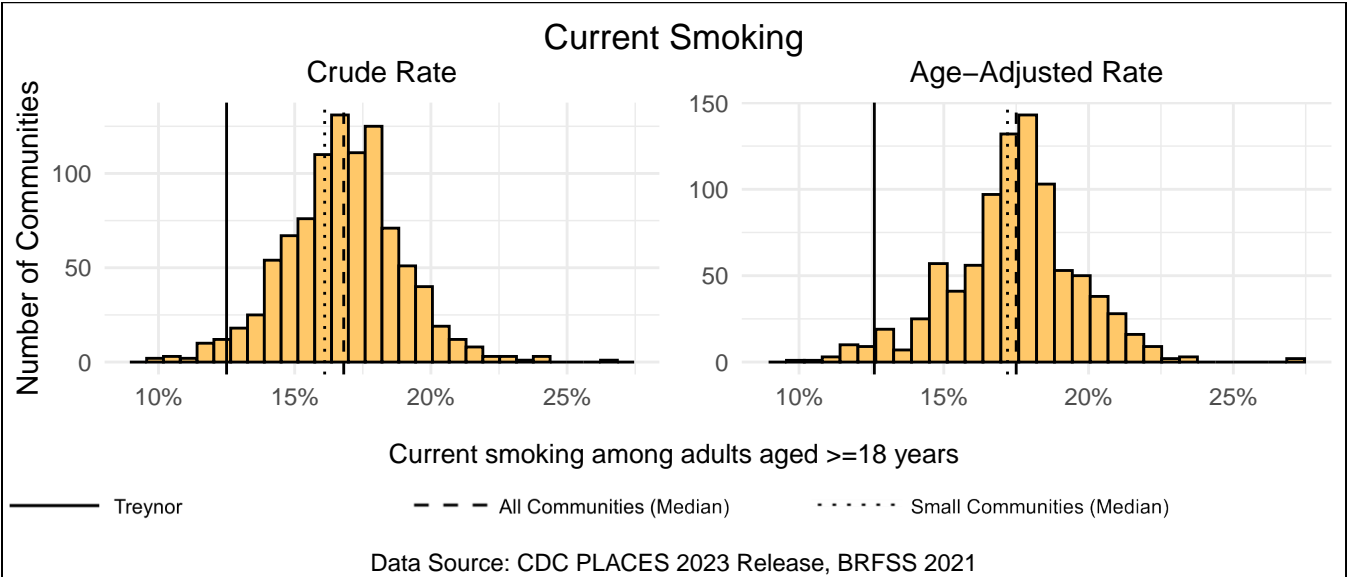

# Current Smoking

Treynor has a crude rate of 12.5% for current smoking among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 23rd out of 958 Iowa communities (4th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 12.6%, which ranks 24th out of 905 Iowa communities (5th out of 138 small communities).

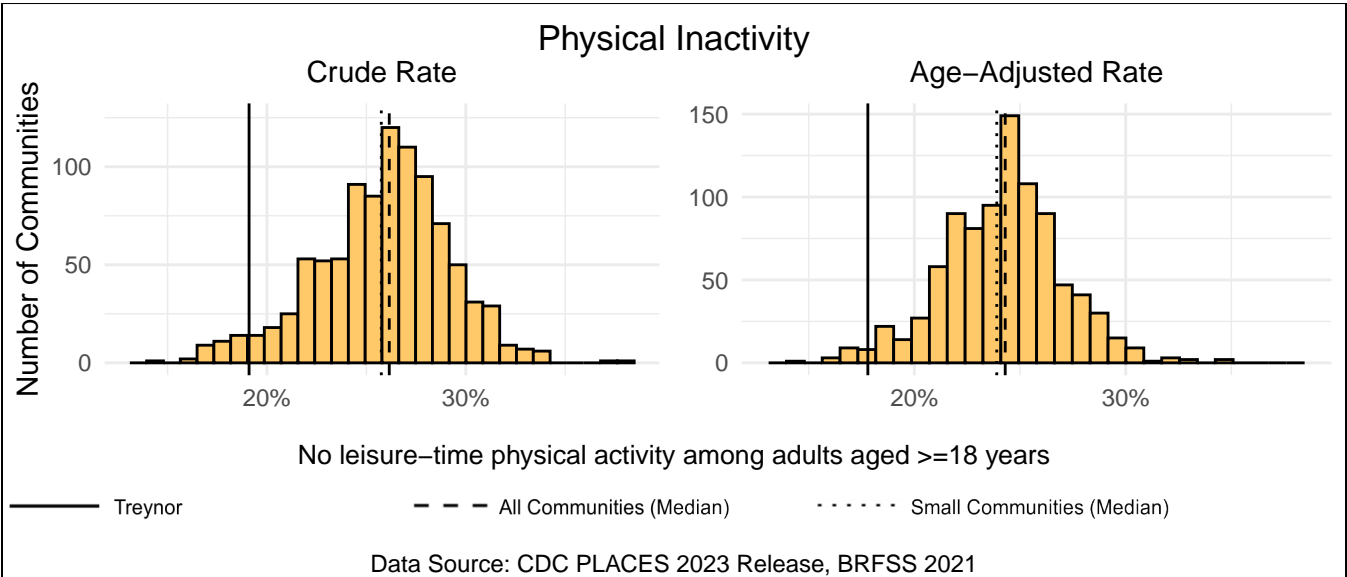

# Physical Inactivity

Treynor has a crude rate of 19.1% for no leisure-time physical activity among adults aged >=18 years, which ranks 38th out of 958 Iowa communities (11th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 17.8%, which ranks 17th out of 905 Iowa communities (6th out of 138 small communities).

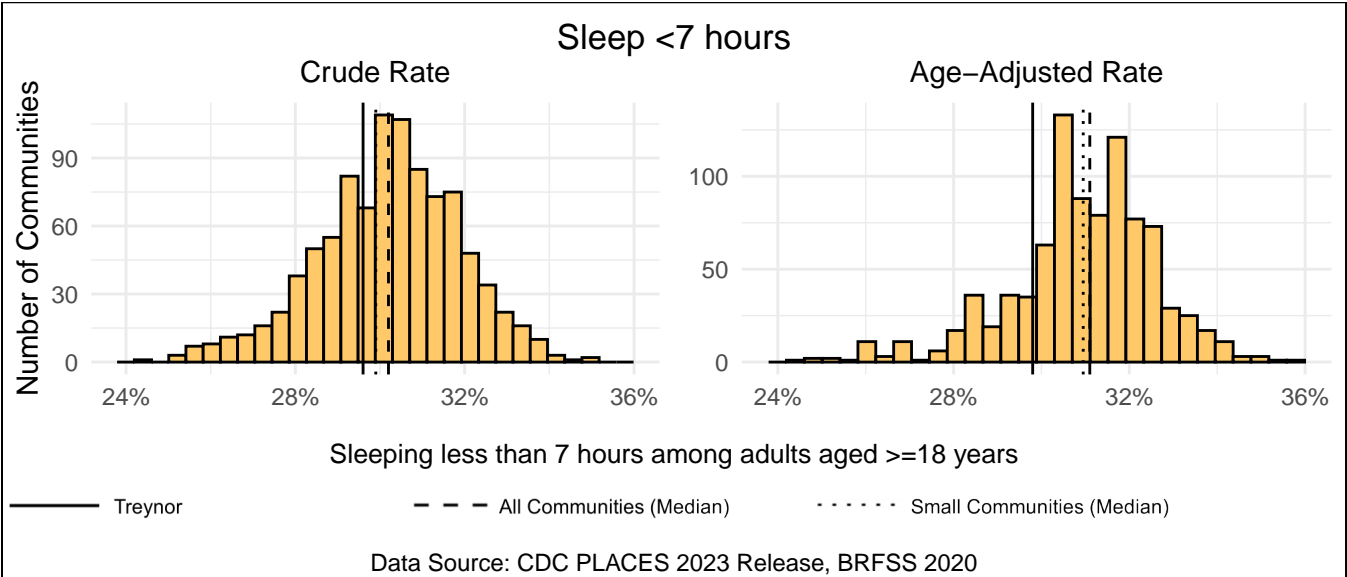

# Sleep <7 hours

Treynor has a crude rate of 29.6% for sleeping less than 7 hours among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 314th out of 958 Iowa communities (56th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 29.8%, which ranks 173rd out of 905 Iowa communities (38th out of 138 small communities).

# Health Outcomes

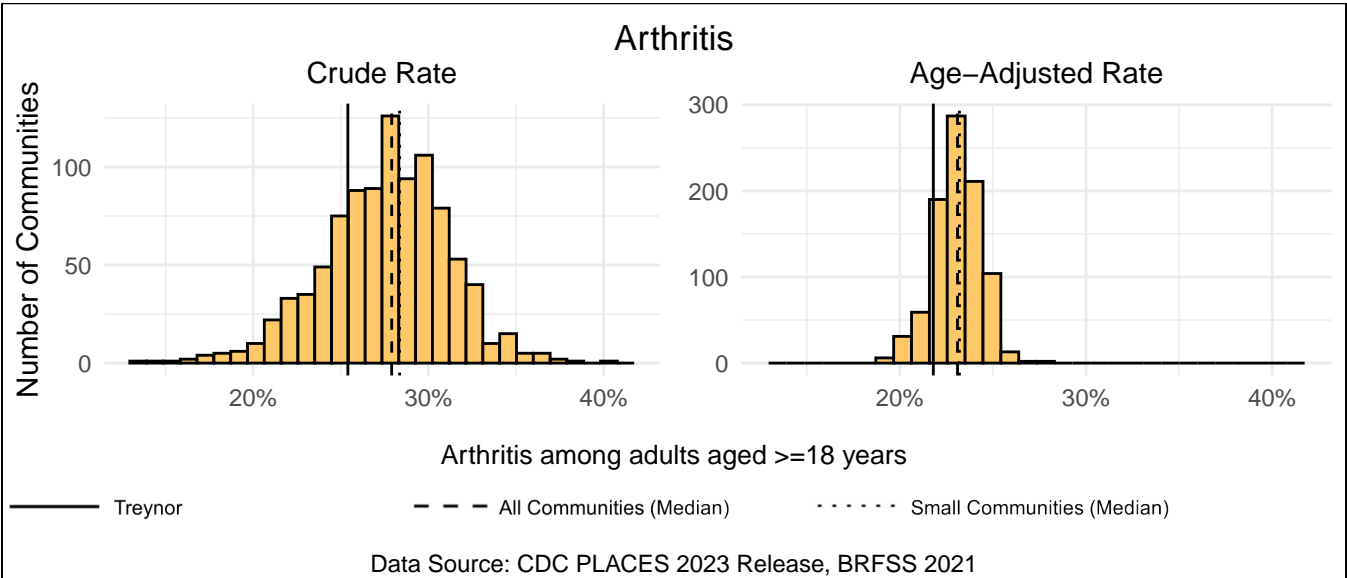
This section includes measures about specific health outcomes such as chronic illness, mental health conditions, and risk factors for future disease. Health outcome measures include but are not limited to arthritis, high blood pressure, cancer, depression, and obesity. ## Arthritis

Treynor has a crude rate of 25.4% for arthritis among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 231st out of 958 Iowa communities (34th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 21.8%, which ranks 124th out of 905 Iowa communities (23rd out of 138 small communities).

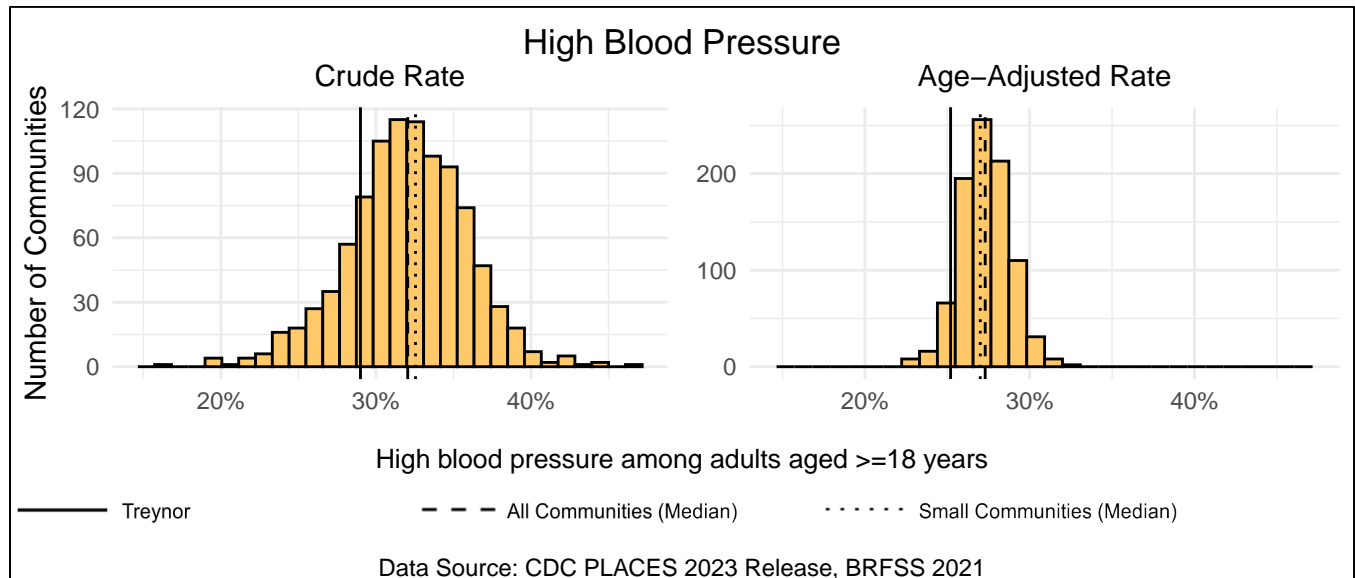

## High Blood Pressure

Treynor has a crude rate of 29.0% for high blood pressure among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 184th out of 958 Iowa communities (28th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 25.2%, which ranks 61st out of 905 Iowa communities (15th out of 138 small communities).

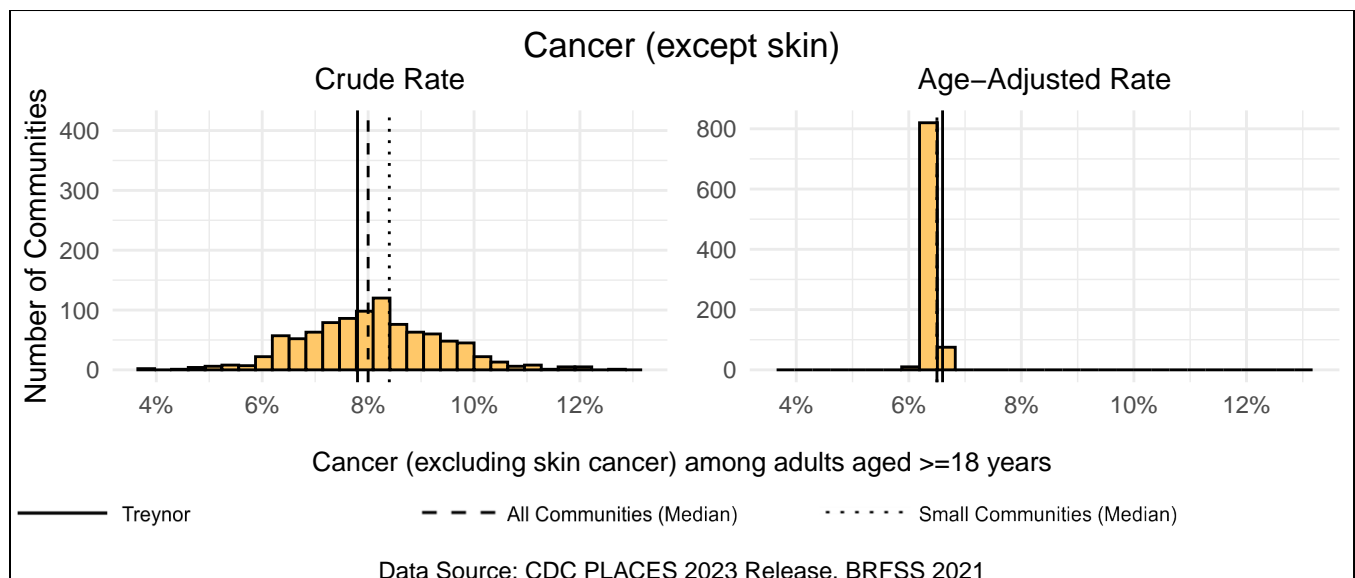

## Cancer (except skin)

Treynor has a crude rate of 7.8% for cancer (excluding skin cancer) among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 388th out of 958 Iowa communities (42nd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 6.6%, which ranks 831st out of 905 Iowa communities (126th out of 138 small communities).

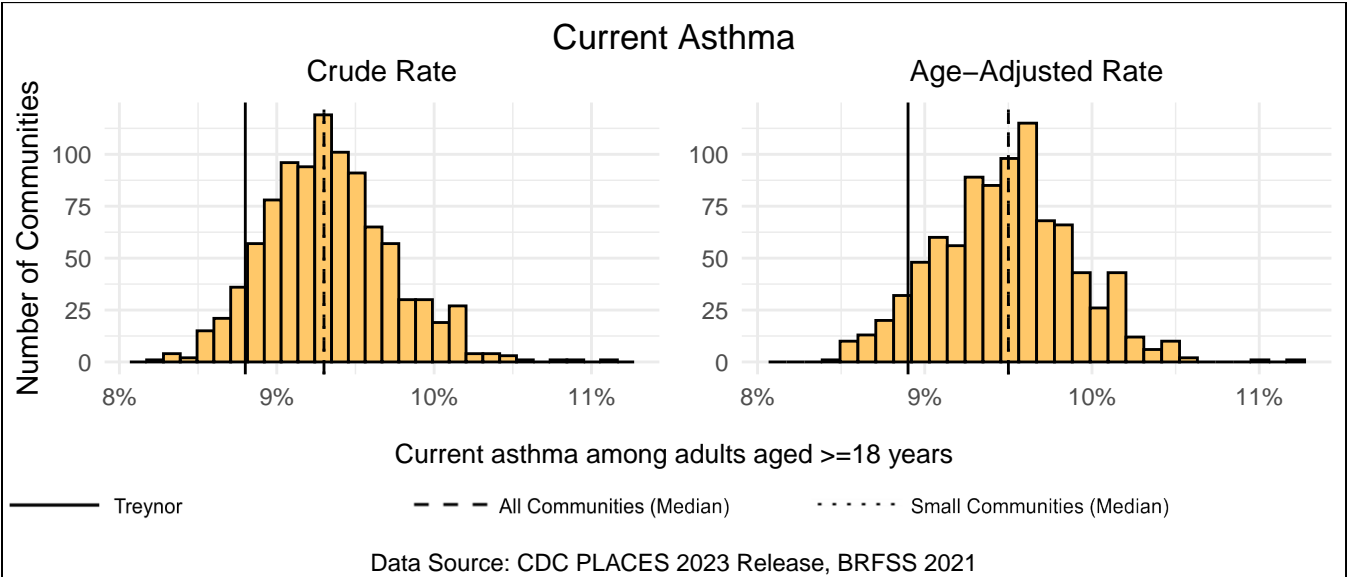

# Current Asthma

Treynor has a crude rate of 8.8% for current asthma among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 44th out of 958 Iowa communities (4th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 8.9%, which ranks 45th out of 905 Iowa communities (7th out of 138 small communities).

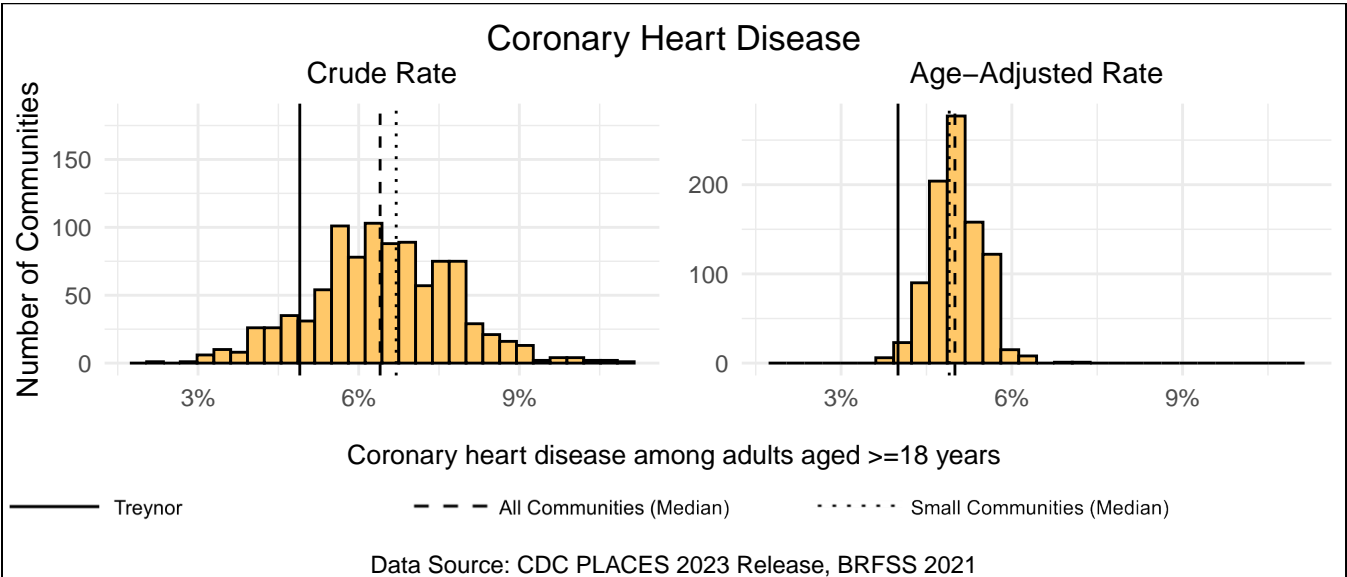

# Coronary Heart Disease

Treynor has a crude rate of 4.9% for coronary heart disease among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 114th out of 958 Iowa communities (20th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 4.0%, which ranks 7th out of 905 Iowa communities (1st out of 138 small communities).

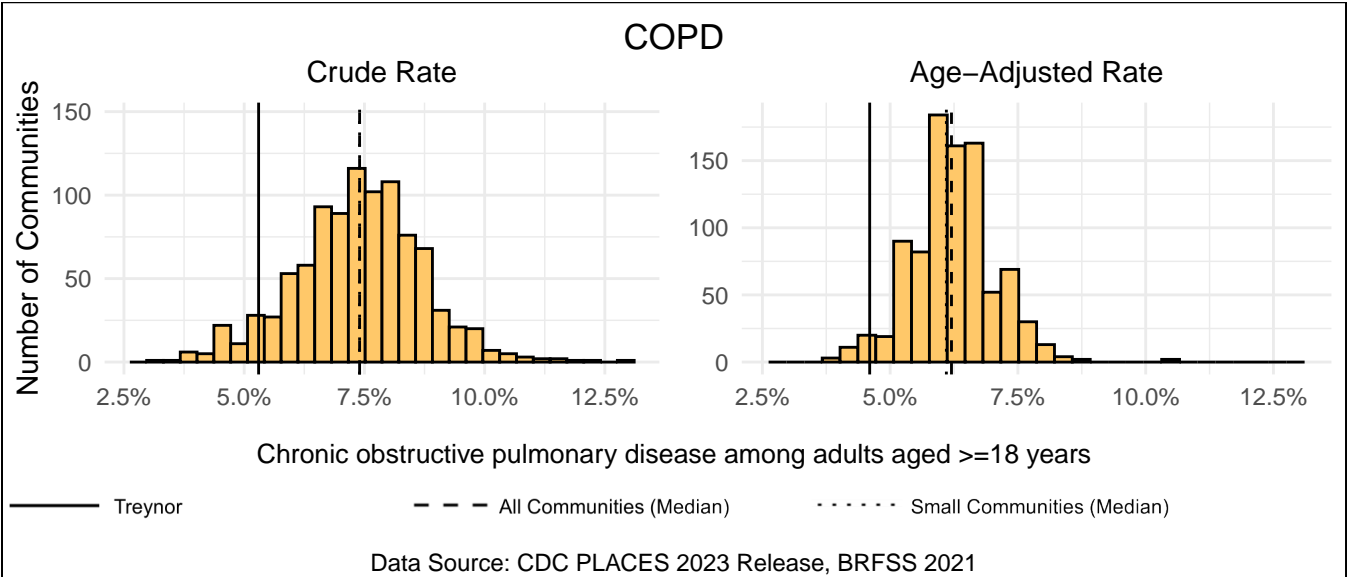

Treynor has a crude rate of 5.3% for chronic obstructive pulmonary disease among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 61st out of 958 Iowa communities (14th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 4.6%, which ranks 18th out of 905 Iowa communities (4th out of 138 small communities).

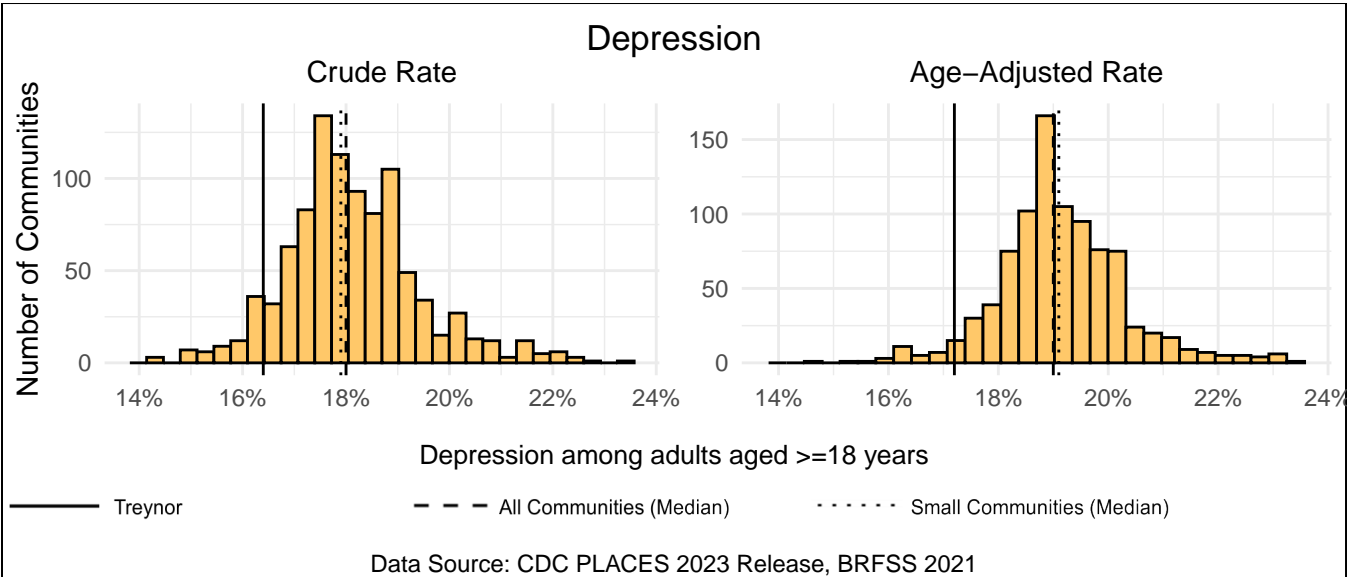

# Depression

Treynor has a crude rate of 16.4% for depression among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 65th out of 958 Iowa communities (10th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 17.2%, which ranks 34th out of 905 Iowa communities (6th out of 138 small communities).

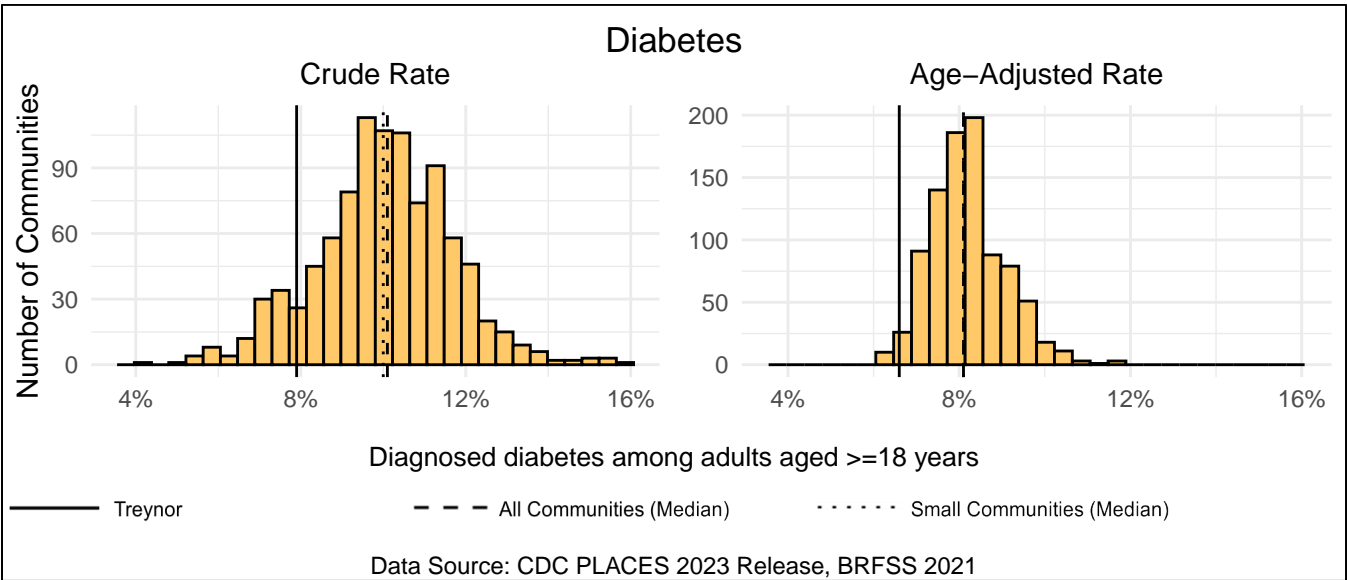




# Diabetes

Treynor has a crude rate of 7.9% for diagnosed diabetes among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 99th out of 958 Iowa communities (20th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 6.6%, which ranks 16th out of 905 Iowa communities (3rd out of 138 small communities).

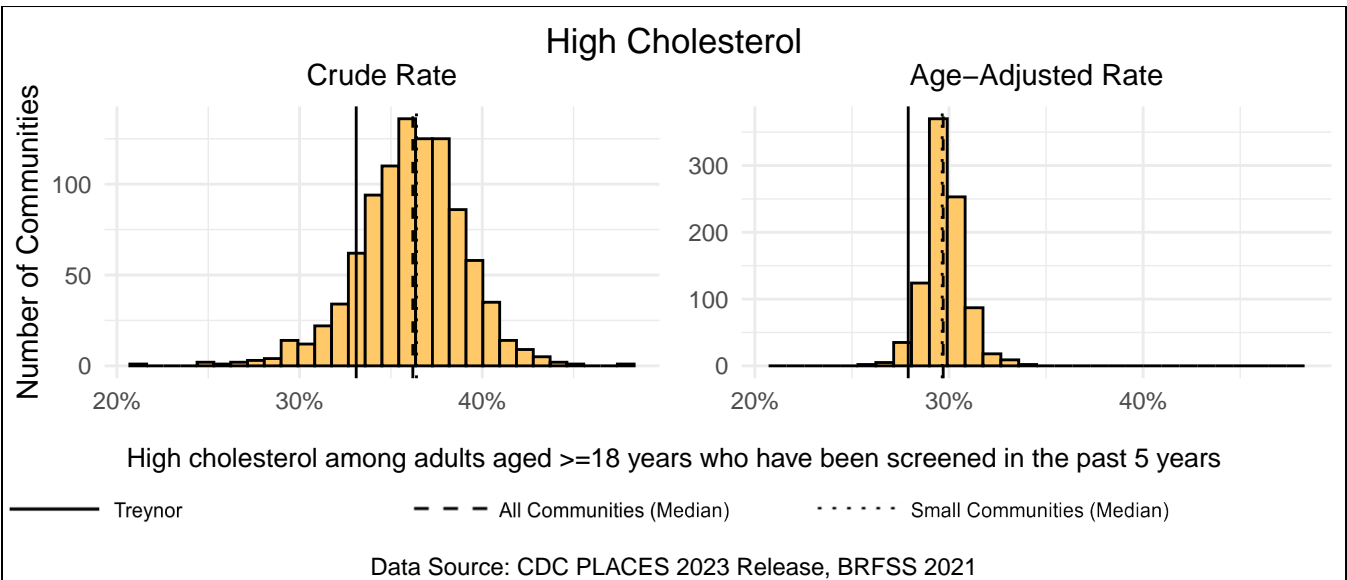

# High Cholesterol

Treynor has a crude rate of 33.1% for high cholesterol among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years who have been screened in the past 5 years, which ranks 119th out of 958 Iowa communities (24th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 27.9%, which ranks 28th out of 905 Iowa communities (7th out of 138 small communities).

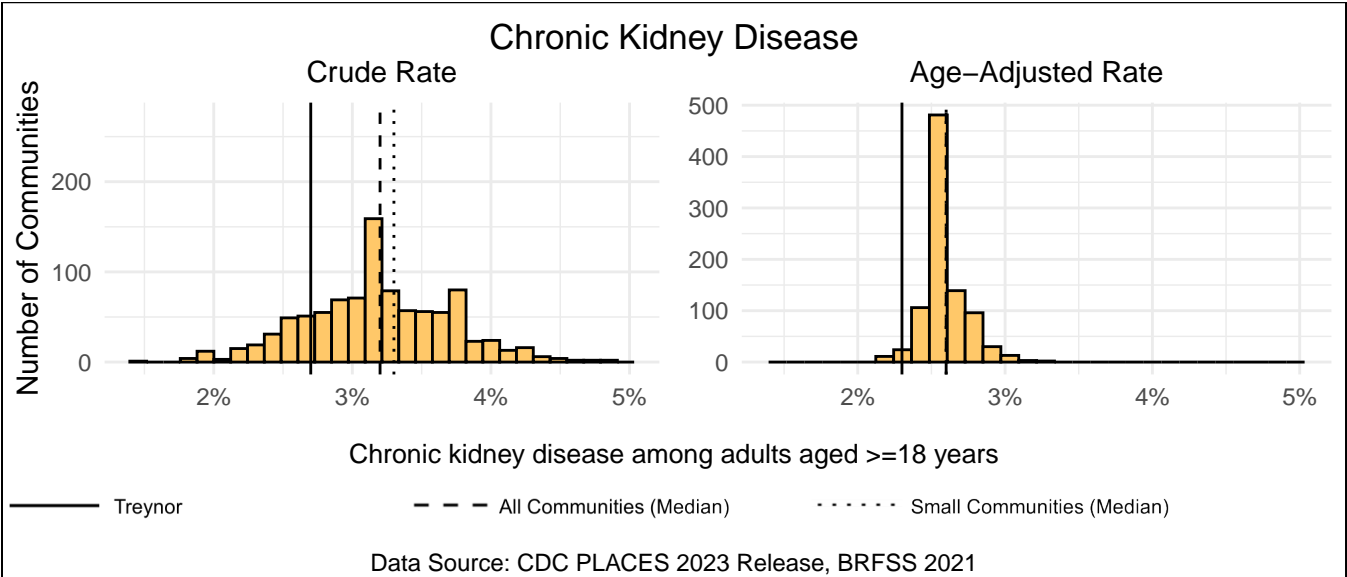

Treynor has a crude rate of 2.7% for chronic kidney disease among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 135th out of 958 Iowa communities (20th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 2.3%, which ranks 12th out of 905 Iowa communities (3rd out of 138 small communities).

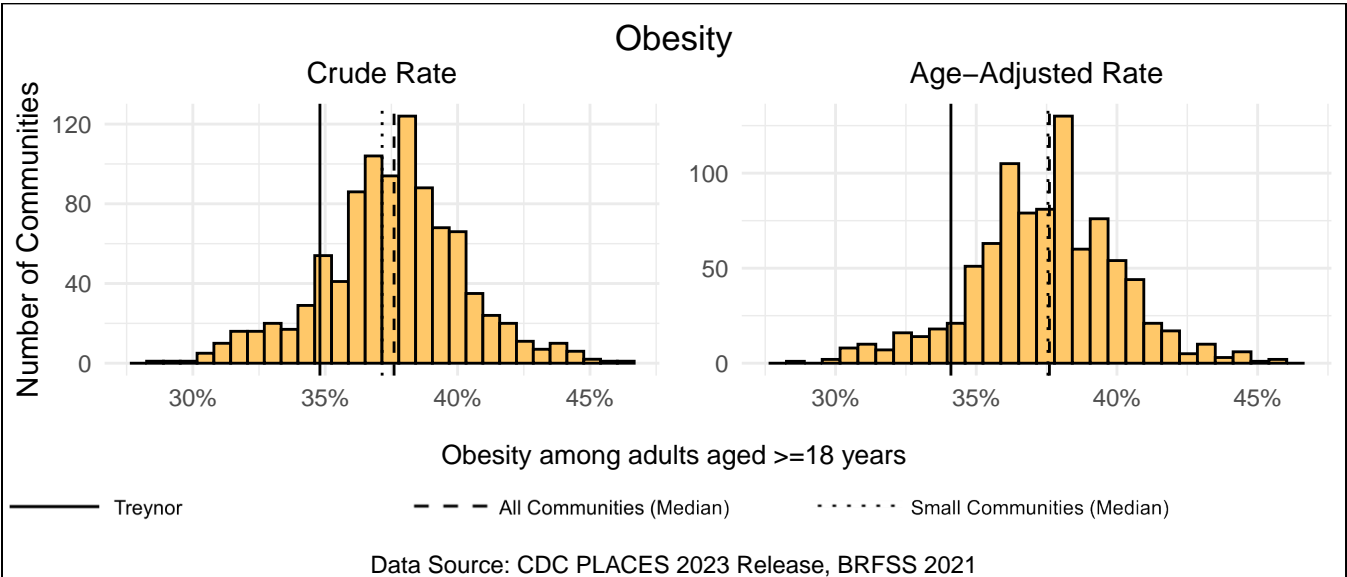

Treynor has a crude rate of 34.8% for obesity among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 123rd out of 958 Iowa communities (22nd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 34.1%, which ranks 78th out of 905 Iowa communities (11th out of 138 small communities).

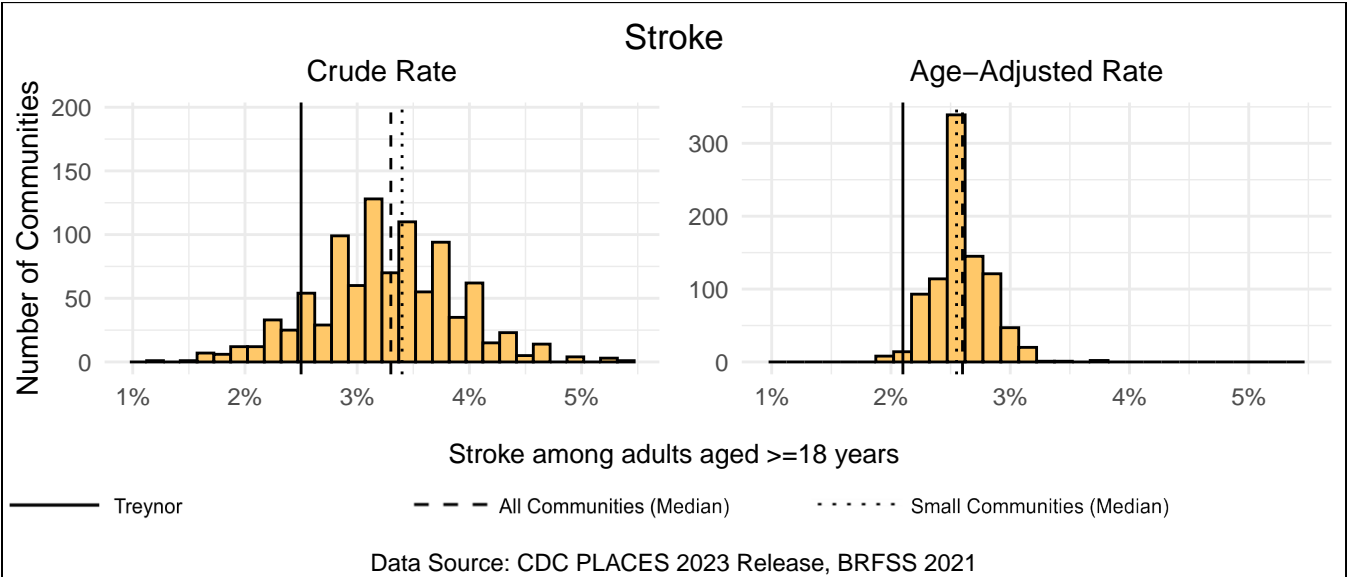

Treynor has a crude rate of 2.5% for stroke among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 98th out of 958 Iowa communities (20th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 2.1%, which ranks 9th out of 905 Iowa communities (2nd out of 138 small communities).

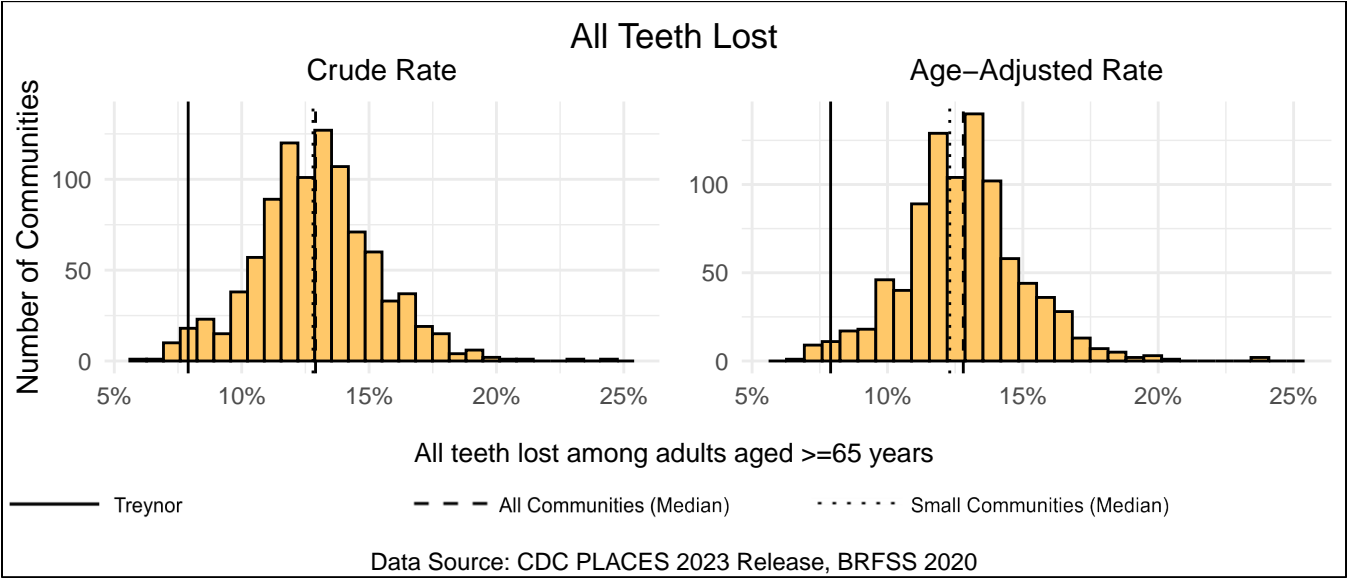

Treynor has a crude rate of 7.9% for all teeth lost among adults aged  $\geq 65$  years, which ranks 17th out of 958 Iowa communities (3rd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 7.9%, which ranks 15th out of 905 Iowa communities (3rd out of 138 small communities).

# Prevention

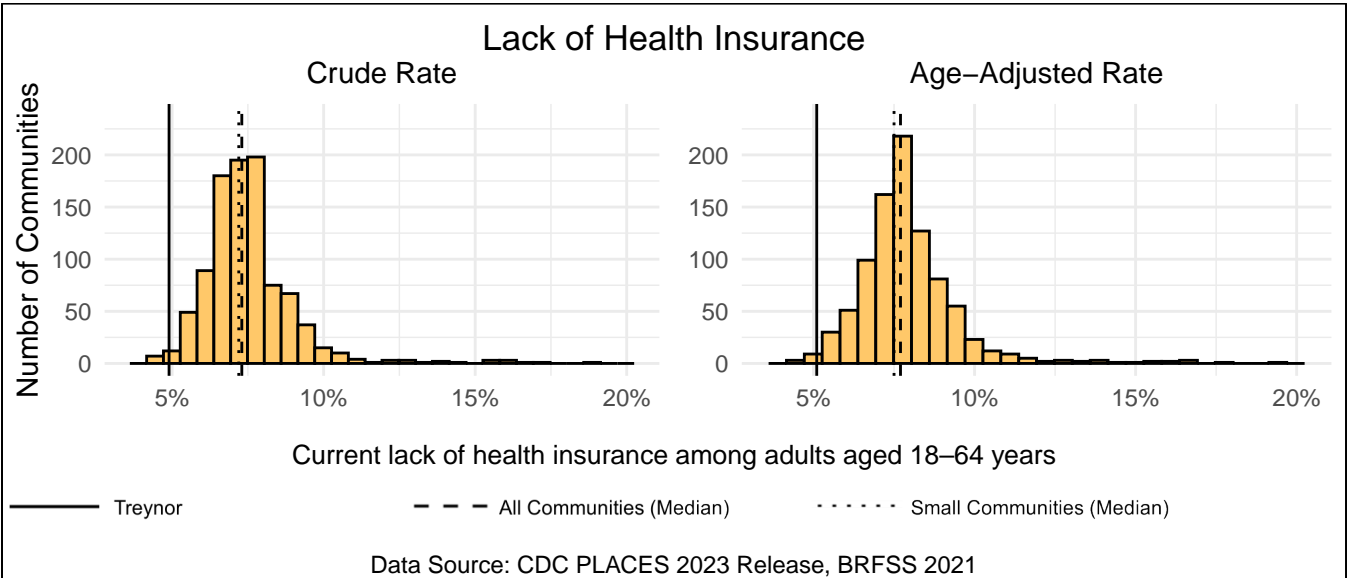

## Lack of Health Insurance

Treynor has a crude rate of 4.9% for current lack of health insurance among adults aged 18–64 years, which ranks 10th out of 958 Iowa communities (2nd out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 5.1%, which ranks 10th out of 905 Iowa communities (2nd out of 138 small communities).

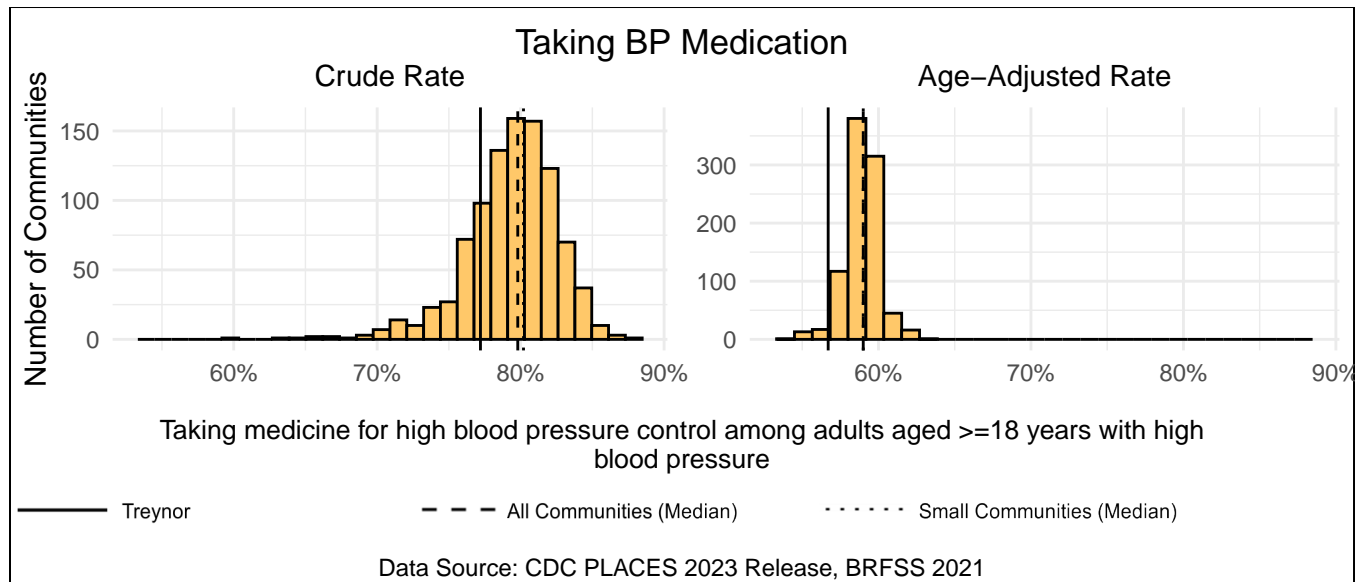

## Taking BP Medication

Treynor has a crude rate of 77.2% for taking medicine for high blood pressure control among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years with high blood pressure, which ranks 758th out of 958 Iowa communities (111th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 56.7%, which ranks 878th out of 905 Iowa communities (135th out of 138 small communities).

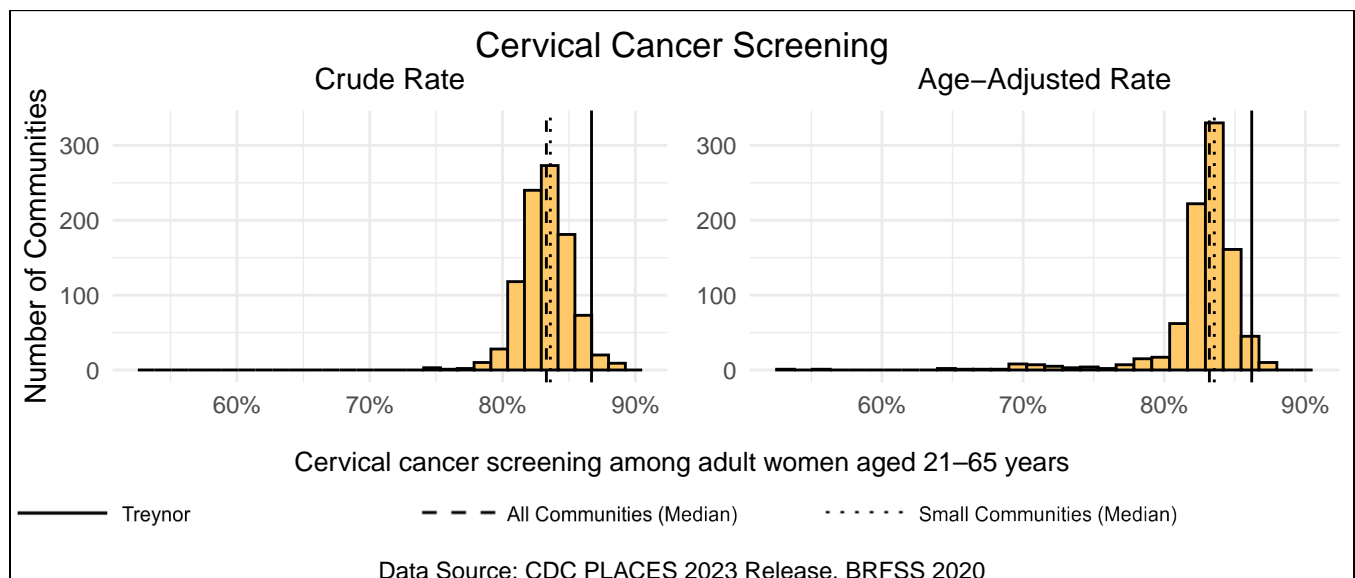

Treynor has a crude rate of 86.7% for cervical cancer screening among adult women aged 21–65 years, which ranks 30th out of 958 Iowa communities (8th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 86.2%, which ranks 19th out of 905 Iowa communities (6th out of 138 small communities).

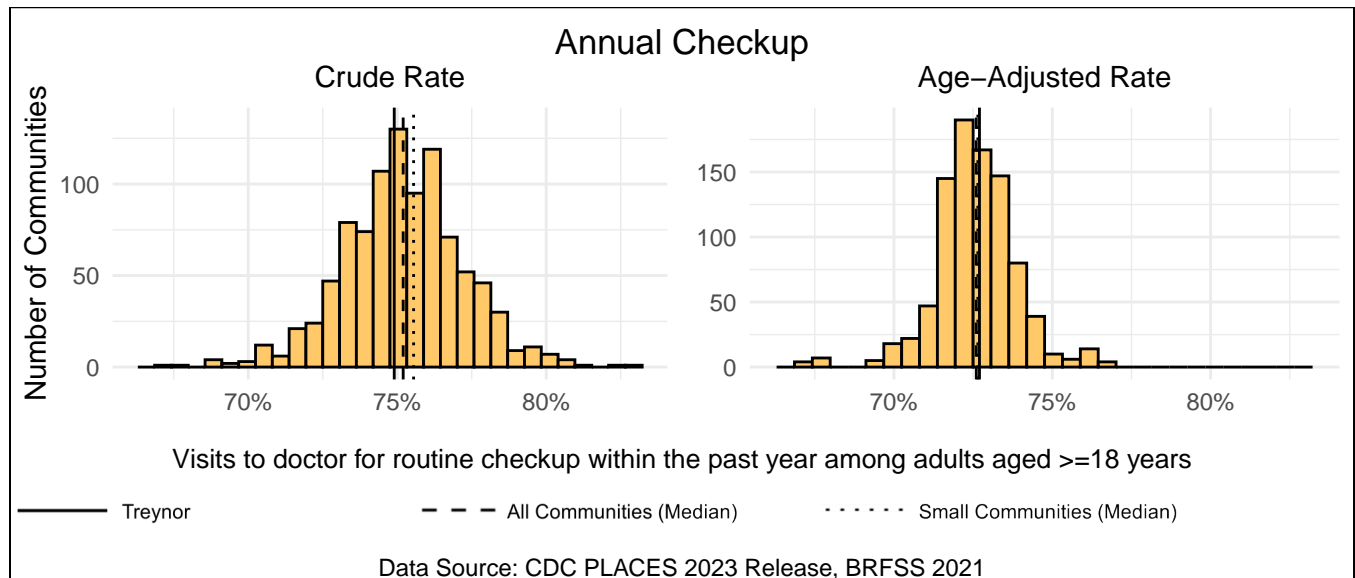

## Annual Checkup

Treynor has a crude rate of 74.9% for visits to doctor for routine checkup within the past year among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 543rd out of 958 Iowa communities (91st out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 72.7%, which ranks 396th out of 905 Iowa communities (64th out of 138 small communities).

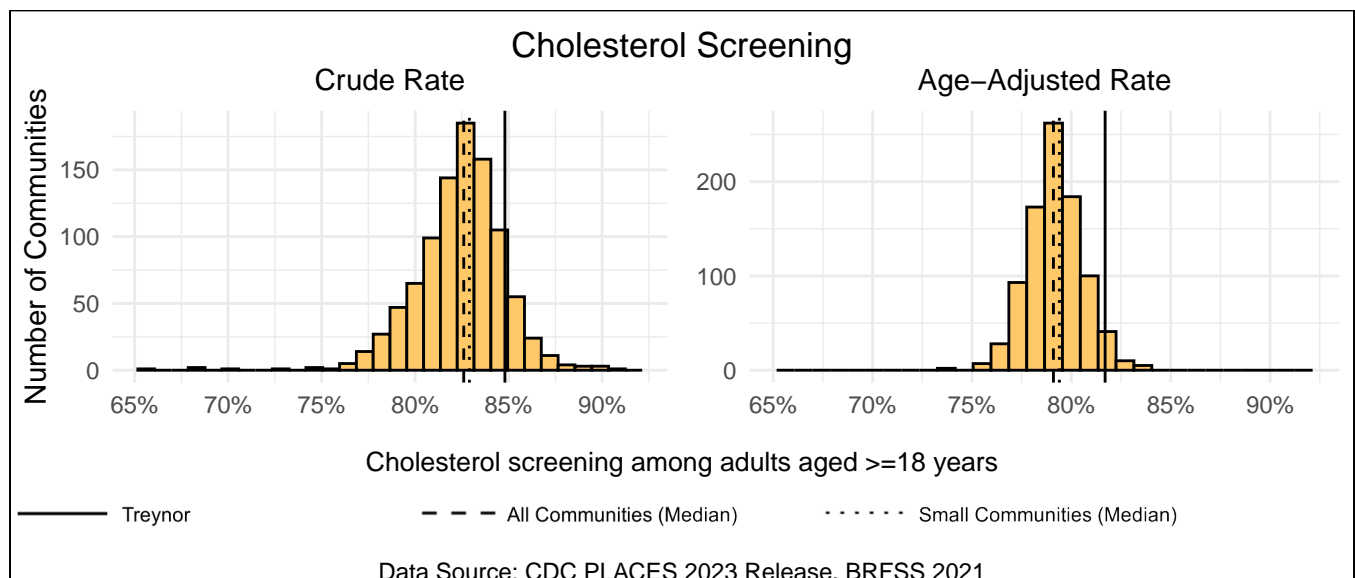

## Cholesterol Screening

Treynor has a crude rate of 84.8% for cholesterol screening among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 116th out of 958 Iowa communities (11th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 81.7%, which ranks 40th out of 905 Iowa communities (10th out of 138 small communities).

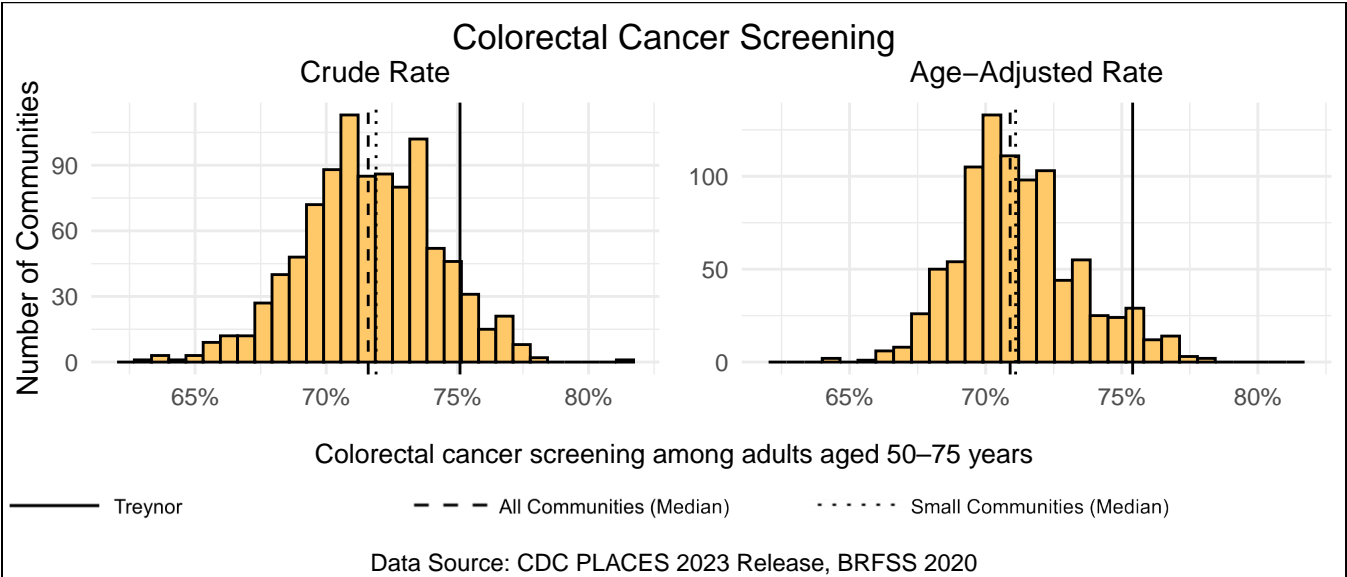

# Colorectal Cancer Screening

Treynor has a crude rate of 75.1% for colorectal cancer screening among adults aged 50–75 years, which ranks 79th out of 958 Iowa communities (15th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 75.4%, which ranks 47th out of 905 Iowa communities (14th out of 138 small communities).

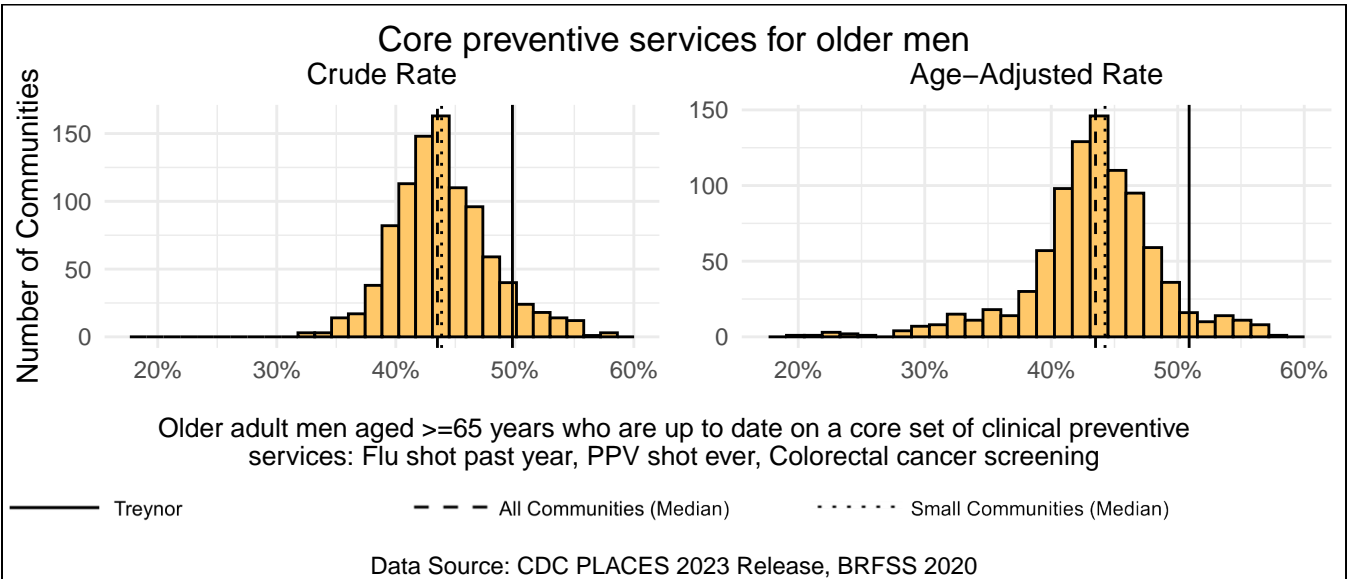

# Core preventive services for older men

Treynor has a crude rate of 49.8% for older adult men aged ≥65 years who are up to date on a core set of clinical preventive services: flu shot past year, ppv shot ever, colorectal cancer screening, which ranks 75th out of 958 Iowa communities (7th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 50.9%, which ranks 49th out of 905 Iowa communities (5th out of 138 small communities).

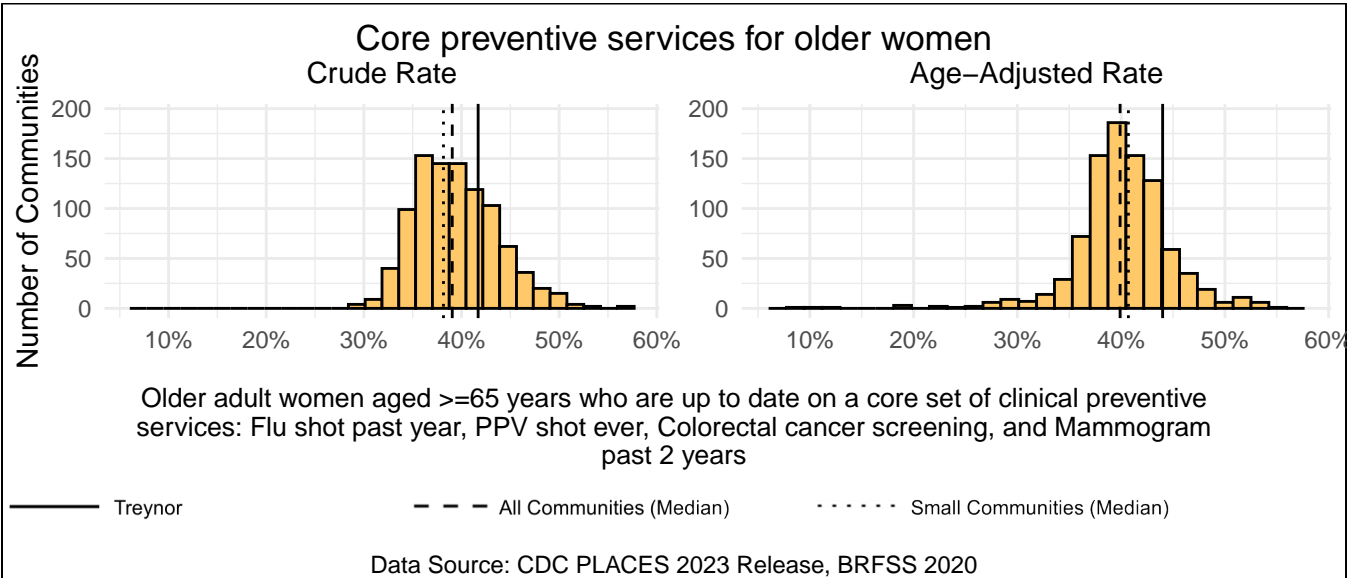

### Core preventive services for older women

Treynor has a crude rate of 41.7% for older adult women aged  $\geq 65$  years who are up to date on a core set of clinical preventive services: flu shot past year, ppv shot ever, colorectal cancer screening, and mammogram past 2 years, which ranks 271st out of 958 Iowa communities (34th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 44.0%, which ranks 133rd out of 905 Iowa communities (30th out of 138 small communities).

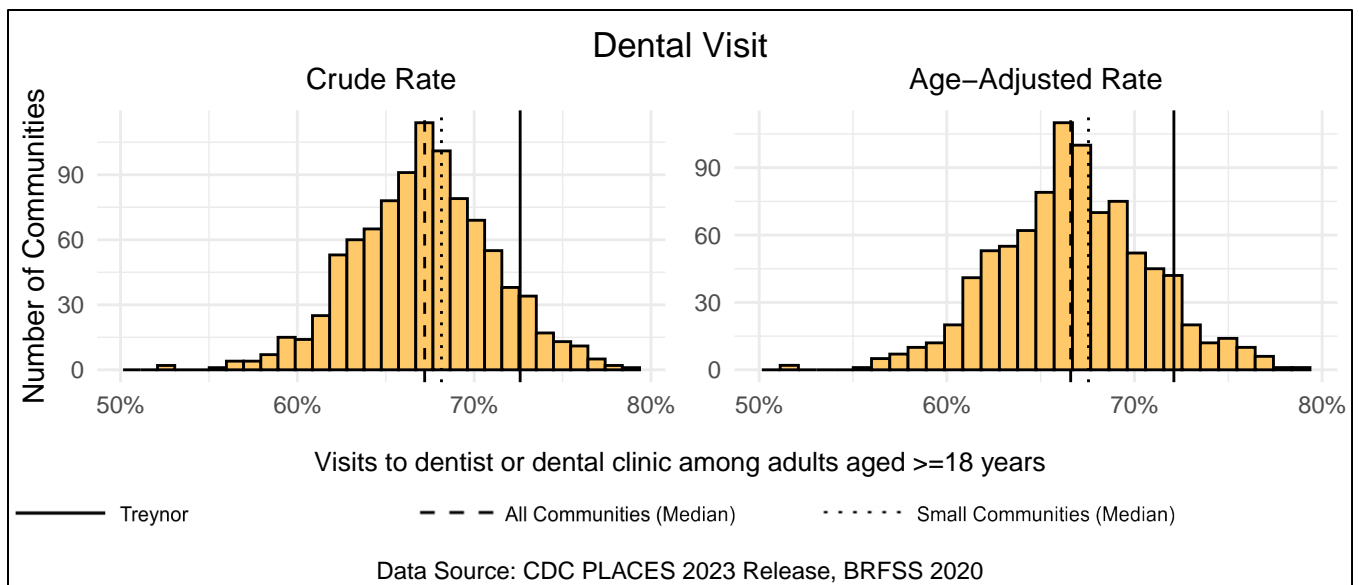


### Dental Visit

Treynor has a crude rate of 72.6% for visits to dentist or dental clinic among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 82nd out of 958 Iowa communities (14th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 72.1%, which ranks 76th out of 905 Iowa communities (17th out of 138 small communities).

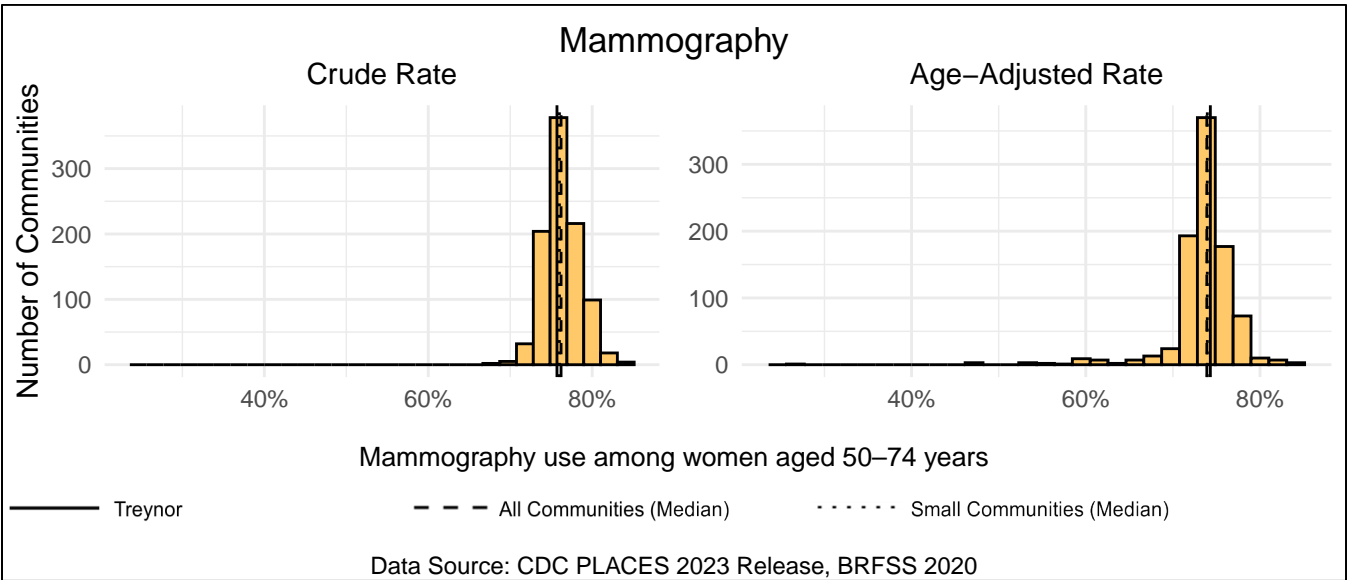




# Mammography

Treynor has a crude rate of 75.7% for mammography use among women aged 50–74 years, which ranks 573rd out of 958 Iowa communities (77th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 74.3%, which ranks 358th out of 905 Iowa communities (61st out of 138 small communities).

# Disability

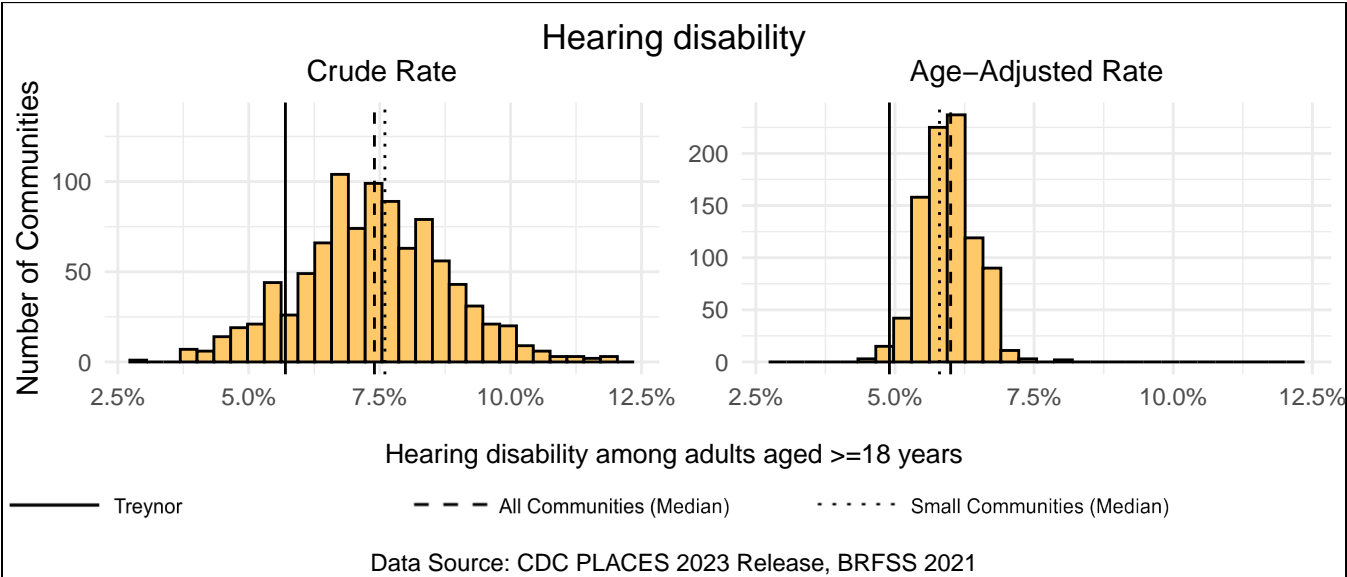

## Hearing disability

Treynor has a crude rate of 5.7% for hearing disability among adults aged  $\geq 18$  years, which ranks 113th out of 958 Iowa communities (18th out of 138 small communities). The age-adjusted rate for Treynor is 4.9%, which ranks 13th out of 905 Iowa communities (2nd out of 138 small communities).

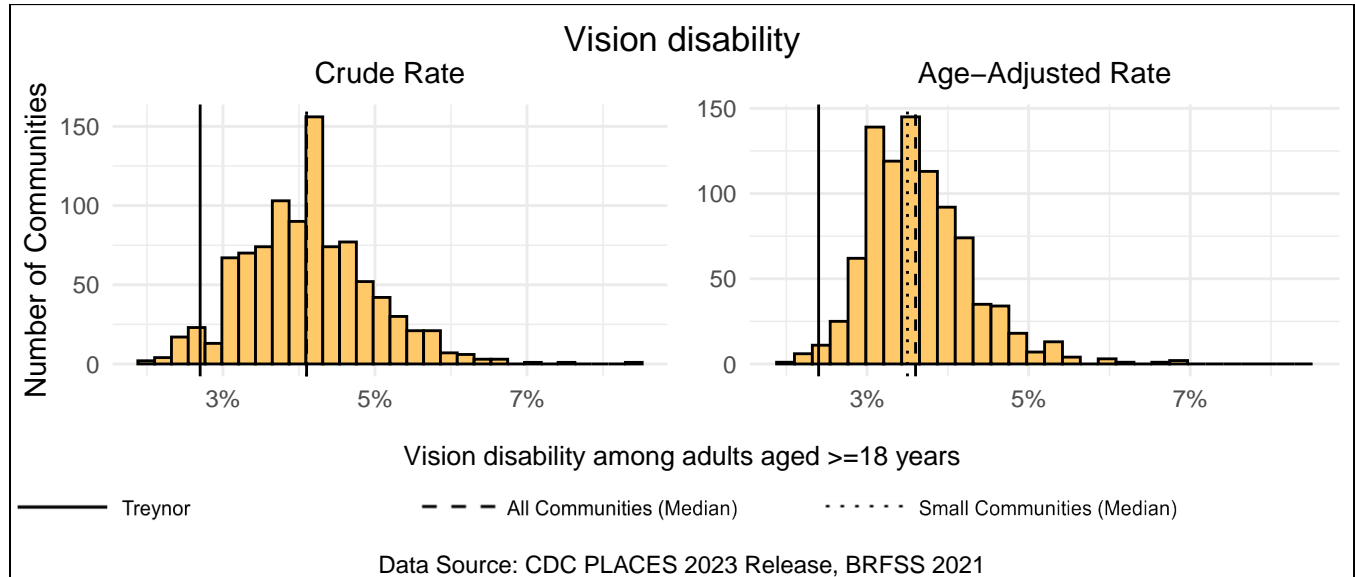

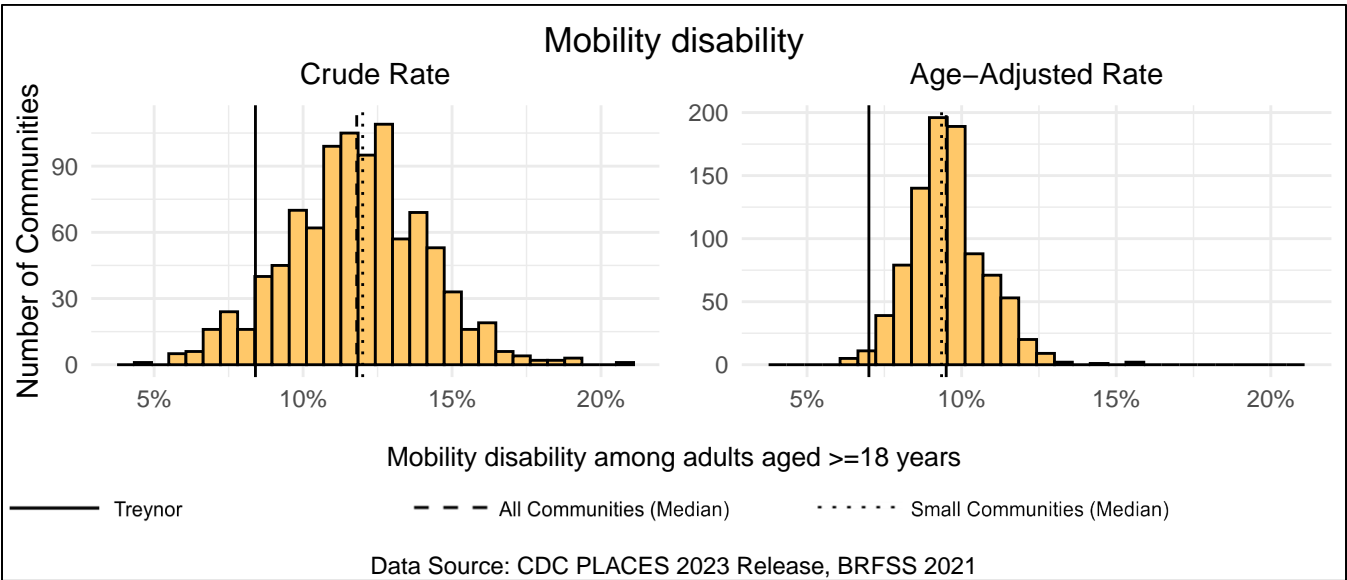

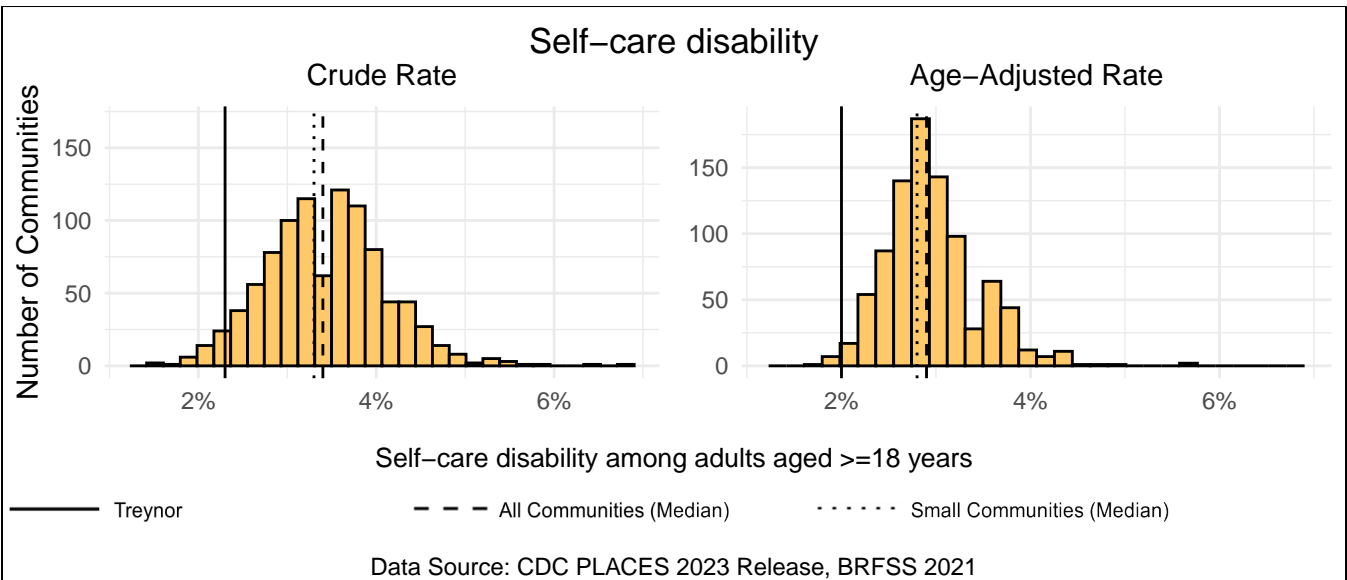

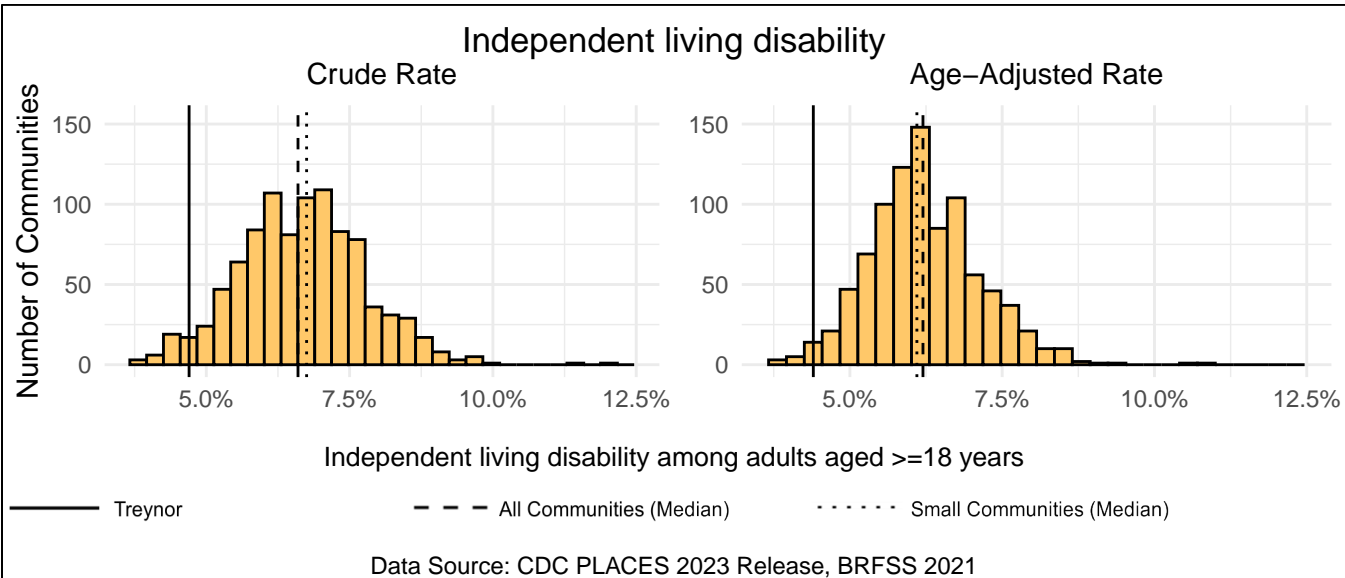

The PLACES dataset uses small area estimation methods to provide estimates of health measures for counties, places, census tracts, and zip code tabulation areas. The estimates are created with a multilevel statistical modeling framework that utilizes CDC's Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), Census population counts, and American Community Survey demographic and socioeconomic data.
